

Four weeks ago, five of today's thirty players were involved in Donegal's defeat by Meath in the All-Ireland semi-final, Killybegs had four representatives and Naomh Columba had just one. This however could not be taken as a true reflection of the ability of this Glen side.

Naomh Columba, captained by John Joe Doherty have displayed a very fluent style of play. From the goalkeeper to the full forward they look very composed and alert.

John Joe Doherty and John P. Curran hold the defence together well. Paddy Hegarty has great all round ability and can field well and take any scoring chance that comes his way. Surely it can only be a matter of time before he will represent Donegal at senior level, having represented the All-Ireland winning U-21 team in 1987.

Boyle scored 0-5 in the quarter-final and 0-8 in the semi-final and should prove to be a handful for Glen if he is given space in front of goal.

John 'Ban' Gallagher has proved himself a good score-taker and will also pose a threat to the Glencolmcille defence.

Sunday's final is a just reward for both teams and their committees who have worked to bring their respective clubs to this stage.

Pat Conaghan and his board have maintained a high standard at Killybegs while Francie Cunningham must take a lot of credit for ensuring Naomh Columba change with the times. Both clubs are a credit to their respective communities and at the end of the day, community spirit is vital if success is to be achieved.

Killybegs find themselves in their second final in three years, having beaten neighbours Kilcar in 1988. Naomh Columba on the other hand will be appearing in their second ever senior-final; their last final appearance was back in 1978 when they beat Gweedore by 1-10 to 1-12.

In my opinion the best prescription for success is hunger. Both teams will eat their fill today in what should be a thrilling encounter. I tip Glen to experience the sweet taste of success, after a long wait.



THE HISTORY OF THE KILLYBEGS CLUB

G.A.A. club dates from a meeting again held in Fintra National School in 1962. From that time the efforts of the club were geared towards acquiring a ground to serve as a home base for the club and a permanent centre for the athletic and social activities of the members.

Shortly afterwards, the site at Fintra was acquired and, after five years hard work, was officially opened and blessed on June 11, 1967. The occasion was marked by a Donegal v. Mayo senior county game.

YOUTH

In the early '80s the emphasis has been mainly on youth. With a Grade 'A' pitch available and, more recently. the opening of a second training pitch/car park at Fintra, a flood of under-age leagues has erupted, providing valuable experience for the voungsters and a remarkable reservoir of experienced young players for the

The appreciation of the club, the parents and the players goes out to the dedicated team trainers, managers and referees who have coaxed and encouraged the young hopefuls through the competitions and imbued in them at such a young age, a true love of their national games.

One problem which is a continuing thorn in the side of the Killybegs club and which no amount of enthusiasm or dedication can overcome — is the demand made by the fishing industry on young adult players who frequently are faced with the unenviable choice of a Sunday of representing their club or going to sea with their colleagues of the deep.

SUCCESSES

Since 1980 the club has taken part in both senior and junior county championships and, in 1986, reached

The recent history of Killybegs the senior county semi-finals, only to be beaten by the narrowest of margins by Red Hughs. In the same year, our junior 'B' team were defeated by two points by Aodh Ruadh, Ballyshannon, in their county semi-final.

Sunday August 28th 1988 will be long remembered by the Killybegs club as the date on which they beat neighbours Kilcar at MacCumhaill Park, Ballybofey, by a margin of just two points to win their first senior football county title since 1952.

The final score of 2-10 to 2-8 was the culmination not only of a hard-fought game but of a season of determined effort. The tragic loss of Eamonn Byrne gave an added impetus to the team to win the title and spurred them on to greater effort during the final when all seemed beyond rescue. Management team was John Joe O'Shea, Brendan Dempsey, Michael Gallagher, Bernard Conaghan, captained by Barry Cunningham. The club also won the Junior 'B' Championship, U-14 County Championship, U-16 County Championship, and the U-14 team won Feile Péile na nÓg in Kildare.

1989

The senior team reached the semifinal but lost to Ballyshannon.

Killybegs won the Co. Minor Championship by beating Four Masters in Ballyshannon. They never had to rise their game to any great heights due to Masters' inability to hit the right form on the day. As a result the game never reached the heights one might have expected in a county minor final.

The Killybegs club ran the Eamon Byrne Memorial Cup tournament for the past two years - winning it in 1989 themselves, beating Kilcar 1-7 to 2-3, an appropriate win in many respects. This year Glen beat Killybegs in the final in a very sporting game.

would turn out as they have.



The players have grown up together and understand there is a great deal of pride at stake on county final day. Like one big happy family they prepare together. In the White house they are only after seeing their daughter Fionnula marry captain of today's team John Cunningahm. Jimmy, Conor and Kevin, are hoping for another memorable day this afternoon. Remember it was Jimmy's fisted goal in '88 that won Killybegs their first county title since 1952. The Carberry household had a hectic weekend. However, Paul and Denis have not let their sister's wedding upset their plans for their big day. A few minutes walk down the road and John "Ban" Gallagher and his brother Conal talk in detail about their plans for today. Being a village that depends mostly on flahing as a livelihood are some of their players having difficulty training. Goalkeepers David Meehan, Denis Carberry, Michael Campbell and Rory McNelis fit football into a very busy achedule. It is ironic that McNelis is a former Maomh Columba player.

Secretary of the Killybegs club, Claire Tully, Informs me that John Cunningham is a very



lucky captain and backs her claim with the success of the Donegal U-21 All-Ireland winning team in '87. Barry Cunningham, a cousin of John's who captained the team in '88 has since transferred to Tir Conaill Gaels in London but will no doubt be in the thick of things today to cheer on his mates.

Killybegs will be seeking revenge for their defeat by Naomh Columba in the Eamon Byrne Memorial Cup earlier this year.

Meanwhile, some fifteen miles from Killybegs the village of Glencolumbkille is alive with the talk of their first county final in twelve vears. Yes, one had to go back to 1978 when Niamh Columba defeated Gweedore 1-12 to 0-10 to find the last time they contested the county final. Club secretary, Cathal Doogan, tells me that they never even qualified for the semi finals since their victory in '78., 1978 was a memorable year for the club winning the senior league and championship the All-Ireland Gaeltacht championship and the U-21 title. No minor affair this one

MICHAEL DALY, Sports Editor, Donegal Democrat looks at today's curtain raiser, the Minor Final between Sean McCumhaills and Aodh Ruadh.

Minor football, at inter-county level, has gone through something of a lean patch since 1985 and quite frankly it's difficult to understand considering that its underbelly, the minor club championship has been so keenly contested in this and previous years.

In all clubs players are being coached from under 12 years and younger, so much so that by the time they reach the minor grade skills of a very polished nature are expected.

Both managers, Eugene Duffy of MacCumhaills and Sylvester Maguire have been able to call on good counsel from some very experienced mentors in both clubs. Maguire, recovering from a broken leg sustained in a Goal charity game for Donegal at Christmas has been directing his wholehearted energy into winning this title and has put his side through a lengthy training

Under referee, Peter Hughes from Milford this should prove to be an excellent curtain raiser for the senior and don't be surprised if the underdogs, Sean MacCumhaills spring a major upset.
