

### DR. MICK LOFTUS

(former President of the G.A.A.) recalls his years in office

I now can sit back, put the feet up and recall many memories from three memorable years. Years of non-stop action and involvement and it was my privilege and distinction to be in there, central to all the planning and implementation of those plans, for the further development of our great Association. The involvement at central level also meant involvement in one's club and county was almost nil. When elected I said to myself: 'I will give



it everything for three years' and how satisfied I now am that I did that. It was said to me prior to my election that it would be almost impossible for a person living in the West of Ireland to serve fully the Presidency. This, I am glad, I proved wrong.

My home in Crossmolina is some 160 miles from Dublin and is badly located for travel in general in Ireland. It meant extra driving but this is something you accept as normal when you live there. I had occasion to visit up to five hundred clubs throughout the thirty-two counties. My visits were generally to attend annual dinners, open community centres and pitches, launch histories, confined draws, etc. I always enjoyed those visits because it was there you met the real G.A.A., and it gave them due recognition. The total commitment of so many to promote the Association within one locality was truly remarkable. This is the real strength of C.L.G.

As I look back on my Presidency, I feel reasonably satisfied with the progress of

the Association. There were also the disappointments, notably: The acceptance of sponsorship from alcohol firms.'

### Fact files . . . fact files

- Brian Kilkelly who makes his return to the Mayo county team after a three year absence is a garda based in Belmullet. The Castlebar Mitchels man emerged as the top scorer in the Mayo senior championship this year totalling 4-18.
- Cork's left full forward Michael McCarthy has very strong Mayo connections as did the man from Meath he faced in the All-Ireland final. As many already know Robbie O'Malley's father is from Castlebar while McCarthy's mother comes from Belmullet. We extend Mick a special welcome. Another Corkman Sean Cleary, has Ballindine connections. His uncle Henry is a prominent offical in the Claremorris club.
- And speaking of Belmullet, Willie Joe Padden takes on a new job for Mayo today lining out at full forward. Willie Joe is obviously an extremely versatile player having played in goal for his club, centre half back for his county as well as midfield of course.
- Cork hit the headlines in more ways than one last year when they played Mayo at Charlestown. They flew to Knock Airport. However, they were brought down to earth with a bang by Mayo when Joe Lindsay hit a brace of goals to help Mayo to victory.
- The fact that Cork county foot-

- ball final is on today rules out a number of talented players such as Stephen O'Brien, Tony Nation, Shay Fahy and Denis Allen.
- Mayo and Cork met in the All-Ireland semi-finals of 1916 which was played in Athlone. Mayo won by a point but following an objection by Cork to Bernard Durkan, who had played in the Cork championship, the game was replayed. Mayo won again and went on to the All—Ireland final only to lose to Wexford.
- When Cork met Mayo in Claremorris in the National LEage in '82 it was a Munster victory by 0-10 to 0-7.
- Mayo captured their 10th and last National League title in 1970 when they defeated Down by 4-7 to 0-10.
- Since then they have contested three finals losing all three '71 Kerry 0-11 Mayo 0-8; '72 Kerry 2-10 Mayo 1-9 and 1978 when they lost to Dublin 2-18 to 2-13.
- Mayo still hold the record of six National League titles in a row: 1934 Mayo 2-3 Dublin 1-6, replay Mayo 2-4 Dublin 1-5. 1935—Mayo 5-8 Fermanagh 0-2. 1936 Mayo 5-2 Cavan 0-2. 1937 Mayo 5-4 Meath 1-8. 1938—Mayo 3-9 Wexford 1-3. 1939 Mayo 5-9 Meath 0-6. The other titles were: 1941 Mayo 3-7 Dublin 0-7. 1949 Mayo 1-0 Louth 1-6. 1954 Mayo 2-1 Carlow 0-3.

# The Late Frank Reynolds

Frank Reynolds was one of Castlebar Mitchels outstanding footballers and administrators.

His football career started with his native club Aughavas in Co. Leitrim. He was a regular on the Leitrim team in the early 60s starring at full back.

In 1963 he won a Garda All-Ireland medal on the team captaned by Mayoman Eddie Moriarity.

#### HIGH FIELDING

In 1964 Frank came to Castlebar and was quickly signed up by the Mitchels club, taking over the position of full back. His high fielding and his long raking clearances were a treat to watch. He had the distinction of having the longest kick-out in Connaught.

He won his first championship with Castlebar in 1969. In 1970 he helped to make it two in a row and went on to win the first Connaught Club championship for Castlebar by defeating Dunmore the Galway county champions.

In that game Frank partnered the late Ray Prendergast at midfield. It is sad to think they are no longer with us, but the memories



will live on.

In 1968 Frank was appointed treasurer of the club and gave many years service as a dedicated officer.

#### **GUARD OF HONOUR**

On a fine October evening all his past team mates gathered on the oustside of Castlebar to walk in silent procession by his side as his cortege passed through Castlebar.

A guard of honour was provided by members of the Garda Force, representatives of Castlebar Mitchels G.A.A., Westport G.A.A., the Mayo and Leitirm County Boards.

Burial took place on Saturday, October 15th in Aughavas following requiem Mass for the repose of his gentle soul.




