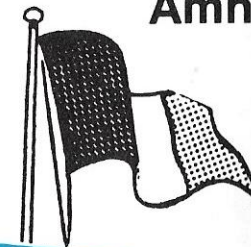

SEÁN DENTÚN (Loch Garman), who is in charge of the Minor Semi-final, refereed his first Leinster Senior Final last year. He plays hurling and football with the Faythe Harriers Club in Wexford town and is Secretary of the Wexford Referees Committee. He refereed the Leinster Minor final and the All-Ireland Under-21 semi-final four years ago. Three years ago he took charge of the Leinster S.H. semi-final as well as the All-Ireland Under-21 final between Tipperary and Kilkenny. He also refereed a Railway Cup hurling final and the Senior 'B' final between Kildare and London.

In 1981 John refereed the N.H.L. final between Cork and Offaly and the All-Ireland Minor semi-final last year. John has refereed the Club hurling Championship semi-final (Mount Sion v Cushendal) and he has refereed a number of National League games in hurling and football as well as Leinster Championship games in hurling and football.

He plays Badminton with St. Joseph's Club in Wexford and is in partnership with Wexford All-Star, Ned Buggy in a sports shop in Wexford. Married, he has three children.



NOLLAIG Ó DONNCHÚ (Áth Cliath), who refereed his second All-Ireland Senior Hurling Final last year, was man-in-the-middle in the 1980 decider in which Gaillimh defeated Luimneach. He also refereed the 1981 semi-final and replay between the same counties and last year officiated in New York and San Francisco with the All-Star Tour and in London where he was in charge of the All-Ireland 'B'S.H. Final.

GER CUNNINGHAM (St. Finbarr's): Age 22. Was goalkeeper on the 1978 All-Ireland winning minor team. Holds N.H.L. medal and is in his third year on the Senior team. Insurance Official.

BRIAN MURPHY (Nemo Rangers): Age 31. The only player to win All-Ireland medals, in hurling and football, at Minor, Under-21 and Senior levels. Honoured on four occasions as an Allstar, twice in hurling and twice in football. Garda.

DONAL O'GRADY (St. Finbarrs): Age 24. Member of St. Finbarrs 3-in-a-row county championship side. This is his first Munster Championship medal at senior level, also plays club football with St. Finbarrs. Secondary teacher at North Monastery, Cork.

DERMOT McCURTAIN (Blackrock): Age 26. Won All-Ireland Minor hurling and football medals as well as Under-21 and Senior hurling medals. Also holds Munster Colleges hurling and football medals. Allstar Award winner. Insurance Official.

PAT HORGAN (Glen Rovers): Age 25. Won All-Ireland Minor and Under-21 medals and was a sub on the 1978 All-Ireland winning Senior team. Also holds N.H.L. medal. Office Worker.

JOHN CROWLEY (Bishopstown): Age 27. Holds All-Ireland medals at Minor (hurling and football), Under-21 and Senior levels. Has played for county Senior football team. Clerk.

TOM CASHMAN (Blackrock): Age 26. Dual All-Ireland Minor medalist, he also holds All-Ireland Under-21, Club and Senior medals. Holds two Allstar award and N.H.L. honours. Graduate of Féile na nGael. Company Representative.

TIM CROWLEY (Newcestown): Age 31. Holds All-Ireland Colleges. Minor. Under-21 and Senior medals as well as N.H.L. medal. Plays with a junior Club. Forestry Official.

JOHN FENTON (Midleton): Age 27. Played inter-county hurling at all grades for Cork. His club has qualified for the county semi-final five times in-a-row to 1983.

BERTIE ÓG MURPHY (Sarsfields): Age 30. Brother of Tadhg who plays on the county football side. Teacher.

KEVIN HENNESSY (Midleton): Age 22. Member of All-Ireland under-21 side of last year. Played with the county in all grades at under age level. Mechanic.

JOHN BUCKLEY (Glen Rovers): Age 26. Another dual star – plays football with St. Nicholas Club. Has represented Corcaigh at Under-21 level. Another who won second Munster medal this year. Commercial Traveller.

