





onegal and Cavan have both received considerable boosts in advance of today's Ulster Minor Football Championship clash between the counties.

But it's possible that the Donegal 'bonus' might ultimately prove just that little bit more lucrative. That's because no fewer than twelve of today's team were in the Donegal side that scorched to the All Ireland Vocational Schools title against Kerry at St. Tiernach's Park, Clones last Sunday.

In contrast, four of the Cavan side were in the Moyne Community School team which has just collected the All Ireland 'B' Colleges crown. Moyne, of course, is just over the Cavan border with Longford but today the quartet - Patrick McKeever, Paddy Brady, Kieran Fitzpatrick and Dermot McGlade - will be very much committed to the Breifne cause.

And if the achievements of Moyne CS provide a source of encouragement for Cavan, the recent track record of their manager Tony Brady is also worthy of consideration.

Football is a way of life for this busy plumbing and heating contractor and he lent further proof of this by steering his club Castlerahan to the County Intermediate Championship title last year. Just for good measure, he also masterminded their All County League Division Three triumph.

And even if he has been denied the services of his Moyne contingent in the build-up to today's game, he has certainly made up for lost time of late given Cavan's intense preparations over the past fortnight.

Those preparations have been matched by the drive and commitment of their opponents, however, who are under the capable management of former Donegal senior ace Paddy Hegarty, now a full-time coach within the county.

And with twelve players from the Vocational Schools side, Paddy has a solid base from which to plan. Indeed, Donegal's Vocational Schools win over Kerry has, if anything, offered further impetus to the Minor side to produce the goods today.

Karl Lacey, who led the Vocational Schools to their All Ireland glory, Gary Kennedy and Marcus curran are key members of the Donegal Minor side. Yet the team did not cover themselves in glory in the recent Ulster Minor Championship, winning two and losing two of their games.

## GROUND REGULATIONS

- 3. The consumption of alcohol is not permitted within the ground and spectators are not permitted to bring alcohol into the stadium.
- 4. The unauthorised climbing of any structure, walls or buildings or seating in the ground is strictly forbidden.
- 5. Unnecessary noise such as that from the use of radio sets, gas-horns and behaviour likely to cause confusion or nuisance of any kind, including foul or abusive language, is not permitted in any part of the ground.

- 7. Unauthorised persons are not permitted to enter upon the field of play at any time before, during or after the games.
- 8. The Ground Management reserve the right to refuse admission or to eject any person who refuses to be searched were such a search is deemed necessary.

- 10. All persons entering or in the ground are reminded of their obligation to ensure that their behaviour does not present a danger from fire or other occurrence to anyone using the premises.
- 11. The Ground Management reserve the right for it's servants or agents to remove from the ground any person who does not comply with the Ground Regulations or whose presence in the ground could reasonably be construed as constituting a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to other spectators.

## Cavan and Donegal in the Championship

## FIRST MEETING - 1919

1919:- Cavan 3-11, Donegal 2-3

Cavan and Donegal first met in the Ulster Senior Football Championship when they clashed in the semi-final of the 1919 series at Bundoran on Sunday 6th July of that year. Conditions were excellent and a crow of 3,000 turned up at the sea-side venue. Under referee S. Dobbyn of Antrim, Cavan proved the superior side for most of the game. It was only Donegal's second ever appearance in the championship and their first from 1906. They had beaten Tyrone in the first round and so had created a great interest in the north-western county.

Socrers for Cavan were:- Cullen (1-2), Cahill (1-1), Murphy (0-3), Fay (0-2), Lynch (0-2), Masterson (1-0) and McGovern (0-1), while Donegal replied per McShea (1-2), Loughlin (1-0) and Doherty (0-1). The teams lined out as follows:-

#### LAST MEETING - 1998

1998:- Donegal 0-15, Cavan 0-13

The last meeting of the counties in the Championship was in 1998 when Donegal proved victorious by 0-15 to 0-13 at Clones on Sunday 21st June 1998. It was a particularly sweet victory for Donegal as they had to play for more than three-quarters of the game with fourteen men, having had a player sent off after only ten minutes. Donegal, who led by 0-8 to 0-5 at the interval, played some superb football and were simply unstoppable on the day.

## MIND GAMES

Sometimes far too much is read into the mind games that are part and parcel of the Bank of Ireland Ulster Senior Football Championship. And yet so much this afternoon will depend on how well Mattie Kerrigan's men have recovered from the mauling they suffered at the hands of Tyrone in the Allianz League decider only two weeks ago in Clones.

If the mental scars are still there then they will struggle like never before to lay the ghosts of that embarrassing and humiliating league final fiasco.

Mattie Kerrigan though has experienced both good and bad times in his chequered footballing career and if any man is capable of turning things around in the space of a fortnight, then it's the former Meath ace. His priority will have been convincing the players that they simply had an off day and that they didn't do themselves justice against Tyrone and that they owe their fans something after that best forgotten debacle in Clones. If the famed Breffni Blues get off to a good start here then the past will be quickly forgotten, but if not, then all their old past failings could return to haunt

them.

