Paddy McDevitt — Life President of the Killybegs G.A.A. Club — died during the month of July, 1982. A sad and fitting farewell was paid to his memory by club members at his funeral.

Born in Drimarone, he emigrated to America at an early age where he held a regular place on the Donegal New York team for many years.

Altogether he spent approximately 30 eventful years there during which he married Anne, his wife, who hailed from Killybegs, the place to which he returned to settle and set up business in the Pier Bar.

Many a good argument and laugh was heard from the back kitchen of these premises during the many club and park committee meetings held there, but moreso from the solo and 25 card games which he loved. He was the driving force behind the small hard-working committee which undertook the task of negotiating, purchasing and developing Fintra G.A.A. pitch, and transforming the sand dunes into the fine all-weather drive-in pitch it is to-day.


Despite the serious illness whice eventually claimed his valiant spiritommy. White remained active the last in the sport he loved so we and attended matches up to a few weeks before his death.

## **HOW IT STARTED**

The recent history of Killybegs G.A.A. Club dates from a meeting — again held in Fintra National School — in 1962. From that time the efforts of the Club were geared towards acquiring a ground to serve as a home base for the club and a permanent centre for the athletic and social activities of the members.

Shortly afterwards, the site at Fintra was acquired and, after five years hard work, was officially opened and blessed on June 11, 1967. The occasion was marked by a Donegal v Mayo senior county game.

#### YOUTH

Since then, the emphasis has been mainly on youth. With a Grade A pitch available and, more recently, the opening of a second training pitch/car park at Fintra, a flood of under-age leagues has erupted, providing valuable experience for the youngsters and a remarkable reservoir of experienced young players for the Club.

The appreciation of the Club, the parents and the players goes out to the dedicated team trainers, managers and referees who have coaxed and encouraged the young hopefuls through the competitions and imbued in them at such a young age, a true love of their national games.


One problem which is a continuing thorn in the side of the Killybegs Club — and which no amount of enthusiasm or dedication can overcome — is the demand made by the fishing industry on young adult players who frequently are faced with the unenviable choice on a Sunday of representing their Club or going to sea with their colleagues of the deep.

## KILLYBEGS AT THE CROSSROADS

For the past nine years Killybegs have been the most successful club in the county by winning 17 under-age titles, 2 County Shield titles, 2 Ulster Club Minor titles, and 1 Intermediate County title. This run of successes is remarkable for the fact that since the under-12 victory in 1979 the club has contested 16 underage county final and has been successful in every final. Surely a national record! All good things must come to an end, and to the Sean MacCumhaill club came the honour of lowering our colours in a county final for the first time in over ten years when they defeated us in this year's replayed juvenile final. Ironically we again fell in a county final for the second time this year when a better prepared Naomh Columba outfit beat a depleted Killybegs under-21 team in the county final. (Manus Boyle, John Cunningham, Barry Cunningham and Willie McCallig were missing for various reasons in the final).

Our under-age record for the past nine years: County winners: Under-12: 1979, 1983, 1986; Under-13: 1984, 1986, 1987; Under-14: 1981, 1985, 1987; Under-15 (Og Sport): 1982, 1986; Juvenile: 1983; Minor Championship: 1984, 1985; Minor League: 1983, 1984, 1985; Under-21: 1986; Ulster Minor Championship (Club): 1984, 1985.

With this great run of under-age success supporters would be correct in assuming that we should be making the inevitable breakthrough at senior level. But football fortunes do not exactly run that way. To achieve success at the highest level commitment, maturity, hard work, pride (in oneself and one's club), loyalty, discipline, teamwork, humility, honesty, integrity, fair play coupled with football skill should be some of the ingredients that a manager might look for in order to be successful.

That Killybegs failed so miserably in 1987 must be cause for concern for loyal supporters. The promise of 1985 when defeated by Four Masters in the county quarter-final in what was the club game of that particular year followed by great performances in 1986 when again we took part in the game of the year against Naomh Columba only to fail in the county semi-final against a Marty Carlin inspired Red Hugh's by the narrowest of margins left us relishing the coming of 1987. Struggling to overcome Naomh Ultan in the preliminary we reached an all-time low when succumbing to a mediocre St. Eunan's team in the first round proper and in fact being defeated by three goals in O'Donnell Park. This Letterkenny debacle left followers in the county puzzled especially since it came within a fortnight of the county under-21 success in Roscommon.

The question immediately were being asked both in Killybegs and in the county at large was Killybegs just another underage club with their players lacking the necessary "gut" to make the transformation to a good senior team?





arts in the area.



Killybegs made football history on New Year's Day, 1985, when they became the first Donegal Club team to win the Ulster Club Minor Football Championship for the Jimmy McConville Cup at Shaw's Road grounds in Belfast.

Their seven points winning margin reflected their superiority in a very exciting game. Two coach loads of supporters travelled with them to cheer them on. The victors' return was marked by bonfires and band parades in Killybegs.

The winners started off in glorious style when within a matter of minutes Martin Murchan lashed the ball into the net to score a great goal. However, their lead was shortlived and St. Paul's came back to score a goal and a point to put his side in front.

However, the Killybegs lads were on level terms when Willie McCallig had another point and from that there was

nothing in it to half time with St. Paul's leading 2-4 to 2-3.

Right from the resumption Killybegs took over and were level within a minute.

Midway through the half they struck a purple patch, scoring 1-3 within four minutes with some of the points coming from very acute angles.

Killybegs had a tower of strength at centre half back in John Cunningham with two brilliant wingers in Francis Murray and John Gallagher while Denis Carberry was a very steady full back.

Barry McGowan and Barry Cunningham were good midfielders and Conor White, Arthur Meehan, Manus Boyle, Martin Murchan, along with Willie McCallig were outstanding forwards.
