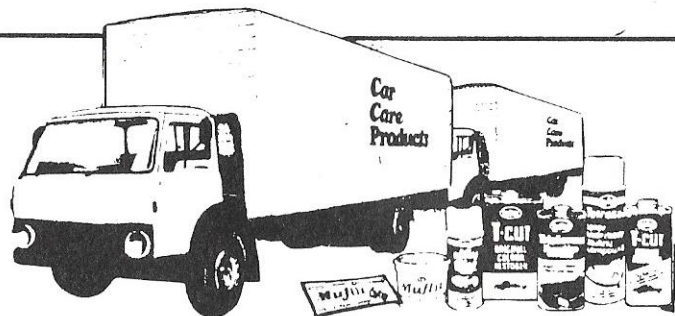

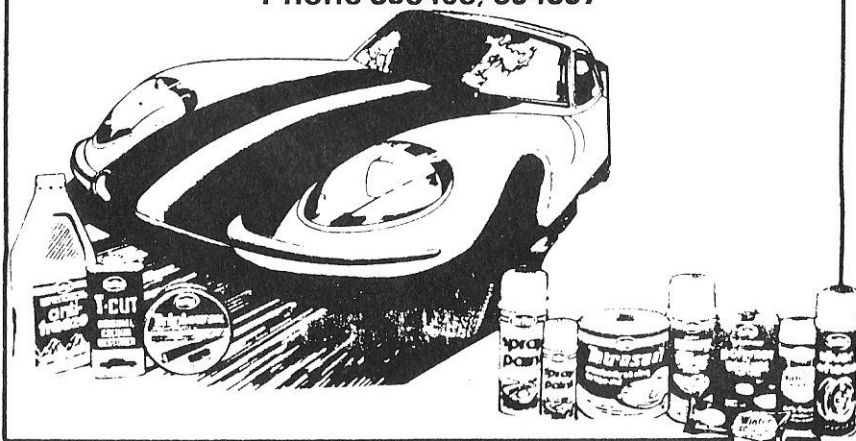

THE UNSUNG HEROES OF KERRY FOOTBALL

Mickey O'Sullivan was captain of the Kerry All-Ireland winning team in 1975 and has been a Kerry selector and assistant coach for several years. A P. E. teacher by profession, Mickey is the current Chairman of the Munster Coaching Council and is the author of the well-known publication, "Gaelic Football Skills".

This article was in the December 1985 edition of *The Green and Gold - Kerry GAA News* published by Bord na nÓg an Chontae.

"Give the under-12s to so and so, give the under 14s to so and so, he does a good job every year". How often do we hear this statement at the club AGM year in year out? It is the same few fellows each year that look after the under-age teams, the same few who give of their free time to the coaching and preparation of their team and, in some cases, receiving little appreciation.

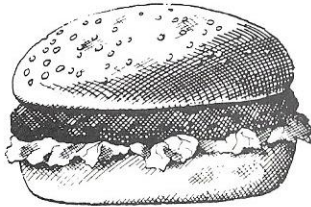
These trainers perform one of the most vital roles in the GAA as they are teaching the basic skills of the game to all these youngsters who will be the seniors of the future. After all, we cannot have an Association without players (a fact that goes unnoticed in certain circles).

The trainer also performs a very worthwhile function for his community, something that is very much appreciated by all those parents of young players. Those in charge of our youngsters are the unsung heroes of Kerry football.

Our Clubs need to encourage more people in the locality to get involved with youngsters. Many former players would love to be approached. Many parents would like to be involved while their children are playing; they must be approached by the club officials. It is a case of "the harvest is great, but the labourers are few". People in charge of teams need never have played football themselves.

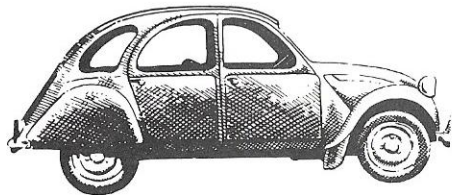
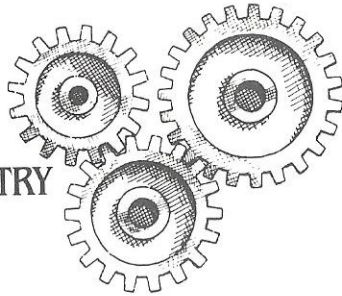
Since the beginning of the Association, National Teachers in every area have contributed so much to the teaching of football in our schools and after school. However, in recent years there has been a drastic fall off in the amount of young men going into national teaching which, in turn, is reflected by the drop in the amount of Gaelic football being played in our National Schools.

