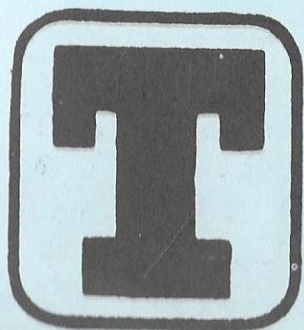

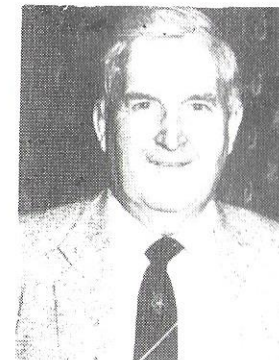

Cluiche le Cuimhneamh air?

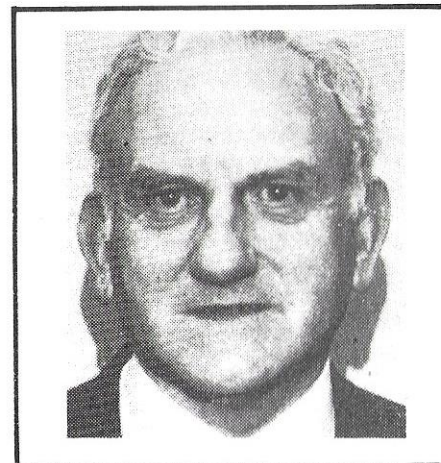
le Séamus de Faoite, Oifigeach na Gaeilge

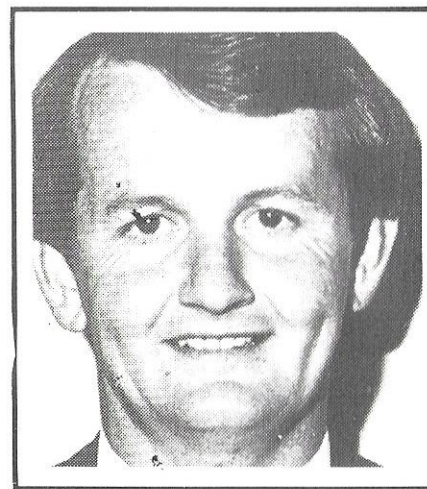
An Cluiche Deireannach

Ag tús na bliana, bhí go leor deacrachtaí ag fó-chumann Bhaile na nGallóglaigh—bhí siad i mbaol báis. Ach ní féidir fir mhaithe a cheannsú thar oíche agus rinne muintir Mhilford an bheart.

Naomh Conaill, Glenties

Founded in 1921 this is by far the longest established voluntary club or committee actively involved in the life of the community in the parish of Inniskeel. Born as it was at a critical time in the country's political history it, like many other G.A.A. clubs throughout the land provided a forum where political comrades divided by the "Treaty split" were able to come together in friendship to promote the ideals of whhat had become a great national organisation. This proved to be of tremendous benefit to the members of the local community who lived at a time when historic and dramatic changes were taking place in the political life of the country.

Soccer had been flourishing in the parish and "Glenties United" was a successful club. The club met for the last time early in July 1921 when it was decided to cease participating in Association football and to adopt Gaelic games instead.

Earlier events at county level influenced this decision. In 1906 Bishop O'Donnell, native of Kilraine and later to become the illustrious Cardinal, accepted the position of first Patron of the Donegal G.A.A. County Board and at the same time another Kilraine man, Alex McDyre, N.T., was appointed as joint secretary. On the 26th July 1921 a preliminary meeting was held and Denis Phelan, Tom O'Donohue and Packie Maguire were nominated to organise a new club. Enthusiasm was now at a high level locally and arrangements were made for a large-scale inaugural meeting to form a new club. This meeting was held in the Market Hall on the 29th August, 1921 and fortyfive members were in attendance. "St. Connell's" was selected as the name for the club and the officers appointed were: Chairman, Denis Phelan; Secretary, Packie Maguire; Treasurer, Tom O'Donohue.

Right from its inception the club proved to be very important to the cultural and social life of the parish. In

the parish many other clubs and committees have come and gone.

In 1963 the club purchased at Carrickbrack their playing field which has been developed. Much time and resources have been expended there in providing facilities so that the youth of the parish can enjoy healthy recreation there, but much remains to be done.

Playing activity is always at a very high level at the park because the club caters for many teams. These include adult teams in Junior and Senior; under-age from under-10 to under-21; Primary (boys and girls), and Comprehensive schools. Members also participate in handball tournaments and on the cultural side others take part in the various Scór competitions.

For 1990 the club's registered members, i.e. officials, members and playing members make up a total of 176 and this touches on many families in the parish. A valuable bonus for active members is the life-long friendships established with those from other clubs within the county and indeed from far beyond; for that alone the club is extremely worthwhile. In 1989 the club was able to celebrate success by winning county football titles in U-12 Championship, Junior League, Shield, Scoil Mhuire National Schools Championship by the camogie team.

In charge of the club for the year 1990 are the following officers: President, Rev. Fr. Con Cunningham; Chairman, Danny Boyle; Vice-Chairman, Michael Glynn; Secretary, Michael Glynn; Asst. Secretary, Patsy Gallagher; Treasurer, James Breslin; Asst. Treasurer, Paddy Gallagher; P.R.O., Michael Quinn; Oifigeach na Gaeilge, Cruachar Boyle. Senior Team Manager, Hughie Molloy; Junior, Leo McLoone. A Sub-Committee of the club, the Minor Board looks after underage and is headed by chairman, Dr. Michael Cooke with Patsy Furey as secretary.

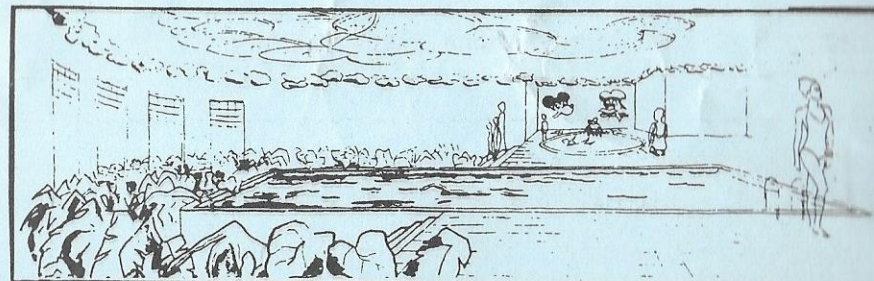

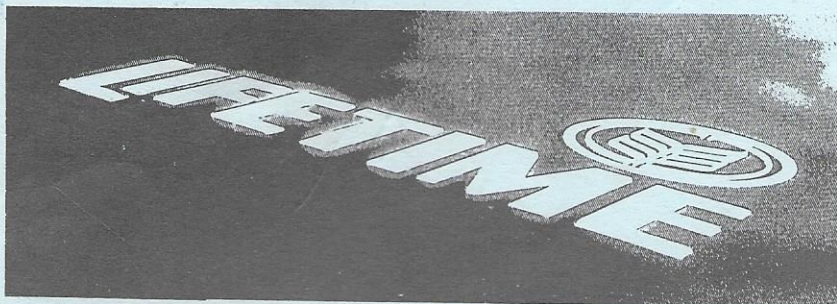
