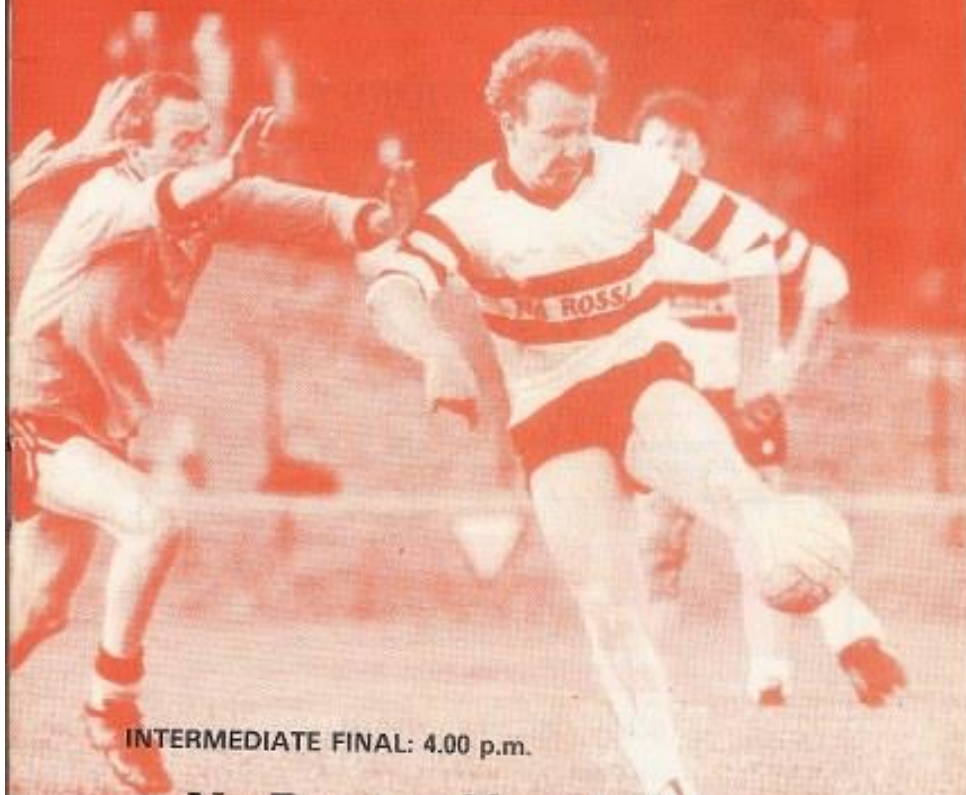

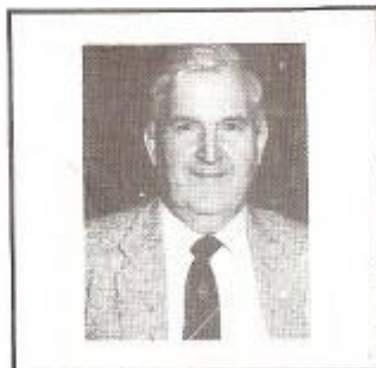

Underage football in Donegal

The Donegal Minor Board is responsible for all under-age competitions within the county up to and including minor football. This Board is also responsible for Co. Minor and U-16 teams.

While our internal competitions have been run in a most efficient manner and produced many excellent finals throughout the years, we certainly have had relatively little success at inter-county level. This is something that has given rise to much debate among those who have been closely involved over the years.

Donegal won the 1956 Ulster Minor Football Championship with a team that included Sean Ferriter, John Hannigan and Paul Kelly among others. We had to wait a further 29 years to win our next title in 1985, when John Cunningham led the team to victory over Cavan. In addition we have won the Ulster Minor Leagues of 1962, 1963, 1982, 1984 and 1985.

1988 proved to be another disappointing year for Donegal. Despite manager Sean Ward's dedicated and efficient management, Cavan were too good for us in the first round of the Ulster Championship. The Minor League also brought us little success, while our U-16s suffered a disappointing defeat by Mayo after promising wins over Leitrim and Sligo in the Connacht Championship.

Since 1960 Ulster minor football has been dominated by three counties, Tyrone, Down and Derry. During this period Tyrone has won one All-Ireland, while Down and Derry have won two each. An interesting fact is that during this period Derry and Down teams have dominated the Ulster Senior Colleges scene. St. Patrick's of Maghera have won 6 titles in the '80s and, of course, won this year's All-Ireland.

The arrival of the school bus and the absence of boarding schools have been a major factor in our lack of success. The winning of the All-Ireland Vocational titles

in 1984 and 1985 and the fine efforts of Falcarragh Community School in the All-Ireland 'B' Colleges competition of '85 were factors in Donegal's '85 Ulster minor final win.

Having witnessed most under-age county finals over the past few years the most keenly contested games have certainly been in the U-12 to U-16 age group. Many of our minor club games have been disappointing, to say the least. This year's final between two teams with many talented players was no exception, with some of the players of known exceptional ability being the least effective.

To my mind, some of our problems lie in the fact that many of our more talented players have too many demands made of them at an early age. Most of them are good at other sports, as well, while many of our games at U-12, 13 and 14 are far too competitive with a win-at-all-costs attitude very evident.

Donegal has always had an abundance of talent but, unfortunately, this has not been reflected with good results. Proper coaching in clubs and schools and a more patient approach in the development of our players is necessary. Let's hope that the present good work continues, with clubs, in particular, giving proper thought to the development of players in the long term, perhaps at the expense of short term glory.
