

# MacCumhaill Park Ballybofey Ground Regulations

- 1. All persons entering this ground are admitted only subject to the following Ground Regulations and to the Rules and Regulations of the Gaelic Athletic Association. Entry to the ground shall be deemed to constitute unqualified acceptance of all these Rules and Regulations.
- 2. Fireworks, smoke canisters, bottles, glasses, cans, flags, banners, poles, air horns and other similar articles or containers, including anything which could or might be used as a weapon, are not permitted within the ground, and any person in possession of such an article or container may be refused entry or ejected from the ground.
- The consumption of intoxicating liquor is permitted only in authorised places and spectators are not permitted to bring alcohol into the ground/arena.
- The unauthorised climbing of stands or other buildings in the ground is forbidden.
- 5. Unnecessary noise such as that from the use of radio sets, air horns and behaviour likely to cause confusion or nuisance of any kind, including foul or abusive language, is not permitted in any part of the ground.
- 6. Under no circumstances is it permitted to throw any object onto the pitch.
- 7. Unauthorised persons are not permitted to enter upon the field of play.
- 8. Any person who fails to comply with the instructions from a steward may be ejected from the ground.
- 9. In general, the right of admission is reserved to the Ground Management.
- The Ground Management reserve the right to refuse admission to or eject any person who refuses to be searched by a member of the Garda Siochána.
- 11. Any person who remains in a gangway may be ejected from the ground.
- 12. The Ground Management reserve the right for its servants or agents to remove from the ground/arena any person who does not comply with the Ground Regulations or whose presence in the ground could reasonably be construed as constituting a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to other spectators.
- 13. All persons in the grounds are reminded of their obligation under Section 18 (3) of the Fire Services Act 1981 to ensure that their behaviour does not present a danger from fire to any one using the premises
- 14. Patrons are not permitted to enter the field of play, before, during, or after the game.

### Dr. McKenna Cup Finals.....

### ...the Years that Mattered FOR DONEGAL

First Final Appearance:- 1927:- Monaghan 2-7, Donegal 2-3.

The 'McKenna Cup' was first competed for in 1927. It had been presented to the Ulster Council the previous year by Most Rev. Dr. Patrick McKenna, Bishop of Clogher. Although defeated, Donegal have the honour of contesting the first ever Dr. McKenna Cup Final, played at Clones on Sunday 8th May 1927. Eight counties contested the Tournament (Fernanagh being the exception), with Donegal and Monaghan qualifying for the Final. Donegal had caused a major upset when they defeated the Ulster champions Cavan in a replay of the second semi-final.

**Donegal team (in Final):-** W. O'Neill, M. McCarthy, M. Drumm, C. McDyer, D. Taylor, C. McDonnell, J. Harrison, J. Carey, M. O'Flaherty, H. McGlynn, J. Hanrahan, T. Gallagher, J. Byrne, W. Scanlon and W. Roarty; and their scorers were:- Scanlon (1-1), Carey (1-0), Roarty (0-1) and Byrne (0-1).

There was an unusual twist to this one when the new trophy was confiscated by the Customs at Monaghan station when on its way from Belfast to Clones, and it took some heated negotiations and a hurried transport to get the Cup to Clones for presentation at the end of the Final.

First Successful Final:- 1963:- Donegal 2-8, Cavan 0-5.

Donegal reached the Dr. McKenna Cup Final for the second time in their history in 1963 when they qualified to meet Cavan at Breifne Park in Cavan on Sunday 8th September. It was a daunting task taking on the reigning Ulster Champions in their own 'back-yard', but Donegal rose magnificently to the occasion and were thoroughly deserving and very convincing winners on a final score-line of -- Donegal 2-8, Cavan 0-5.

### **FOR TYRONE**

First Final Appearance:- 1940:- Cavan 3-5, Tyrone 1-4.

Tyrone had a very successful run in the Dr. McKenna Cup in 1940. In the opening round they defeated Armagh by 2-9 to 2-8 and then, in the semi-final, they had yet another one point victory over Monaghan – Tyrone 1-9, Monaghan 1-8. They now faced the then practically invincible Cavan in the Final at the Athletic Grounds in Armagh on Sunday 9th June 1940. Despite a fine performance, they still failed to lower the colours of their more fancied opponents.


### First Successful Final:- 1957:- Tyrone 3-12, Derry 1-10.

Having won their first Ulster title the previous year, Tyrone football was on the crest of a wave in 1957, and they had little difficulty in making a successful run through the Dr. McKenna Cup competition. Because of their American trip, the Final was delayed until September and they met Derry at Casement Park, Belfast, on Sunday 8th September 1957 in the Dr. McKenna Cup Final.



### Donegal's Record in Dr. McKenna Cup

Donegal have a very impressive record in the Dr. McKenna Cup competition. They have appeared in ten Cup Finals, winning six and losing only four. Their record in their Dr. McKenna Cup Final appearances is as follows:-

Successes:- 1963 (defeated Cavan), 1965 (Cavan), 1967 (Down), 1975 (Derry), 1985 (Cavan), and 1991 (Tyrone).

Defeats:- 1927 (lost to Monaghan), 1956 (to Cavan), 1977 (to Fermanagh), 1984 (to Tyrone).

### Tyrone's Record in Dr. McKenna Cup

Tyrone's record in the Dr. McKenna Cup competition is less impressive. Although they have appeared in more Finals (16), they have won on only on five occasions, losing the other eleven. Their record in Dr. McKenna Cup Final is as follows:-

Successes:- 1957 (defeated Derry), 1973 (Down), 1978 (Fermanagh), 1982 (Cavan), and 1984 (Donegal).

Defeats:- 1940 (lost to Cavan), 1941 (to Antrim), 1944 (to Down), 1953 (to Cavan), 1966 (to Antrim), 1969 (to Derry), 1990 (to Armagh), 1991 (to Donegal), 1997 (to Fermanagh), 2000 (to Cavan) and 2003 (to Monaghan).

# A Word on the Dr. McKenna Cup

The McKenna Cup is the second most important competition in Ulster inter county football and counties have always regarded it highly. A look at the roll of honour for the McKenna Cup indicates a close relationship between championship and McKenna Cup success, and no doubt Tyrone and Donegal would dearly love to hold the McKenna cup in the first year of our 2nd Century.

The Ulster GAA Council was founded in the Northern Hotel, Armagh on the 22nd March 1903. The provincial body grew in strength from that date onwards.

A great many cups and trophies are currently inthe province with Tyrone holding the NFL and All-Ireland cup, the McKenna cup will be proudly held by todays winners. The staging of the competition earlier in the year has proven successful and Comhairle Uladh are grateful to all counties and this year the Colleges St Mary's, Queens and Jordanstown for their commitment to the competition.

We look forward to a great year on the playing fields and a pleasant year of strolls down memory lane. May today begin the process well.
