Promotion prospects at stake

DOWN the years, Cavan and Donegal have met in many vital matches in league and championship, and in recent years a great rivalry has built up between the counties. Today's match will continue this trend, with vital league points at stake for both teams. Donegal come to the Breffni Park venue as Division Two table-toppers, and a win today would almost guarantee a promotion place, and entry into the money-spinning quarter-finals of the competition. Cavan gave their supporters something to cheer about last Sunday in their defeat of Laois, and they will be hoping to see a repeat performance today. In an unchanged team, a lot will depend on midfield, where Jim Reilly and Stephen King could well hold the key on how this match develops.

Up front, players of the calibre of John Brady, Fintan Cahill, Michael Faulkner and Ray Cullivan are capable of unhinging the best of defences, but as already stated, a lot will depend on the supply from midfield.

This is the biggest test for both counties to date, and the game itself should be played in a championship atmosphere. A lot of questions will be answered as to the true potential of the sides in taking major honours this season,

Donegal will travel in a confident mood, despite playing away from home, and while they are worthy of respect, this Cavan side if they play to their full potential are capable of taking the spoils and putting themselves into the running for Division One football next season . . .