TOMÁS MULCAHY (Glen Rovers): Age 20. Played minor and is a current under-21 player. Won Harty medal (Munster Colleges Hurling) with North Monastery. Trainee Accountant.

JIMMY BARRY MURPHY (St. Finbarr's): Age 29. Captain of the side, he holds All-Ireland medals at Club, Minor hurling and football, Under-21 and Senior levels and won an All-Ireland Senior football medal in 1973. One of the great dual players of modern times. Finance Company Official.

EAMONN O'DONOGHUE (Blackrock): Age 32. A regular member of the panel for several years who might qualify as 'super-sub'. Holds All-Ireland Club and Senior medals. Salesman.

Tommy Coen (Mullagh): Age 20. A product of the county minor and Under-21 sides, he won three All-Ireland Vocational Schools medals and also holds a county Intermediate medal. Student at Thomond College.

Niall McInerney (Liam Mellows): Age 33. Allstar in 1975 and 1980. Native of Sixmilebridge, Co. Clare, he learned his hurling in Ennis C.B.S. and played Intermediate and senior with the Banner County. A graduate of U.C.G. with whom he won a Fitzgibbon Cup medal in 1970. Holds Railway Cup and All-Ireland medals. Vocational Teacher.

Conor Hayes (Kiltormer): Age 25. Won an All-Ireland Under-21 medal in 1978 and Railway Cup medal in 1980. Missed quarter-final and semi-final and returned from Copenhagen for the final training sessions for the 1980 All-Ireland win. Won his second Railway Cup medal this year. Engineer.

Seamus Coen (Mullagh): Age 25. Deputised for Iggy Clarke in the 1980 All-Ireland win. Holds All-Ireland Under-21, Senior and Railway Cup medals. Fitter and Welder.

Sylvie Linnane (Gort): Age 26. Won Oireachtas medal in '76. Railway Cup and All-Ireland in 1980. Has won county championship medals at Under-14, Under-15 and Under-16 level. Captained Connacht team to win Railway Cup this year. Farmer.

Steve Mahon (Kibecanty): Age 25. Another member of the All-Ireland Under-21 winning team from 1978. He won Railway Cup and All-Ireland medals in 1980. An Allstar last year, he won his second Railway Cup medal in March. Bricklayer.

Sean Silke (Meelick/EyreCourt): Age 32. Allstar in 1975 and 1980. Won Fitzgibbon Cup medals with Maynooth in '73 and '74. Was Hurling Officer in Connacht for two years. Holds Railway Cup and All-Ireland medals. Personnel Officer.

Michael Connolly (Castlegar): Age 30. A brother of John and Joe, he graduated through the minor and Under-21 ranks. Has won county Under-21 and senior medals with his club. Also holds All-Ireland Club, Railway Cup and All-Ireland medals. Carpenter.

Iggy Clarke (Loughrea): Age 30. Four times an Allstar. Captained the team that won the Under-21 in 1972. Won Fitzgibbon Cup medals in '73 and '74 with Maynooth. Missed the All-Ireland win due to an injury in the semi-final. Holds Railway Cup medals. Priest.

Aidan Staunton (Kiltormer): Age 21. Won a county senior medal with his club last year and has represented the county at Under-21 level. Student Nurse.

Frank Burke (Turloughmore): Age 31. Allstar in 1976 and '79. Yet another member of the '72 winning Under-21 team. One of the stars of the side that won the league in '75. Teacher.

P. J. Molloy (Athenry): Age 31. An Allstar in 1978. Graduated from the minor and Under-21 sides; was on the '72 winning Under-21 team. Like Connolly, McInerney, McDonogh, the Clarkes, John Connolly and Burke, he won an N.H.L. medal in '75. Won Railway Cup and All-Ireland medals in '80 and a second Railway Cup medal this year. Company Officer.

