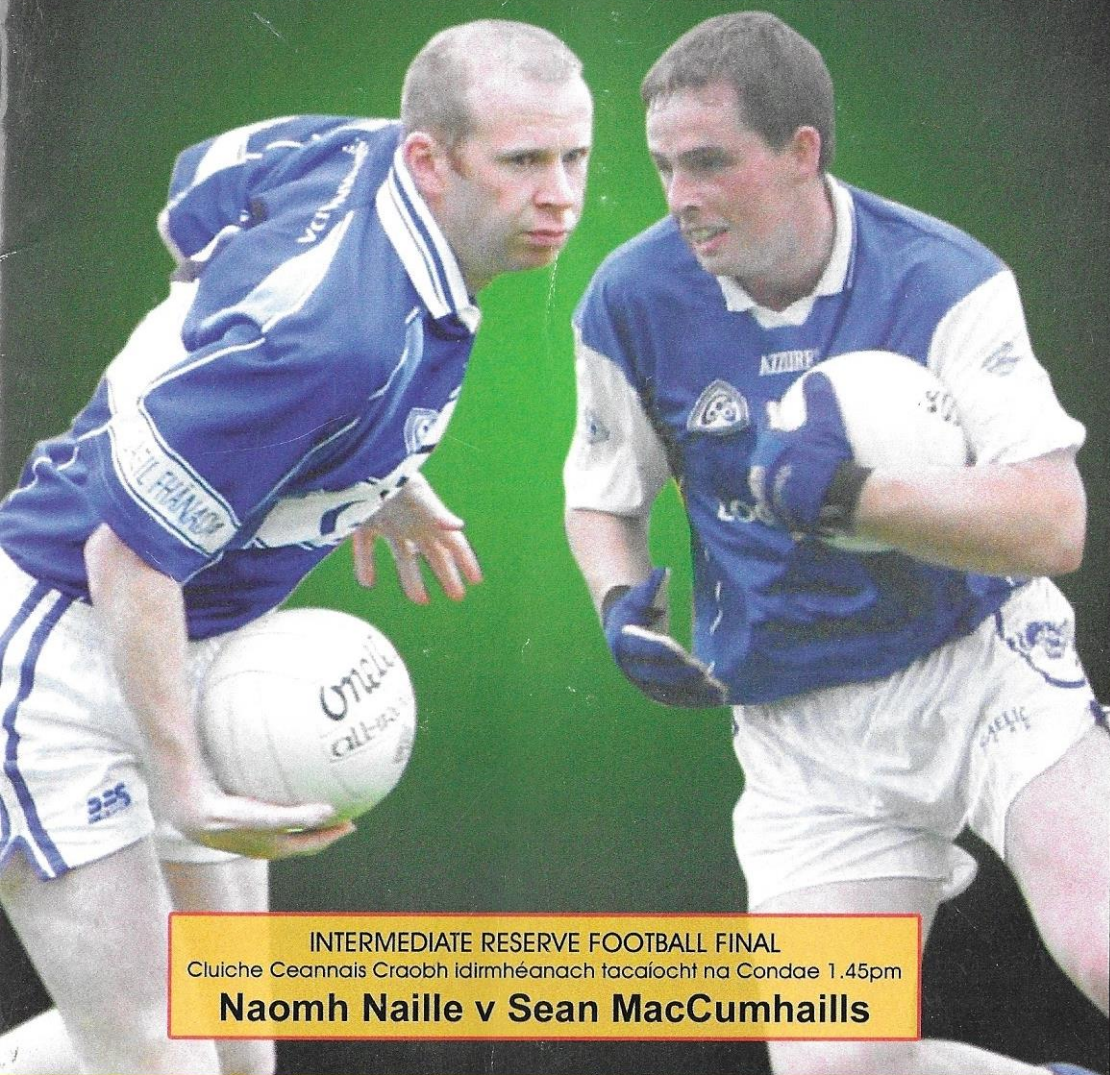

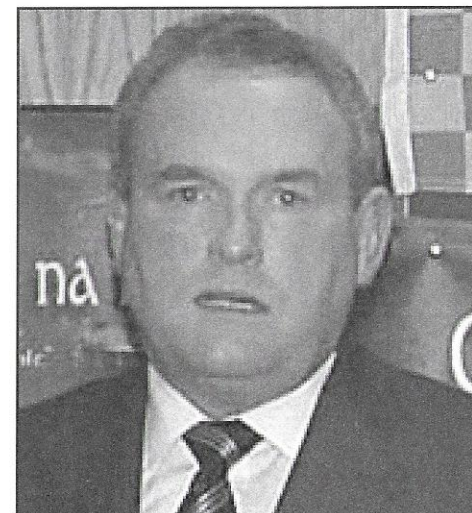

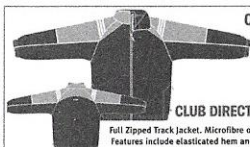
The Gaeil Fhánada support has been great this year, we need more of the same today and hopefully supporters will experience an enjoyable game of football.

