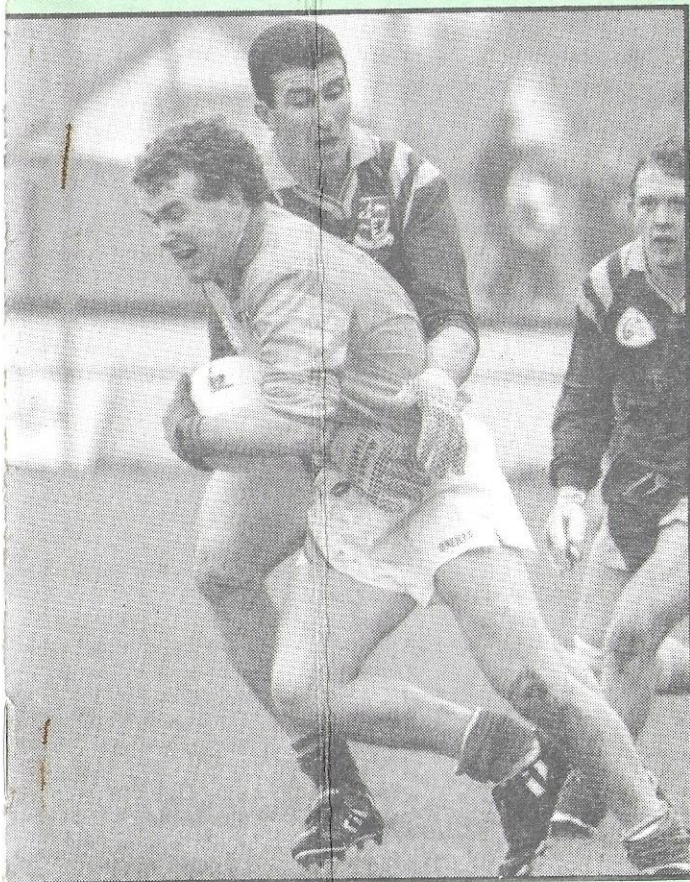

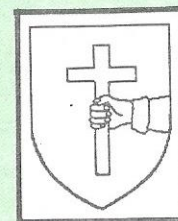

Chairman's welcome

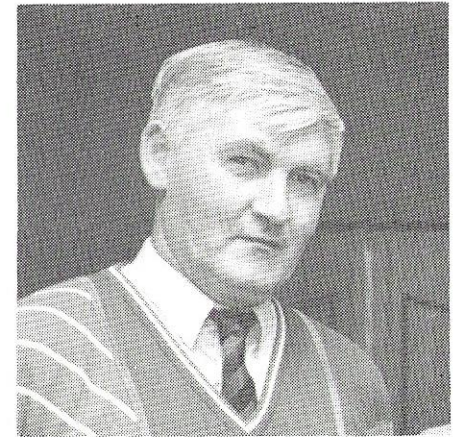

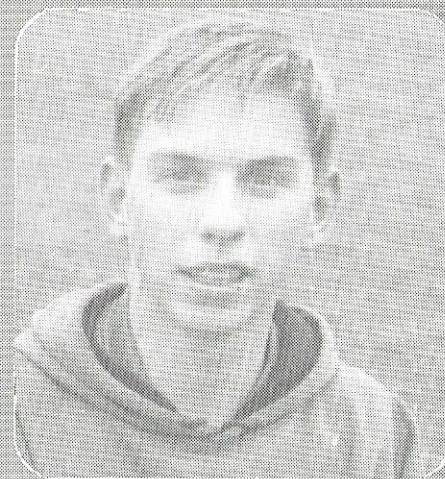

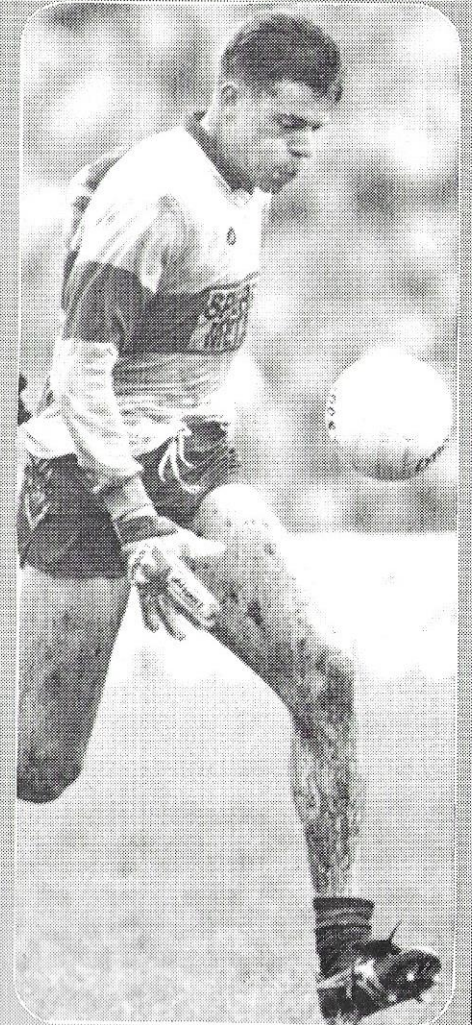

New manager faces big challenge

The good times of Donegal football in the early 90s are a thing of the past now. Most of the players who brought glory to the county have moved on.

And now one of them, Declan Bonner, has a new and very big challenge in front of him as he tries to bridge the gap between mediocrity and success once more.

Since our success at All Ireland level in '92 and nine years in Division One, the Donegal public have come to expect success; to expect our teams to be able to compete at the highest level.

That is healthy, but expecting something and getting it are poles apart.

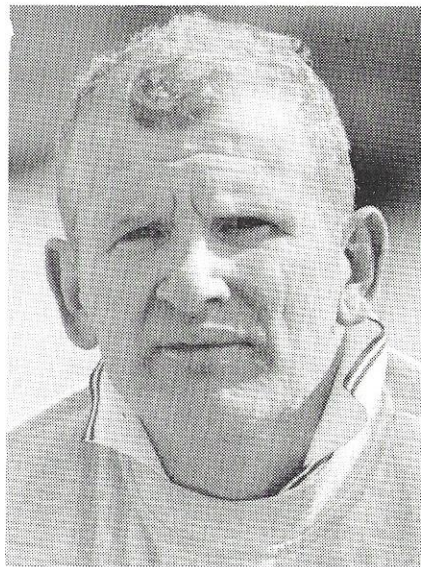
The fine line between success and failure is as much down to luck as anything, but most analysts in Donegal will tell you that the transition period has been difficult.

That is the biggest challenge facing Declan Bonner in his new role as manager.

Bonner has his second league game today against Derry and his fifth debutante in the form of Raymond Sweeney.