Bernie Forde (Ardrahan): Age 26. Holds All-Ireland Under-21, Senior and Railway Cup medals as well as Connacht Colleges medals in both hurling and football. Has won county championship medals at Under-21 and Intermediate levels. Allstar in 1980. Civil Servant.

Joe Connolly (Castlegar): Age 27. The youngest of the three brothers, he made his senior debut against Dublin in 1977. Played in three Connacht finals with St. Mary's College and lost all three. Captained Connacht to win 1980 Railway Cup and Castlegar to All-Ireland Club Honours, and Gaillimh to their second All-Ireland success. Allstar in 1980. Company Director.

Noel Lane (Ballindereen). Age 27. Made his championship debut in the 1978 All-Ireland semi-final against Cill Chainnigh. Holds Railway Cup and All-Ireland medals. Forestry Official.

An bhfuil fhios agat?

CORCAIGH won their 40th Munster title when they beat Port Láirge last month. They won their first in 1890, followed by a hat-trick of wins in 1892-'94. Then they won five in a row from 1901 to '05 and won again in 1907. Further titles were achieved in 1912, 1915, 1919 and 1920 before winning four-in-row from 1926 to 1929. Two titles were won in the thirties – 1931 and 1939 before another hat-trick in 1942-'44. Further titles were achieved in 1946 and 1947 followed by another hat-trick in 1952-'54 and another win in 1956. The 'Sixties saw them winning in 1966

and 1969 while the 'Seventies was their most successful decade with wins in 1970, '72, '75, '76, '77, and '78. They have won the last two Munster Championships.



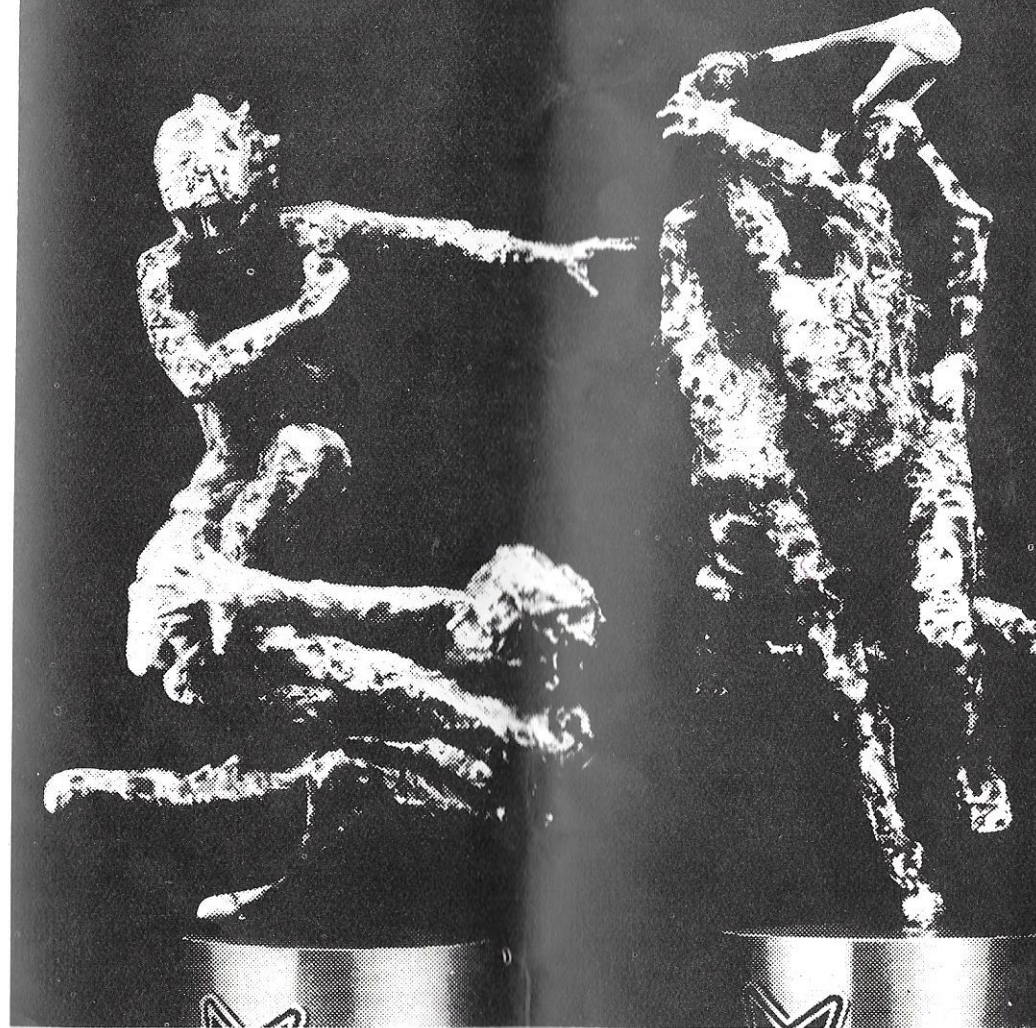
GAILLIMH have played in 44 All-Ireland semi-finals and have qualified for nine All-Ireland finals. They beat Cill Chainnigh in four years – 1923, 1925, 1929 and 1953; Corcaigh in 1975 and 1979; Tiobraid Árann in 1924, Uíbh Fháilí in 1980 and Luimneach in 1981. Their complete record of All-Ireland semi-final wins is:

