## P.J.'s 'new' agenda for youth

After 18 National League games under new boss, P. J. McGowan, the term 'new boss' is hardly appropriate any more when describing the Raphoe Vocational School teacher.

There have been two championship games, two Dr. McKenna Cup matches and a host of challenge games as McGowan endeavours to rebuild a successful Donegal team.

He has maintained a very fresh approach to player selection, particularly in the current NFL where a host of new players have tasted their first sample of competitive football at senior level for the county.

In those 18 games so far in the NFL 12 were played in the '94 to '95 season and Donegal reached the National league Final, for the second time in three years. From those 12 games Donegal recorded seven victories and five defeats.

They won against Down, Derry, Dublin, Meath, Kildare, Clare and Laois, lost to Kildare, Laois, Kerry (twice) and Derry. Conscious of the need to bring in new players McGowan brought in new players, James Ruane made his debut against Dublin, others such as Seanie Boyle and Damien Diver sampled competitive football at senior level while a number of players who had also been used by Brian McEniff got another opportunity to impress.

While the '95 league ended ultimately in defeat it was a good start by 43-year-old McGowan. A memorable victory over the then All-Ireland champions Down in the preliminary round of the championship seemed to hammer home the belief that great work had been done.

As can happen, however, that success was quickly forgotten when Donegal lost to Monaghan and there ensued a long and at times acrimonious summer.

By October everyone was only to glad to see the talking put to one side and the football took centre stage. In six outings this season Donegal have won three times, against Clare, Tyrone and Laois. They have drawn against Meath and Derry and have lost once, yet again to Kerry who seem to be their bogey team in recent times.

In this current season McGowan has used so many 'new' players that his selections are now very difficult to predict. He has given starting debuts to Sean McEwen (v Clare), James Ruane (v Tyrone\* he was a sub against Dublin the year before), Niall McCready (Tyrone), Martin Coll (Kerry), Patrick Cunningham and Brian Roper (both v Meath), Seamus McGinty (Derry). Barry Ward came in as a sub against Kerry, Noel McGinley was a sub against Meath (he's just 19), and of the subs listed today only Damien Conlon hasn't seen some involvement in this league season.

The side against Meath was particularly youthful, the average age of the panel was in fact worked out at just 24½ years, a big change from earlier years.

P. J. McGowan has been as good as his word in relation to trying new players and there are many others including such as Paul Callaghan who have been given games this year. At times the injury list to panel members was so high that this high level of team selection experimentation was a blessing.

From that experimentation McGowan has satisfied himself that a number of the new players are well worth their places but when the Championship grows closer he will have an incredible task in deciding his team. There are, after all, players such as James McHugh, Manus Boyle, John Joe Doherty, Barry McGowan and Martin Gavigan all to be considered.

For now McGowan has explained his plan: "We find ourselves in a transitional phase with a need for team building. 1992 and winning an All-Ireland was absolutely fantastic and never to be forgotten, but it was also four years ago, with players from that era four years older.

"The success and quality of the 1992 squad made it very difficult for new lads to get an opportunity, but nobody can go on indefinitely and this League campaign has given the opportunity to younger lads to show what they can do.

"So far it has gone well enough and the younger lads have blended in well and they have not been found wanting in the top flight", he wrote in a recent match programme.

In many respects the changes in selections instigated by P.J. McGowan were probably a little overdue. Brian McEniff recognised when he stood down that it was going to be very difficult for him to dismantle an All-Ireland winning side, very hard to tell players it was the end of the road.

Although with over 20 years experience from club to county, from Vocational Schools teams to local under-12s, P.J. McGowan has brought a freshness to the job which understandably had gone from his predecessor. However, he too, will soon have to make hard choices as did Brian McEniff, again it will be difficult to predict at this stage who will be there come Championship.

However, barring injury, Matt Gallagher and Gary Walsh should be breaking some appearance records later this year. Walsh is just two Championship appearances away from Martin McHugh and Joyce McMullan's record of 32 each, while Gallagher has played 133 competitive games for Donegal (today will be 134), just one less than Donal Reid on 135 and four off the record of 138 held by Martin McHugh.

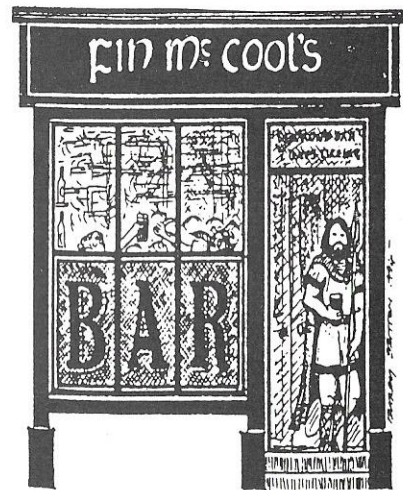

## Higgs is new County Coach

29 year old Paddy Hegarty was appointed as County Coach this week and takes up his new appointment tomorrow for an 11-month period.

