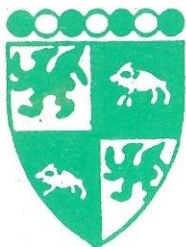

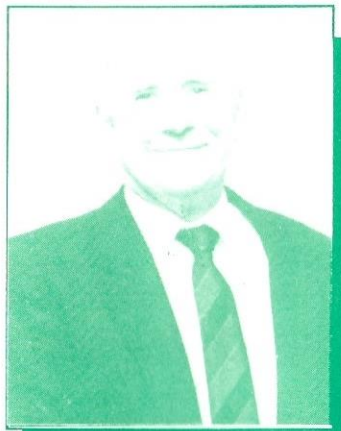

The footballers of Donegal pay their first visit to Longford since last September and that unforgettable afternoon when they captured the Sam Maguire Cup for the very first time.

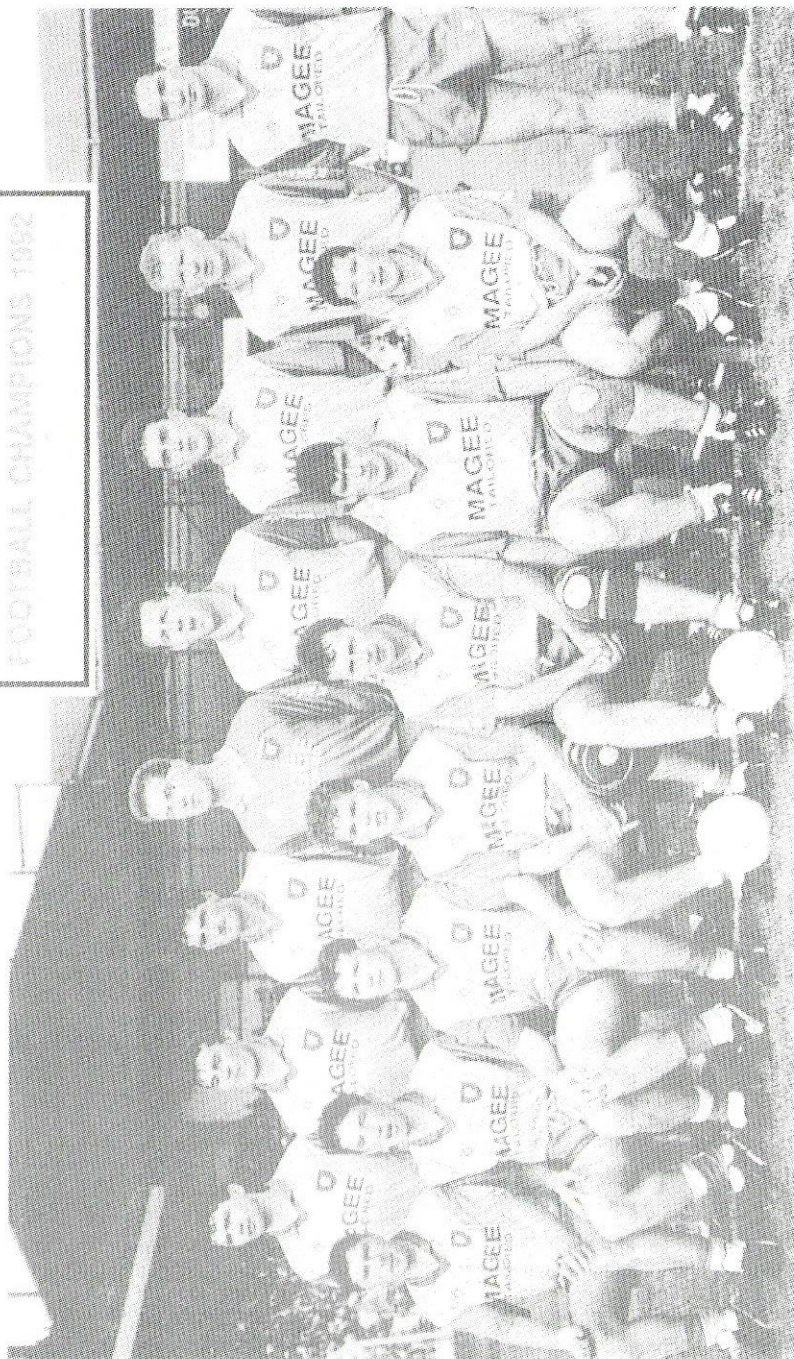
We warmly congratulate them on their magnificent achievement, and wish them well in their endeavours to retain 'Sam' in 1993.

... A great footballing pedigree

THE HONOURS awarded to Donegal senior team football manager Brian McEniff just seem to keep on going. Two weeks ago he was named as “Donegal Person of the Year”, an honour that he was particularly proud to receive as it was his fellow county people that bestowed the honour upon him.

Towards the end of 1992 he also received a prestigious “People of the Year” award for his contribution to Gaelic football in the county as well as the title of overall “Manager of the Year”, beating the like of Jack Charlton, the Republic’s soccer manager, and Nicholas Cruz, the Cuban-born Irish boxing coach at last year’s Barcelona Olympics.

However, as fitting as the accolades are, McEniff’s feet are firmly on the ground as the only thought that occupies his mind at present is the retention of the All-Ireland championship in September.

While the Bundoran hotelier takes the elevated public exposure at his ease, he knows that the task ahead will be just as hard, if not harder for both himself and his panel of players than last year.

He has been too long in the business to think otherwise as his own footballing pedigree proves. He holds a total of eight Donegal Senior Championship medals and every other player’s medals obtainable in Gaelic football with the exception of an All-Ireland winners medal, but he would have been happy with the special manager’s medal that he received last year.

Grounded in the rudiments of the game at St. Macartan’s College, Monaghan, his passion for the game has rarely been equalled since he made his Ulster Championship Final debut in 1966 against Down, having played his first championship game earlier in the campaign against Cavan.

He took over as player/manager of the team in 1972, the county’s first provincial success at senior level and since that date the life-long Pioneer has been at the helm of all of the senior team’s successes in one capacity or another. Player/manager again when Donegal took the Ulster crown in 1974 he has gone on to manage further Donegal team successes in 1983, 1990 and, of course, 1992, the “Year of Sam”.

He was the first Donegal man to receive an All Star Award in 1972 and holds two Railway Cup medals, so it is plain to see the dedication and commitment that he has had for his county, a period that spans nearly four decades.

One of the most shrewd observers of the game today, his in-depth knowledge of both teams and players has paid off handsomely in the past. Any person that ever finds the copybook that he has done his homework on over the years could very well find himself with a best seller.

But then again, McEniff has been too long in the business to leave his copybook lying around. He is still writing up his plans for 1993.

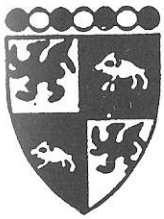