Bonner has made a commitment to the new panel members that they will get a chance. He has also realistically stated that not all will make it.

The manager's main problems are the same as his predecessor, P. J. McGowan – filling positions

at midfield and in the half-forward line.

The demise of Anthony Molloy and the McHughs and Joyce McMullan has left a gap that no county can easily fill. There are talented players still in the county, but most of them have still to reach the level that will give hope to the supporters.

The new players now getting their chance will be under big pressure to make an impact almost immediately.

The news last week that players of the calibre of John Gildea, Niall McCready, Ollie Reid and Danny Gallagher could be back in contention in the New Year and the return from injury or rest of Barry McGowan, Manus

Boyle, Sean McEwen, James Ruane and Dessie McNamara will make it even more difficult for the newcomers.

The manager's dilemma is to be able to balance results with giving the newcomers the time and games to make the breakthrough.

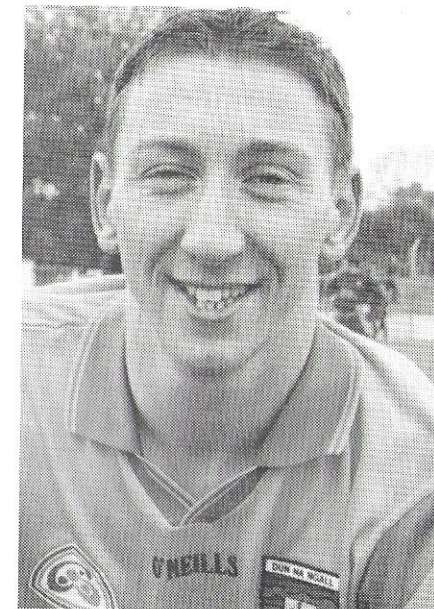
At the end of the day it will be down to judgement – the games before Christmas are the most difficult for Donegal and home wins against Derry today and Meath would leave Donegal in a healthy position.

