### Mickey McVeigh



Mickey made his senior club debut in 1990 for Castlewellan against Glenn and this year, at 25, made his Senior County Championship debut against Donegal. He has two major disappointments ... losing the 1991 Down Senior Final against Downpatrick, and taking so long to make the County team.

However, outstanding club displays in the league and particularly in Castlewellan's back to back County Championship wins, brought him firmly to the forefront and nudged the county selectors. Breathtaking saves, commanding fielding in the small square, coolness under pressure and his trademark-colossal kick-outs - are all reasons why the 6'3", 15 stone 3lb giant is now the county's no. 1 custodian.

Mickey showed outstanding footballing skill from an early age when as a young 13 year old he won a Gold medal in the G.A.A. National Skills Awards for U-14 players. Indeed he was the only player of his age in the club to do so.

He became a goal-keeper quite by accident. Mickey was injured as an outfield player for this school team. St. Malachy's High School, Castlewelland and his club's U-16 team were short of a goalie a couple of weeks later. Despite still carrying an injury Mickey was handed the jersey and played a stormer.

When he was told he was playing against Donegal he was absolutely delighted and considers the privilege to be one of the highlights of his career.

His other career high points are winning 2 S.F.C. with Castlewellan and he ranks the penalty save in last year's final against Downpatrick as his best save.

Mickey's burning ambition is to win an All-Ireland medal with Down. If there was an All-Ireland 'cic fada' competition maybe Mickey would have an All-Ireland medal already!



### Mickey Linden (Down)


To captain the Down team in a Provincial Final is for me an honour and a privilege.

### DOWN'S HISTORIC TOUR

Down, Ulster and All-Ireland champions 'on the double' in 1960 and 1961, were invited to do a 'coast to coast' tour of the USA in 1962. They had just taken the NFL title as well, beating Dublin, 2-5 to 1-7, in the Final on 13th May. Two days later they were on their way as guests of the North American Board, and what a tour that turned out to be. After tours and receptions in NY, they headed for Boston, and, in their first game defeated the All American League, 4-10 to 2-5. Then, on to Chicago where they scored their second success over the All American League, 1-8 to 0-5. Third game was in Cleveland and yet another win over the All American League, 1-14 to 0-6. Philadelphia was the next port of call, and a fourth victory over the All American League, 3-11 to 0-7. The final game was in San Francisco, where they defeated a San Francisco Selection, 7-13 to 1-8. The nineteen players, all of whom played at one stage or other, were:-

### HISTORIC TYRONE TOUR

As 1956 Ulster champions, Tyrone were invited to join Cork and Wexford hurling teams on the 1957 trip to New York. They thus became the first team from the Six Counties to make such a trip, and what a resounding success it turned out to be. They flew out on 29th May 1957 and their first game was at the famous Polo Grounds, where they lost narrowly, 2-9 to 1-14, to a New York Selection. Unfortunately, Iggy Jones was injured in that game and was unable to play in the remaining games. They got revenge the following Sunday when they beat New York, 1-12 to 2-6, at Gaelic Park. They later beat a Cork/Kerry team, 1-7 to 1-5, but lost the final game to NY, 1-6 to 1-10. A triumphal occasion for the Ulster champions and a memorable trip with this team:-


respectively, as well as Railway Cup medals in 1989 and 1994.





### ST. TIGHEARNACH'S PARK, CLONES

### **GROUND REGULATIONS**

- 1. All persons entering this ground are admitted only subject to the following Ground Regulations and to the Rules and Regulations of the Gaelic Athletic Association. Entry to the ground shall be deemed to constitute unqualified acceptance of all these Rules and Regulations.
- 2. Fireworks, smoke canisters, bottles, glasses, cans, flags, banners, poles and other similar articles or containers, including anything which could or might be used as a weapon, are not permitted within the ground, and any person in possession of such an article or container may be refused entry or ejected from the ground.
- 3. The consumption of intoxicating liquor is permitted only in authorised places and spectators are not permitted to bring alcohol into the ground/arena.
- 4. The unauthorised climbing of stands or other buildings in the ground is forbidden.
- 5. Unnecessary noise such as that from the use of radio sets and behaviour likely to cause confusion or nuisance of any kind, including foul or abusive language, is not permitted in any part of the ground.
- 6. Under no circumstances is it permitted to throw any object onto the pitch.
- 7. Unauthorised persons are not permitted to enter upon the field of play.
- 8. Any person who fails to comply with the instructions from a steward may be ejected from the ground.
- 9. In general, the right of admission is reserved to the Ground Management.
- 10. The Ground Management reserve the right to refuse admission to or eject any person who refuses to be searched by a member of the Garda Siochána.
- 11. Any person who remains in a gangway may be ejected from the ground.
- 12. The Ground Management reserve the right for its servants or agents to remove from the ground/arena any person who does not comply with the Ground Regulations or whose presence in the ground could reasonably be construed as constituting a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to other spectators.
- 13. All persons in the grounds are reminded of their obligations under Section 18 (3) of the Fire Services Act 1981 to ensure that their behaviour does not present a danger from fire to any one using the premises.

During that glory period they collected two All-Ireland medals and their win in '91 was the victory which showed the way for the rest of Ulster.

Linden and Canavan can play but its all down to the service they receive and thats why we can expect a real struggle for supremacy in the middle of the park.

Ulster is the best Championship despite what some people may say and today should go a long way in proving that once more.



Eleven years later they were back at the final stage, opening with a 4-13 to 0-2 win over Fermanagh, followed by a semi-final victory over Derry. In the Ulster Final they drew with Armagh but won the replay 0-11 to 1-6. In the All-Ireland semi-final they got revenge on Mayo with a fine 2-11 to 1-7 victory, and then an even greater performance against Meath in the Final, 2-6 to 0-6. The team included several players who would later star as seniors, and, in the Ulster Final they lined out as follows:-


### YOUNG TYRONE CHAMPIONS