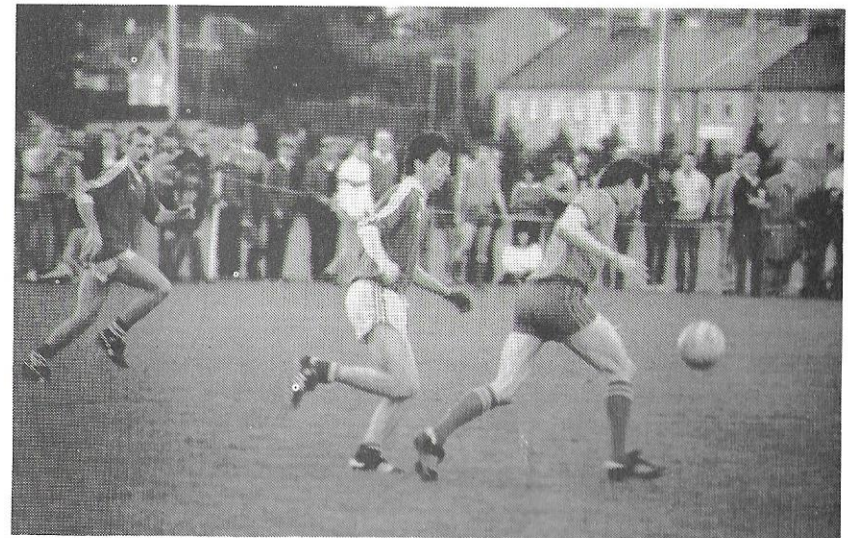
SEE HOW WELL IT CAN WORK FOR YOU.

Many of our female teachers would love to take young football teams but lack the confidence and knowledge to do so. There is no reason why they cannot do so. In Kerry, they would be very welcome and it is heartening to see some of those girls getting involved already. The County Coaching Committee intends to run a Coaching Course (or Teachers' Course) for Primary School teachers next July and guarantees that it will give all those Primary Teachers interested in taking football in schools the knowledge and the confidence they require. So why not mention this to your local teachers and have them apply for places on the course?

Finally, I would like to see a reduction in the amount of competitions from Under 16s downwards. I think at the moment many of the Under 14s, 12s and younger are playing far too much football. By the time they are 18 years of age they are "burned out" and tired of football.

Instead, more time should be spent on practising the skills of the game and challenge matches could be arranged where the competitive element imposed on them would be played down. They would enjoy it far more and would continue on to senior ranks.

So to conclude, I would like to see (a) more people being encouraged to get involved with youngsters at local level; (b) the game being put on a firmer footing in the local National Schools by encouraging your local National Teachers to attend the course next July and implementing what they learn afterwards and (c) less competition from Under-16s downwards with an emphasis on skills training.

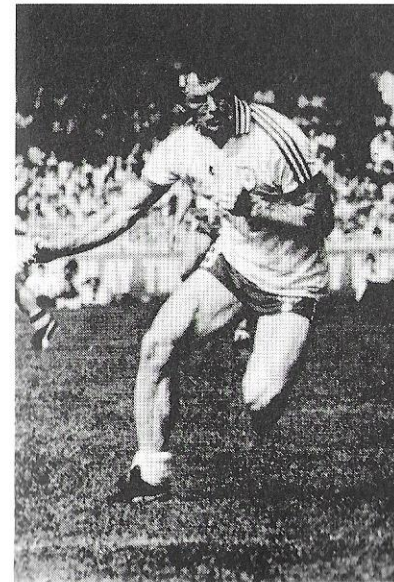
McKENNA LEADS TYRONE ON THEIR GREATEST DAY

Long cherished dreams of countless Tyrone followers of Gaelic Games down through the years will finally be realised this month when Eugene McKenna leads the class of '86 on to the Croke Park pitch for the All-Ireland senior football final.

It will be the proudest day yet in the history of a county that has given great service and wonderful loyalty to the G.A.A. Some of the personalities who helped to pave the way for the All-Ireland senior football final debut — as well as some of past days of glory — are recalled in this special *Gaelic World* feature.

A captain apart . . . that is Eugene McKenna, whom many regard, and not without justification, as the most exciting personality from Ulster in senior football today. He is a player of vision, skilled in his play, sure in his feeling, tireless in his efforts, and a man who leads by example.



McKenna is not merely a team leader apart because he skippered Tyrone to their first All-Ireland senior final. Remember Centenary Year?

That was a great year for the G.A.A., and also a year apart for Eugene McKenna, of Augher. He was Ulster's captain in the Railway Cup final win over Connacht at Ennis on the day the 100 years Birthday celebrations began, and led Tyrone to the Dr. McKenna Cup, an all-Ulster knock-out competition, and the provincial championship.

His hopes of further glory were ended by Dublin next time out, but that defeat still cannot take from the merit of McKenna's achievements in Centenary Year.

There was a golden finish to the season as well for the Tyrone man when he won the first of what will this season surely prove two Bank of Ireland All-Stars awards when he was chosen at midfield.

