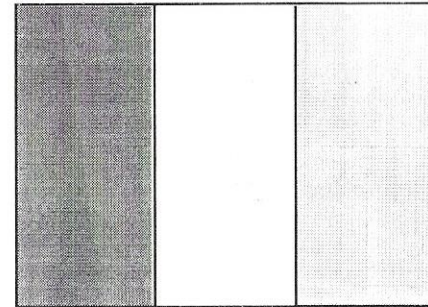
On behalf of C.L.G. Coiste Chondae Roscomáin I extend a warm welcome to the Australian and Irish U-17 teams.

Proceeds will go towards the South Roscommon Chernobyl Children's Committee who bring sick children from Belarus each year.



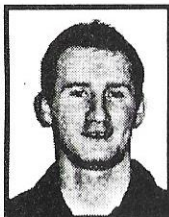

STADIUM TOURS OF CROKE PARK

On April 9, 2002 the staff of the GAA Museum in Croke Park will begin stadium tours of Croke Park. These will run throughout the year. The tours will take in all aspects of the stadium including dressing rooms, sideline, stands and premium and corporate levels. Special attention will be given to what happens 'behind the scenes' on match days. The tours will be scheduled to cater for school groups, adult groups as well as individuals. Charges for Museum and Stadium Tour: Adult 8.50 euro. Child 5.00 euro and Family 21.00 euro. To contact the Museum phone 01-855-8176, fax: 01-855-8104.

The tour will comprise a number of stops that will take in the key areas of the stadium. Much of it will comprise of 'behind the scenes' insights into match days. These will include the players entrance, one of the team dressing rooms, the media area and the tunnel up to the pitch. The tour will be brought to the sideline - although there will be strictly no encroachment onto the pitch - and will be told about the new pitch being laid at the moment.

The main stop on the tour will be the Cusack Stand. It will be here that the guide will give the history of the stadium. From it's time being known as simply Jones's Road, to it's purchase by the GAA in 1913 the history of each of the stands (including Hill 16) will be outlined as well as the famous figures associated with them. These will include Archbishop Croke, Michael Cusack, Michael Hogan and Pat Nally. Mention will be made of other events held in Croke Park like concerts, a rodeo and a Mohamed Ali fight.

Visitors will then be brought to the Premium Level at the Canal End via the Hall of Fame area to see the facilities to people who purchase these seats on a long-term basis. An insight into the vast catering operation that goes into match day at Croke Park will be given. However, groups will also be told about the many non-match day events such as conferences. They will then be brought to one of the corporate boxes. This will be one of the highlights of the tour as very few people normally get access to these boxes. Interestingly it is in the corporate boxes where many important GAA meetings in Croke Park are held on non-match day. When the Hogan Stand is completed it will form part of the tour.

The tour will last about an hour, so people should have their walking shoes on and have warm clothing - even on mild days as it can be very windy around the stadium.