Donegal though have no such problems. Under the shrewd guidance of manager Mickey Moran they did well to finish third in a highly competitive Division One A of the Allianz League. They still tend to take far too much out of the ball, but look a much more rounded side than last season when they were desperately unlucky to lose to Kildare in the All Ireland qualifiers by a single point.

Prolific marksman Brendan Devenney can do no wrong these days and so much depends on how he performs against a Cavan defence that looks increasingly vulnerable with each passing match.

It's 10 years since the Sam Maguire last found a resting place in Donegal and even the county's most ardent fan would settle for a more modest achievement this time around.



## New Regulations on Blood Substitution

This year sees a further development in the blood substitution rule. Any player with blood on his body or jersey must leave the field of play. The injured player receives attention off the field and may only return when all visible blood is removed and a replacement jersey worn. The injured player may be temporarily substituted and the substitute should wear a distinctive armband in white or red depending on jersey colour. Blood

substitutions are not recorded as 'full substitutions' and will in future be announces over the PA a s-blood substitutes'.

Normal substitutions will take place from the half way line following checking in with the fourth official. The substitute may only enter the field of play when the player being replaced has come off. Five substitutions are allowed during the course of the game.

## Bhfuil fhios agat?


- Columba McDyer from Glenties in donegal won an All Ireland medal with Cavan in 1947. Columba played in the famous in the Polo Grounds, New York. He later played with Donegal but never broke the Cavan connection. As a mark of appreciation from the McDyer family to Cavan, a presentation will be made to Cavan GAA at half time.
- The first meeting of the Ulster Council took place in Armagh in 1903. Next year the Council will celebrate its centenary with a range of commemorative events across the nine counties.
- Brian McEniff was involved with every Donegal Ulster Championship winning team, either as player, manager or both. Donegal captured the Anglo-Celt Cup on five occasions in 1972, 1974, 1983, 1990 and 1992.
- Cavan have won 39 Ulster championships from 1891 to their most recent in 1997. Manager of the Breifne County on that occasion was Matin McHugh from Kilcar in Donegal.

- On Sunday, May 28th, 1992, Donegal faced Cavan in the first round Ulster Championship at Breifne Park. In an epic game which included points from 50 yard free kicks courtesy of martin McHugh and left footed volleys across the bar by Damian O'Reilly, the teams finished level. Donegal won the replay at Ballybofey and went on to win the "Sam Maguire".
  - Today's game will be carried live on TV on RTE, BBC and Setanta. the game will also be live on 4 nationwide radio broadcasters as well as many local radio stations. In excess of 25 print media journalists will cover today's game along with 10 photo journalists. In 1901 Bailieboro Home Rulers representing Cavan and Ballyshannon Red Hughs met in an Ulster semi-final at Beleek in Fermanagh. The Freemans Journal reported result only, the Irish News three lines and the Anglo-Celt, front page paragraph!
- Cavan junior football champions 2001, Drumgoon have qualified for the All-Ireland Junior Final. Drumgoon having lifted the Cavan crown proceeded to win the Ulster Final, defeated the Wicklow champions in the semi-final and await the final with Belmullet, Co. Mayo.

### GAA Activities a Century Ago (1902) in...

#### CAVAN

Fr. Dan Gallogly, in his excellent "Cavan's Football Story" (published in 1979), wrote: - "In 1902 Belturbet Red Stars and Rory O'Moore's gaelic team united as Belturbert United Gaelic and Soccer Club. At tournaments during 1901 and 1902 it was usual to have exhibition games in both gaelic and soccer. All this finished with the coming of the 'Ban Rule' and within a few years soccer had vanished from the scene. The most active parish in the county in 1902 was Ballintemple. It had three teams - Lacken Celtics, Bruskey Grattans and Legaweel Volunteers. Celtics did a great deal of sabre-rattling through the pages of the 'Anglo-Celt', throwing out challenges to teams to play them for the championship of Cayan".

Con Short, in his equally excellent "The Ulster GAA Story" (published in 1984), wrote:- "Between 1900 and 1902 several clubs in Cavan such as Cavan Slashers, Drumlane Sons of O'Connell, Mullahoran, etc., were re-organised and Cavan was able to field a team in the 1902 Ulster football championship".

There are no available records, however, of them having played any games in that particular series, one hundred years ago.

#### DONEGAL

Like a lot of other counties throughout Ireland in 1902, Donegal was still only recovering from the unfortunate "Parnell Split" which had created such havoc with existing GAA clubs all over Ireland, and it would be another year before there was any real activity on the GAA front in the county. These were only minor rumblings, however, and it would be 1905 before there was a proper Donegal GAA County Board formed.

This took place on Monday 23rd October 1905, when the officer board elected was:- Patron:- Most

Rev. Dr. O'Donnell, Bishop of Raphoe; President:- Very Rev. Dr. Maguire PP; Secretaries:- Alex McDyer and J. Dowds; Treasurers:- F. McFadden MP and Rev. C. Boyce.

Hurling, however, had never died the death that other games apparently suffered and it remained active as ever in the Burt area, where there had always been a very strong 'Camanacht' (hurling) tradition. Proper club championship would not commence until 1905 however.

The new railway line to Burtonport was nearing completion at the time (it would open in 1903) and probably aroused much greater interest than did GAA activities, especially among the people of north-west Donegal




