

TOMÁS Ó CUINNEAGÁIN (Gaillimh), the referee for today's Senior Football semi-final, is widely experienced at all levels of the Association's activities as a player, referee and administrator.

As a player, he numbers three Gaillimh Senior Football medals and three Connacht Junior medals – 1961, '66 and '69 – among his collection. As a referee, he has handled two All-Ireland Junior Finals (1966 and 1967), All-Ireland Minor and Under-21 semi-finals, last year's Railway Cup final and this year's Connacht Final.

As an administrator, Tom was chairman of the North Galway Board from 1969 to '73, was Gaillimh chairman from 1976 to '78 and is currently vice-chairman of Coiste Chontae na Gaillimhe and Comhairle Chonnachta.

With his club, Mountbellew, he is very



involved with the training and coaching of under-age teams.

"WEESHIE" Ó FOGARTAIGH (Ciarraí), who is in charge of today's Cluiche Leath-Cheannais Sinsir, has been refereeing for the past eight years.

He has handled N.F.L. games all over the county and has refereed five Cluichí Ceannais Sinsir Chiarraí and has been in charge of finals in all other grades. Last year he refereed the All-Ireland Under-21 final between Corcaigh and Áth Cliath and the All-Ireland Club Final between St. Finbarrs (Corcaigh) and St. Grellans (Gaillimh).



ON SEPTEMBER 12, 1960, An Dún and Uibh Fháilí met in the replay of the All-Ireland semi-final; on August 22 they had drawn on the scoreline of An Dún 1-10 Uibh Fháilí 2-10.

The Leinster champions, who had made all the early running in the drawn game, hit in the eighth minute when Charlie Wrenn's lofted sideline kick from under the Hogan Stand went direct to the An Dún net to put the Midlanders 1-3 to 0-2 in front. The next 19 minutes of the half were scoreless as the Ulster side missed several scoring

Uibh Fháilí added another early point in the second half and before the 10th minute two points from James McCartan and one by Tony Hadden had cut the deficit to two points. Down came the rain and An Dún's first time methods began to be effective. After 13 minutes Sean O'Neill and Patsy O'Hagan combined to lob the ball into the goalmouth where Brian Morgan punched it to the net and the Ulster champions were on the road to victory.



As Uibh Fháilí dallied and dithered and made switches that didn't work, An Dún's moving of the subdued Joe Lennon away from Sean Foran proved a master stroke. In a hard game, played vigorously and fairly An Dún ran out deserving winners to qualify for their first All-Ireland Final - a meeting with Ciarraí.