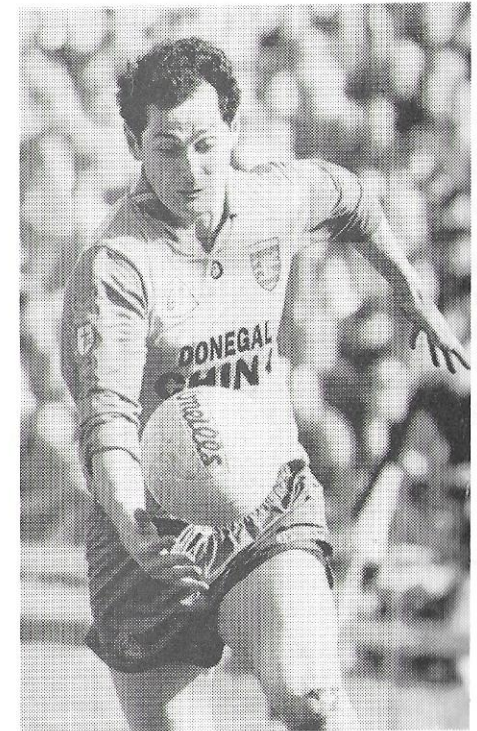
The Naomh Columba man will bring with him to his new post a wealth of experience garnered on the playing fields throughout the county and throughout the country where he has developed into one of the best forwards that Donegal has produced.

He could be regarded as a late developer at senior county level, making a championship debut in 1988 but then being in the Championship wilderness until last year, when he had his second game against Down in Clones, where he demonstrated all his skills and was an easy choice for the man of the match award.

Paddy was at half-forward when Donegal won their second All-Ireland U-21 Championship in 1977, defeating Kerry in a replay in Roscommon.

At club level Paddy has been a stalwart with his native Naomh Columba, winning a Senior Championship medal in 1990, and four League titles in the past 11 years. He has also won an All-Ireland Gaeltacht medal with his club.

Paddy replaces Donal Buggy as County Coach and his brief will include visiting Schools and Clubs, with the East



and North-West Divisions being targeted as priority.

Paddy's likeable personality will bring a new dimension to the position and his profile as a county player should ensure the success of his appointment.

Paddy has considerable experience looking after underage teams with his club, and his exceptional skill level will be enjoyed by the young underage players.

Over the past number of years, Paddy has been among the top five club players in the county, operating anywhere from full-back to full-forward.

We wish him well in his new post.

# FR. SEÁN'S BOOK OF FACTS

Looking through the new Raidió na Gaeltachta Book of GAA Facts by Fr. Sean O Gallchoir, a survey of players who played Championship football for Donegal since 1972 makes interesting reading.

111 players were used since the beginning of the 1972 campaign until last year. Aodh Ruadh, Ballyshannon, had 15, with St. Eunan's in second place with 13. The trend of appearances has changed much over the years with St. Eunan's only having two of that thirteen in the last ten years, while other clubs like Killybegs have had six players playing championship football since 1987.

The full list of representation from clubs is: N. Conaill 4, F. Masters 7, Aodh Ruadh 15, Downings 2, Bundoran 7, St. Eunans 13, R. Emmets 2, MacCumhailis 6, Gweedore 2, Dungloe 7, Ardara 7, Naomh Columba 9, Kilcar 5, Muff 1, St. Michaels 1, Glenfin 4, Bunrana 1, Walterstown 1, Pettigo 1, Naomh Brid 2, Red Hughs 2, Urris 1, Na Rossa 2, St. Nauls 1, Killybegs 6, Naomh Ultan 1, Termon 1.

There were some unusual occurrences such as four Aodh Ruadh players — Gary Walsh, Brian Murray, Sylvester Maguire and Gerry Curran — making their debut on the same day in Armagh in 1984; the Gallagher brothers, Matt and the late Pauric, on the same day in 1982. Donal Reid was registered with Bundoran when he made his debut but we have credited him to Red Hughs.

There are many other amazing facts in Fr. Seán's new book — no GAA enthusiast should be without it.