- 1923: beat Cill Chainnigh by 5-4 to 2-0.
- 1924: beat Tiobraid Árann by 3-1 to 2-3.
- 1925: beat Cill Chainnigh by 9-4 to 6-0.
- 1929: beat Cill Chainnigh by 7-7 to 7-1.
- 1953: beat Cill Chainnigh by 3-5 to 1-10.
- 1975: beat Corcaigh by 4-15 to 1-13.
- 1979: beat Corcaigh by 2-14 to 1-13.
- 1980: beat Uíbh Fháilí by 4-9 to 3-10.
- 1981: beat Luimneach by 4-16 to 2-17 after 1-8 to 0-11 draw.

An Chfeil fhis agat?

THE highest scoring All-Ireland hurling semi-final ever was played in 1954, when Loch Garman routed Aontroim by 12-17 to 2-3, with the late Nicky Rackard scoring an all-time record of 7-7.

GAILLIMH have the distinction of winning the first hurling championship match ever played – the opening game in the initial series of 1887, which, of course, was played on the 'open draw' system. Gaillimh beat Loch Garman by 2-7 to 0-1 at Elm Park, Dublin, on July 24.

GAILLIMH went on to reach that first ever All-Ireland hurling final before losing to Tiobraid Árann, and the Connachtmen were captained by the non-playing Pat Madden – the first of only two such instances. The second was just two years later when An Clár, beaten in the decider by Átha Cliath, were skippered by John Considine.

PRIOR to today, Gaillimh have played three All-Ireland hurling semi-finals on August 7th – and have lost every time! In 1938 they lost to Port Láirge by 3-1 to 4-8 at Ennis, in 1949 they went down to Laois at Croke Park by 3-5 to 4-6, and in 1977 they lost out to Corcaigh by 1-15 to 3-14, again at Croke Park.



CORCAIGH and Gaillimh have met in the All-Ireland semi-final on 15 occasions and the Munster Champions have won 13 of their meetings, in 1901, 1902, 1903, 1905, 1906, 1914, 1927, 1942, 1944, 1946, 1952, 1954 and 1977; Gaillimh won in 1975 and 1979.

GAILLIMH have twice been involved in draws at the All-Ireland semi-final stage – in 1976 when they drew with Loch Garman and lost the replay and 1981 when they beat Luimneach in a replay.



BOTH Corcaigh and Gaillimh recorded identical totals of 3-22 in their last matches prior to today – the former against Port Láirge in the Munster Final at Limerick, and the latter in the All-Ireland quarter-final against Aontroim at Mullingar.

GAILLIMH were involved in the last All-Ireland hurling semi-final to finish goalless – as long ago as 1937, when they lost to Cill Chainnigh by 0-6 to 0-8.