After Christmas the Donegal panel will probably take on a completely new look.

Two of the newcomers – Brendan Devenney and Shane Bradley – hold their places for today's game. They have a great chance to stake a permanent place. Today, Raymond Sweeney gets his chance. For others the chance may come as a substitute. But whatever way it comes, the chance to impress will be brief and just as it does in deciding games, luck will play a big part.

Luck will also play its part in how new manager, Declan Bonner, performs. How he can gel his panel together and overcome disagreements; how he can keep all his panel happy when some are not getting games.

Apart from luck, these are the areas which Bonner must get right if Donegal are to return to the glory days of the early 90s.

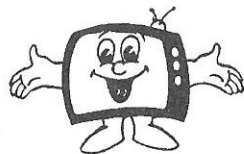

Bonner brings in the new boys

For most Derry supporters in the crowd today the Donegal line up will look a lot less familiar than Donegal sides of the past decade. New boss Declan Bonner has made the transition from No. 13 and is now directing affairs from the sideline along with former team mates Charlie Mulgrew, Matt Gallagher and team trainer Michael Oliver McIntyre from Naomh Columba. After a few trials and challenge matches they have unearthed some new talent from around the county and are trying to blend the old with the not so old with a view to bringing some success back to the county. A sign of the changes in Donegal football was evident in the first league match v Longford when only 3 of the 92 starting team were on the first fifteen. John Joe Doherty, Noel Hegarty and Tony Boyle.

The new caps that day who made their competitive debut were Jonathan Scanlon from St. Eunans, corner back on this year Under 21 team and who was man of the match in the recent Under 21 County final when his side easily defeated Ardara. Cathal Brennan from the Dungloe Club made the start at midfield in Longford. He is 22 years of age and has been very consistent for his club in the past couple of years helping them to the county League title in '96 their first major trophy for a number of years. Shane Bradley from the MacCumhaills club played centre forward. He is 21 years of age and has been one of the top scorers in club football in the county for the past few years and is known as an excellent left footed free taker. The fourth new cap was Brendan Devenney the 21 year-old St. Eunans attacker who has made a name for himself this year, being instrumental in bringing St. Eunans to the County final. In that final he helped himself to a total of 1-7 and winning the man of the match award in the process. His transfer from junior club Naomh Colmcille at the start of the year being a major boost to the Letterkenny men. Also new to Bonners squad are Shane Carr a 22 year-old half forward from the Four Masters club who has represented the county at all level of under age. Raymond Sweeney was full back on the Under 21 team this year and a brother of Adrians who joined the senior team last year. Alan McFadden is from the Cloughaneely club is 23 and makes the panel by virtue of fine displays for his club Cloughaneely at full forward. Daniel Gallagher is 22 and is from Division Three, Glenswilly and becomes their first ever senior panelist since their club reformed in the late 70's. He has represented the county at U-21 level and is a midfielder/centre forward. John Haran from St. Eunans is a towering midfielder standing at 6'3" and was midfield on the U-21 team this year and will no doubt be hoping to make a regular midfield berth which has been an area of concern this past year or so.

In the past few challenge matches Bonner has also been monitoring the progress of Adrian McClafferty and Eamon Reddan both members of last years County Minor team that won the Ulster title, and they both would be heralded with having the potential to make a senior spot their own sooner rather than later.

So all in all times and faces are definitely changing in Donegal and among the supporters there is a genuine hope that success would not be too far down the road, but patience is the key word as far as Declan Bonner and his men are concerned, and I feel that if the followers of the team see that genuine progress is being made steadily, and the new management team are given a chance to build a strong panel, then hopefully our return to the heady days of the late 80s and early 90s will not be too far away.