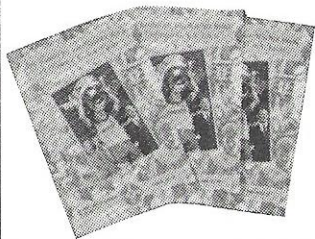

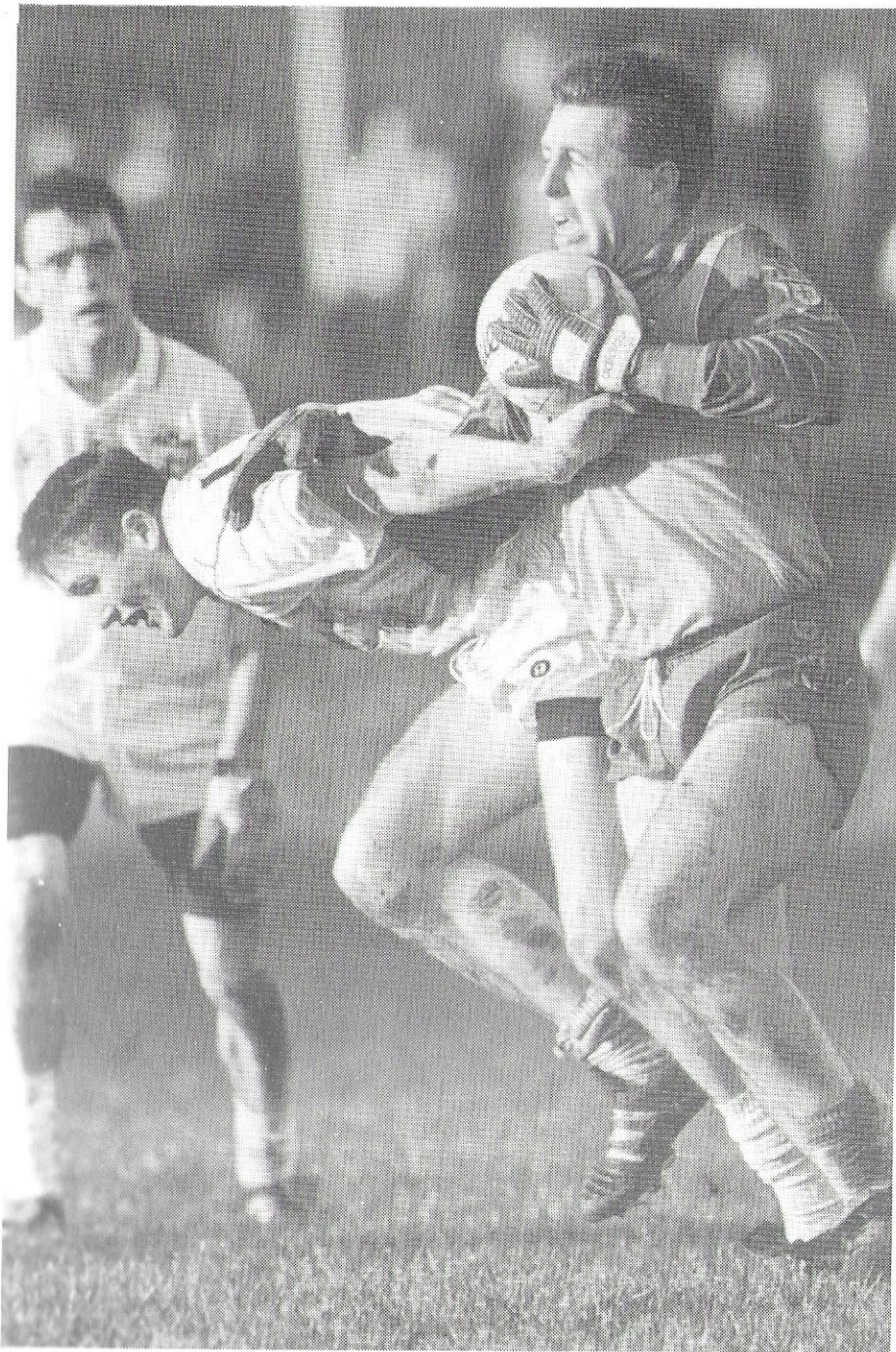

Kildare and Donegal have similar records when it comes to the National League, both have appeared in finals but neither have been successful. Kildare have appeared in five National Football League finals, while Donegal have appeared in two.

Kildare's finals were 1928 (Kerry 2-4, Kildare 1-6); 1928 (Kerry 1-7, Kildare 2-3); 1958 (Dublin 3-13, Kildare 3-8); 1968 (Down 2-14, Kildare 2-11) and 1991 (Dublin 1-9, Kildare 0-10).

Donegal's final appearances were much more recent in 1993 and again last year when they lost out to Dublin and Derry respectively.

The roll of honour for the National Football League has Kerry leading with 15 titles from Mayo with 10.