McKenna has also made history on the double as a Tyrone team leader. When he stepped up to receive the Anglo Celt Cup after the triumph over fancied Down at Clones in July he became the first man to captain his county to Ulster senior title wins in two campaigns.

The Augher club man, who is now 30, has more than fulfilled the expectations raised in a brilliant career as a schoolboy. He was centre half forward in a team captained by his brother, Dessie, that beat Kildare in the All-Ireland minor final of 1973.

Promotion came quickly for the young man from Augher, who played with C.B.S. Omagh in schools game. He was in his teens when he first pulled on the Tyrone shirt as a senior, and has enjoyed great success in the meantime. He is one of six brothers who have all made their impact in club and county football. The McKenna brothers father Willie was a Tyrone star in the 1940s.

McKenna has played in two Railway Cup final winning teams. A Civil Engineer by profession, the Tyrone skipper, who is the oldest member of the team, has had to overcome more than most to get where he is this month.

He has been suffering from arthritis of the hip, but this has still not prevented him from turning in play of the highest since the condition developed some two years ago.

A remarkable man in many ways is the footballer whom all Tyrone believes will climb the steps to collect the Sam Maguire Cup on behalf of the county at the end of the historic All-Ireland final.

AUSTRALIAN CONNECTION

McKenna is one of five Tyrone footballers on the panel for the Irish team for the up-coming tour of Australia. Kevin McCabe is another.

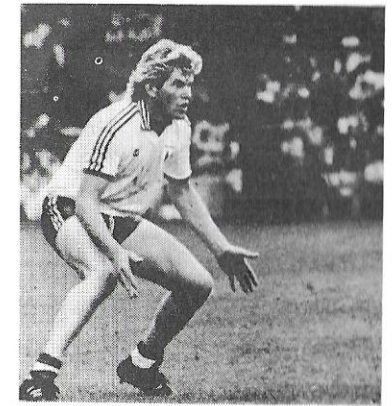
The others in the run for places are Plunkett Donaghy, John Lynch and Damien O'Hagan.

Donaghy at 24 has emerged as one of the top midfielders in the game. It was his long range goal late in the first half that turned the Ulster final Tyrone's way against Down at Clones in July. He won his second provincial senior medal that day.

Donaghy, who stands 6 ft., started out in the senior inter-county grade in 1983 in a National Football League game against Roscommon. He holds one

Dr. McKenna Cup medal and has won junior and intermediate medals in the county.

John Lynch is also 24, but is something of a seasoned veteran as far as senior inter-county football is concerned, having been first called up to the



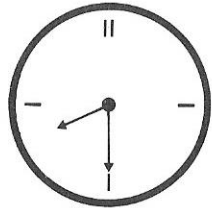
Plunkett Donaghy . . . midfielder ace.

side in 1980. He collected his second provincial senior medal this year, and has two McKenna Cup trophies.

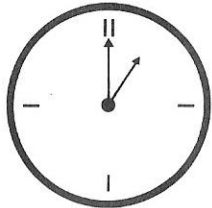

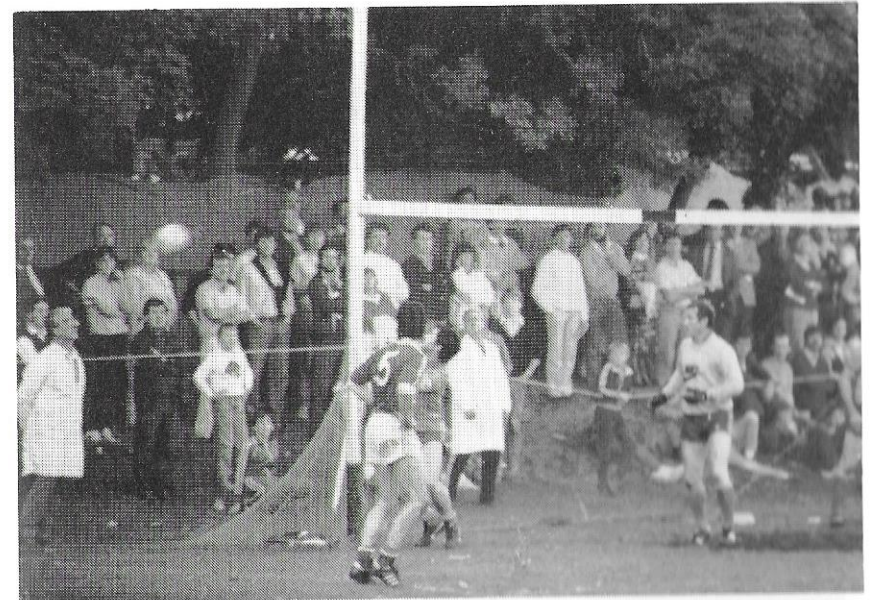