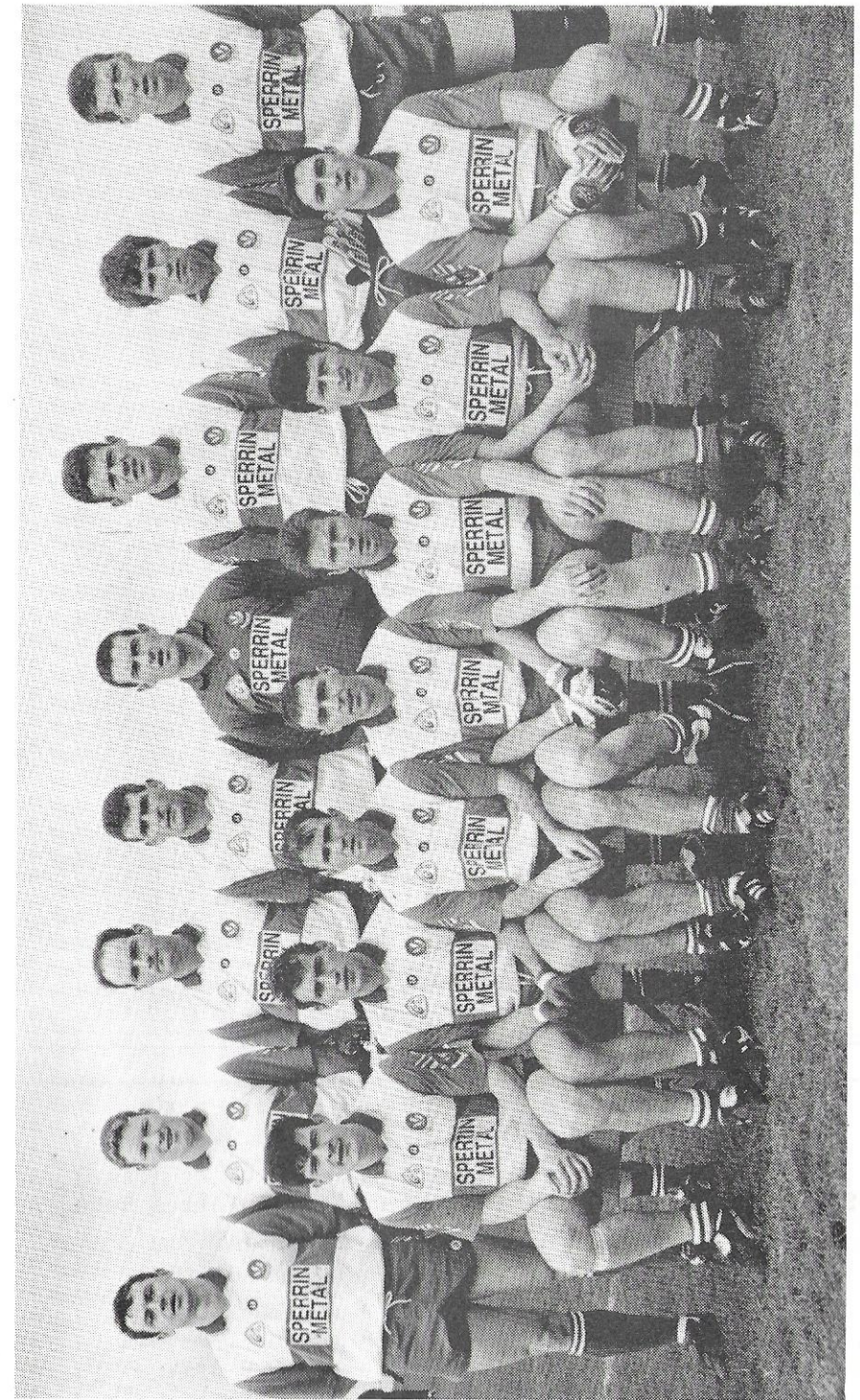

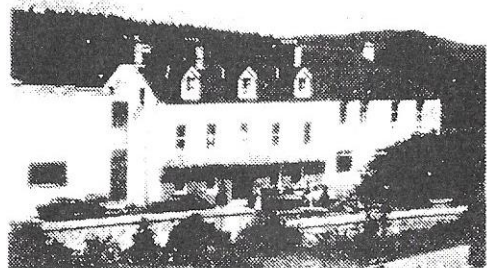

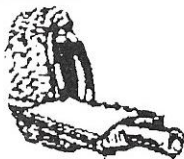
