DAVID AND GOLIATH

The fireworks of Sunday's sizzling set-to on the box, during which more than sparks flew in an explosive no-punches-pulled clash involving NFL champions Derry and the Red Hands, have set the tone for Part 2 of 'The Championship' . . . today's anticipated thriller between David and Goliath.

With Breffni Park a string again to Cavan's bow, after two difficult and brief skirmishes in Ballybofey, the Blues will certainly hope they can dispatch their sling-shots accurately. And, no doubt with the same shattering ferocity Henry Downey's inspired side hit home base with to send Tyrone into a tail-spin.

Damien O'Reilly leads the underdogs into battle. What Cavan appear to lack in craft will, O'Reilly hopes, be compensated with inflated conviction, and like Derry of last week, an unquenchable determination to succeed.

Pressure. It will strain every ounce of self-belief throughout 70 intense and gruelling minutes when any and all weaknesses will be exposed, and quite possibly punished with ruthless finishing.

As P.J. Carroll suggested during the week, Cavan must unsettle the opposition, opponents seasoned by three successive final appearances, and play with "the fierce hunger Derry played with against Tyrone" if they're to defy the odds and shred today's script.

The script has tended usually to finish for Cavan with Stephen King trying everything he knows to pull their challenge up by the boot laces.

King played a virtual solo-act in the closing 25 minutes last summer when the chips were once more on the deck. Toothless finishing was again the chief cause.

Stephen won the man of the match honours in Ballybofey, recognition which underlined the fact. It was small consolation. When Cavan were asked what they were made of, they had no answer but to look to King to somehow dent Donegal's semi-final claim. As so often before, it was too much to ask of one player.

It's argued Cavan have a better balanced side. It's argued Damien O'Reilly, Fintan Cahill, and Ciaran Brady have given them what they lacked in 1990 and '91.

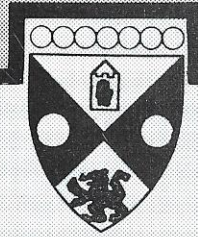
It's argued Ronan Carolan, the NFL's top marksman, will not have all the scoring responsibility on heaped his prolific 24-year-old shoulders. When Jim Curran calls for half-time we'll have an idea whether or not this forecast is measuring up.

Donegal are red-hot favourites. Late lapses, to Brian McEniff's annoyance, have become frequent this season. The cause is an old recurring achilles heel - the dangerous tendency to shorten their short, elaborate passing game.

Instead of red-hot, Donegal have been left red-faced too often for McEniff's liking. What happened against Dublin in the league play-offs, when they should have cantered to a 10-point plus win only to trip and crash out cold, is a warning not to get careless.

Joyce McMullan tends to keep some of his best wine for the trips here. He has a habit of scoring the spectacular. Bonner and the Boyle's don't lack punch either, and while Cavan cannot be written off, when the Fat Lady Sings expect Donegal's chorus of support to be in full voice.

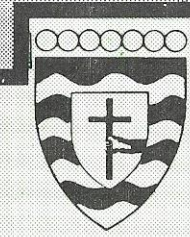

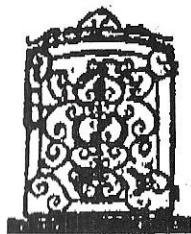

GARY WALSH (Burren): 27. 6'3". Transferred this year from Aodh Ruadh, Ballyshannon to the Down club. Mickey Linden's goal in the Ulster final was the only goal scored against him in two campaigns. Accountant.

JOHN CUNNINGHAM (Killybegs): 25. 5'11". Captain for the first few League games but missed after Christmas games when working in Paris. Now battling for full fitness again. Carpenter.

PAUL CARR (Four Masters): 30. 5'11". The former St. Eunans player is having his first injury-free season and being consistently played at full-back, while centre half-back would be his more natural position. Accountant.

MATT GALLAGHER (Naomh Brid): 30. 5'10". The utility player who fills nearly any defensive position. Recently acquired Public House in Bundoran. Won Railway Cup medal this year. Publican and Snackfoods Retailer.

DONAL REID (Red Hughs): 30. 5'10". The Donegal Creameries rep. was rested at the start of the NFL campaign but has shown recently that he is regaining his good form. Creamery rep.

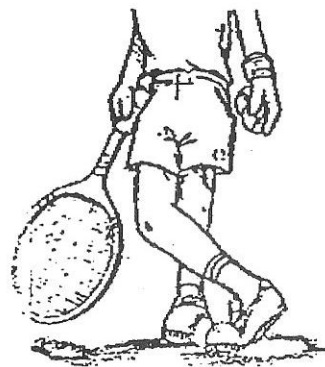

TONY BOYLE (Dungloe): 22. 5'11". Has been Donegal's most consistent forward during the NFL. Probably needs to improve his scoring ratio but will be a handful for an full-back. Won Railway Cup medal this year.

MANUS BOYLE (Killybegs): 26. 5.10". Always among the leading scorers in Donegal football, Manus is good for four or five points in most games.**PAUL CALLAGHAN (Burt):** 21. 6'1". The fairhaired Paul has buckled down to the task of understudy to Gary Walsh, and will keep the pressure on the Burren man. Great kick-out.

MARK McSHANE (Kilcar): 22. 6'. One of the stars of last year's U-21 team, Mark has been a regular during the League campaign. Has been in Cork recently on work experience and missed most of the preparations. Factory worker.

NOEL HEGARTY (Naomh Columba): 23. 6'. Troubled by injury, the glen man has always performed well for Donegal when called in and gave Mickey Linden little when brought in to mark him in the Ulster final.

TOMMY RYAN (Termon): 25. 5'11". One of the best club players in Donegal, Tommy has been in and out of the Donegal team, having difficulty finding a settled position. Donegal Oil Co. rep.

MARK CROSSAN (St. Eunans): 22. 6'10". One of the newcomers to the squad this year after a successful run with the U-21s. Has yet to make the breakthrough.

JAMES McHUGH (Kilcar): 28. 5'7". The younger McHugh always comes to prominence when the grounds dry out. Very fast and likely to make a contribution if called upon. ESB worker.

JIM McGUINNESS (N. Cornail): 20. 6'1". The long-haired Jim was one of the stars of the U-21 side who went down by just one point to Tyrone. Still learning the game and looks one for the future.

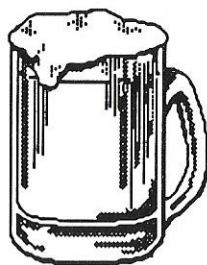

CROKE PARK DEVELOPMENT

On Tuesday, 11 February 1992, Cumann Lúthchleas Gael announced full details of plans to develop Croke Park into one of the finest and most modern stadia in Europe. The plans have been lodged with Dublin Corporation and a decision is awaited.

The first phase of the development will involve the rebuilding of the Cusack Stand, and it is hoped that work will commence before the end of this year.

A special G.A.A. Club Term Ticket Prospectus and details of all ticket packages, discount schemes and preferential rate loan schemes will be sent to every G.A.A. club within the next fortnight.

The options being offered to clubs are as follows:-

Option 1: A package of two covered and two uncovered seats for the hurling and football All Irelands for a ten year period at a cost of £4,000 (Reduction 20%).

Option 2: Two covered seats at £2,500 (Reduction 17%).

Option 3: Two uncovered seats at £1,700 (Reduction 15%)

Option 4: Purchase no tickets at all. No club is being forced to buy tickets under the scheme.

NB: Discounts only apply to clubs and are limited to four tickets per club.
