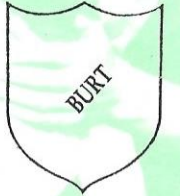

Has been on Ulster's referees list for five years in which time he has been in charge of Ulster Minor, U-21 and Dr. McKenna Cup games. A very capable official.

Austin Wallace (Burt)

Austin is 44 years of age, and has been refereeing for almost 15 years at senior level. He was the man in the middle at last week's Fermanagh Senior Hurling Final, and today he is the main man for the Co. Junior Football Final between Fanad Gaels and Kilcar.

He refereed Co. Senior semi-final, senior res. Championship Fina, U-13, U-21 in football. Austin also has the distinction of refereeing every age group at hurling Championship, except the senior hurling championship, due to the fact that his own club side was involved in almost every one of them.

Another claim to fame for Austin is that he is also a qualified soccer referee. He is one of the few referees in the County to hold a grade two badge for hurling. Austin is also refereeing today's senior camogie final between Carndonagh and Newtowncunningham.

The Burt Angle

"Don't even think about it!" If you've seen the latest Pepsi ad on television you'll be familiar with the intent behind that expression. It only applies of course if you were thinking about flipping the page over, as a lot of people tend to do in Donegal when the subject of hurling arises. Still, if you're this far you'll probably stick it out for the remaining couple of words.

Burt and Setanta in another Donegal Senior Hurling Final - a renewal of the epic encounters of the 1980's between the two clubs, an annual clash of the ash briefly interrupted by the ascent of the Naomh Mura club who unsuccessfully challenged Burt's mantle as champions for the last two years.

So, how do we in Burt feel about playing our old rivals Setanta - the men in black from The Cross and Killygordon, as we strive for that always desirable three-in-a-row? Well, its good to see them back challenging for the honours, and we know that any game against Setanta, but *especially* the county final, is guaranteed to be one laced with passion and commitment . . . of the Kieran Doherty type - hard but fair. Our kind of match too! The winners will be worthy of the Donegal crown, but we would be hopeful that our competitive participation in the Derry senior hurling league will stand us in good stead in to-days game, which incidentally is our first final appearance under the new management of Darren McDermott.

Finally a question to whomever it concerns! Isn't it possible over the next few years to lay in place a proper hurling coaching structure at underage level in Donegal - made available to every single one of Donegal's thirty-something clubs who do not participate in hurling? Isn't it possible to subsidise the same clubs for money spent on equipment for youngsters - i.e. hurley sticks and helmets? Following on from that, isn't it then possible to make participation in U-12 hurling (at least) compulsory for every club in Donegal? The benefits of such a long term plan would be enormous for the much maligned sport of hurling, even if the rewards might not be apparent for over a decade. I don't think it's too much to ask, but such an ambitious plan would only work if it met with the full backing of the Donegal County Board, as well as the clubs. The incentives for such a structure would have to be forthcoming from the likes of ourselves and Setanta. We in the hurling fraternity can mutter and scold as long as we want about the promotion of hurling in Donegal, or rather the lack of it, but that won't change anything. We need action, and we need it now. Come on, isn't it worth a try?

Setanta Hurling Club

Club formed in 1979, based in Crossroads, Killygordon area. Club won their first Co. Senior Hurling Championship in 1981. Burt won in 1982, and Setanta went on to win the Championship for the next five years from 1983 - 1987.

1990 was Setanta's last appearance in the Co. final which they won that year by beating Burt. Most of the players in the Cross/Killygordon also play football for their sister club Red Hughs. Seven of the present Hurling panel play senior football this year, with their eye on the possibility of winning two County medals this year.

The club was at its strongest perhaps in 1983 with 13 of their players on the Co. team that lost the Junior Hurling Final to Cavan.

The Club played successfully in the Fermanagh League in the late 80's early 90's winning the competition twice, this has been a big step in maintaining a good standard of Hurling at the Cross.

Today's panel contains fourteen of the 1990 panel which last won the championship and sixteen of today's panel have already won senior medals with the club.

Hurlers from the Cross area had much success at underage level, particularly in the 1970's, but this is the first year that any of them made it to Croke Park. While the adults are playing in Ballybofey, Paul Anderson will be playing as the Donegal representative in the mini-sevens in between the All-Ireland Semi-Finals today, Paul is a pupil of Dromore School and resides at Ardnaganna. Also on the First Sunday of September, Paul's fellow pupil, Noel Ewing will be representing Donegal and Ulster in the Mini-Sevens at Croke Park on All-Ireland Hurling Final day.

Today the average age of our team is 24 years and this is good for the future of Donegal's only exclusively hurling club.

Lets hope Colman Carr (Team Captain) can bring back and make "Sam Junior" a welcome visitor to our Parish for the coming year.

But regardless who wins, let's hope the game of football we love so much, is the real winner.

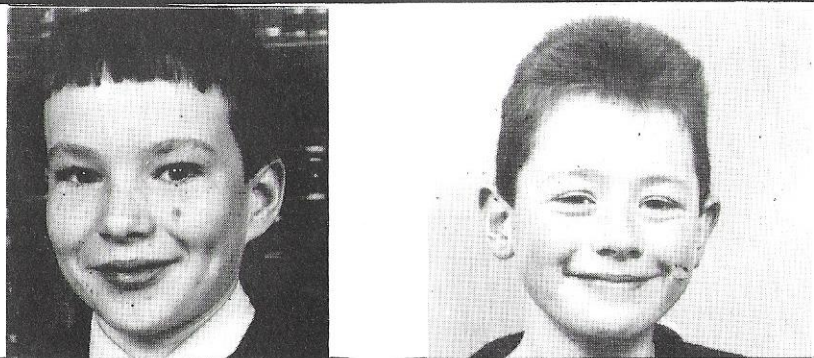