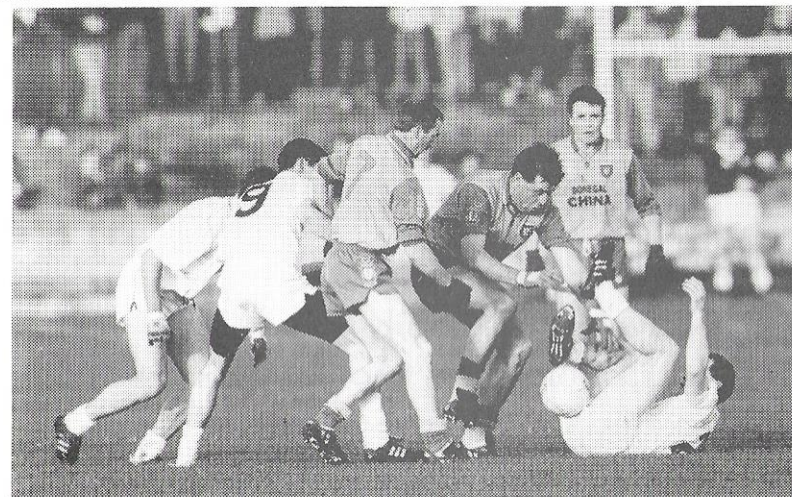

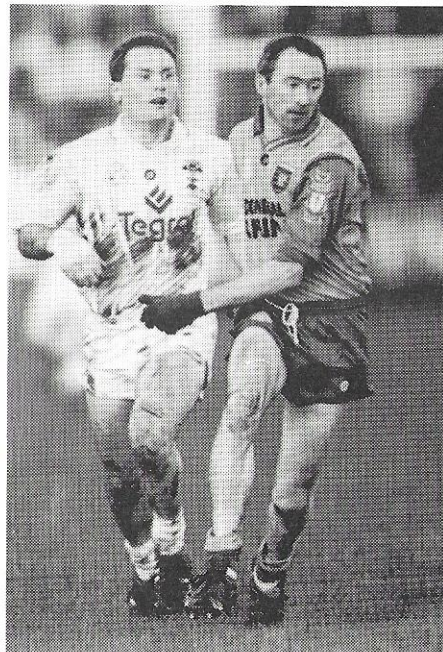

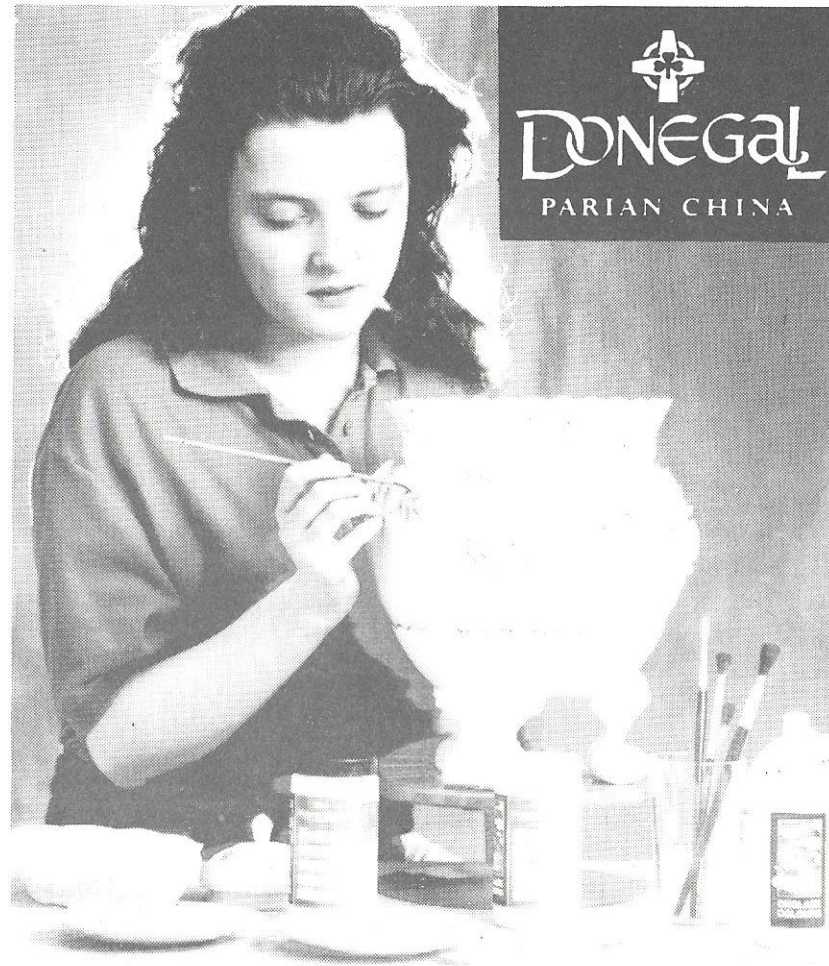
