Match Preview

Cavan and Donegal have shared the last three Ulster Under 21 Football titles and tonight that sequence will be extended to a fourth year. Donegal defeated Cavan in the 2010 decider while Cavan claimed the provincial title in both 2011 and 2012 defeating Tyrone in both finals. Tonight, they aim to make that a remarkable trio of consecutive crowns.

In late March, Cavan defeated their old rivals, Monaghan in a pulsating quarter final where their panel strength was clearly illustrated. Connor Madden, Joe Dillon and Alan Graham all came off the bench to make a telling impact in a game that required extra time.

In the other side of the draw, Donegal were tearing the form book apart as they comprehensively defeated Tyrone in Healy Park. Tyrone were the All-Ireland Minor champions in 2010 but much has changed since then. Donegal showed a high level of composure and allied to the well renowned scoring threat of Patrick McBrearty they emerged to the semi final stage with relative ease.

In the semi finals, Cavan had a comfortable victory over Down at the Athletic Grounds. Another five points from the ever reliable Enda O'Reilly proved vital while fellow inside forwards Paul O'Connor and Jack Brady caused problems. They are defensively



very strong with Fergal Flanagan, Killian Clarke and Darragh Sexton playing important roles. In the other semi final, Derry and Donegal played out a cracking encounter in Healy Park. Donegal looked to be cruising to victory until a late Derry surge left them hanging on at the final whistle. They are captained by corner back Kevin McFadden and can also look to senior players Martin O'Reilly, Ryan McHugh and Patrick McBrearty for leadership.

Tonight will provide us with another glimpse to the future as Cavan hope to continue their underage resurgence while Donegal will look for a second title in four years. Peter Reilly and Maxi Curran have their teams well prepared and it is poised for another great encounter.