A word from the Cloughaneely manager

Having taken over Cloich Cheann Fhaola Senior team at the beginning of the year and completed pre-season training, we played our first competitive game in the senior Gaeltacht against Gaoth Dobhair and lost by four points. Shortly afterwards the league campaign began with an away win at Carndonagh. We suffered our only defeat at home to Fanad by a solitary point in May.

At the beginning of the championship, we were drawn against Burt. We drew with the same side earlier in the year but after two closely controlled games, we progressed into the next round.

McGettigan's Falcarragh links

Six seasons after taking charge of the Fanad Gaels senior squad Bernard McGettigan faces the biggest test of his managerial career in today's Donegal Healthwise Pharmacies Intermediate Championship Final against Cloughaneely at O'Donnell Park. The two sides are joint top of Division 2 but McGettigan still insists that the Falcarragh outfit are favourites to claim this title. Born in the then soccer stronghold of Milford Town his first taste of GAA was as a boarder at Holy Cross College, Falcarragh. Charlie Gallagher, (father of John Paul, a member of the current Cloughaneely team), was teaching at the school and was a big promoter of Gaelic games.

The well known Donegal GAA historian Fr Sean Gallagher was also on the staff at the College and among the players from there who went onto represent their county were Michael Carr of Kilcar and the Naomh Columba Carrs, Seamus and Padraig. Nearer home there were the Coll brothers from Falcarragh, Charlie and Antoin (RIP) and from Fanad the school had Sean McAteer, father of current Gaels players, William and Shane along with arguably the peninsula's most famous sporting son, Fr Michael Sweeney.

Bernard's interest in the native game continued at the Marion teacher training college in Dublin where the students included the recently retired Cork hurling manager John Allen and the present national hurling coaching coordinator Paudie Butler.

After a year in Dublin, the newly qualified teacher returned to take up a post in Rathmullan where among his pupils, was current inter-county referee, Robbie O'Donnell. It was when McGettigan was appointed Principal in Cranford that he took a hands on approach in organising Cumann na Bunscoil games at the national school. For the first time, he saw some of the players he manages in today's decider. Six years ago he was asked by the Fanad Gaels executive committee to take charge of the club's senior side. At that time, he was assisted by Garrett Horkan and later by Hughie Shiels. This season, a complete new backroom staff has been brought on board including Joe Higgins, Richard Carr, John McConigley and James Martin while the physiotherapist is Tommy Gallagher.

Already this season, Fanad have reached the All-Ireland Junior Gaeltacht final in Spiddal but winning today in O'Donnell Park would be an historic achievement for the manager and the club who play out of Shiels Park in Portsalon named after the late Miah Shiels, a founding member of the Gaels. In addition to taking charge of the senior squad McGettigan also finds time to look after the club's U-8 panel.

Now a learning support teacher in Tamney just down the road from his home in Kerrykeel, Bernard will be hoping that his players can produce their best form of the season to capture Fanad Gaels first ever Donegal Intermediate Championship title.

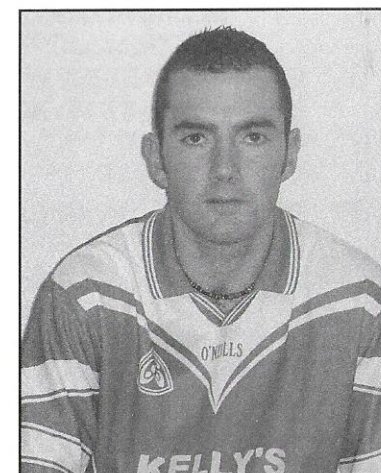

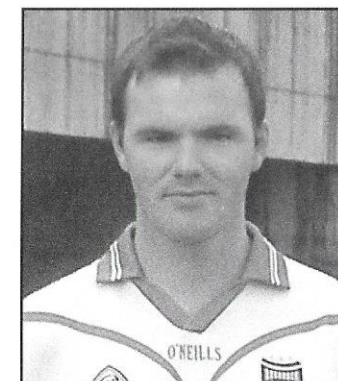

on from the side to be replaced by some of the club's promising minor stars.

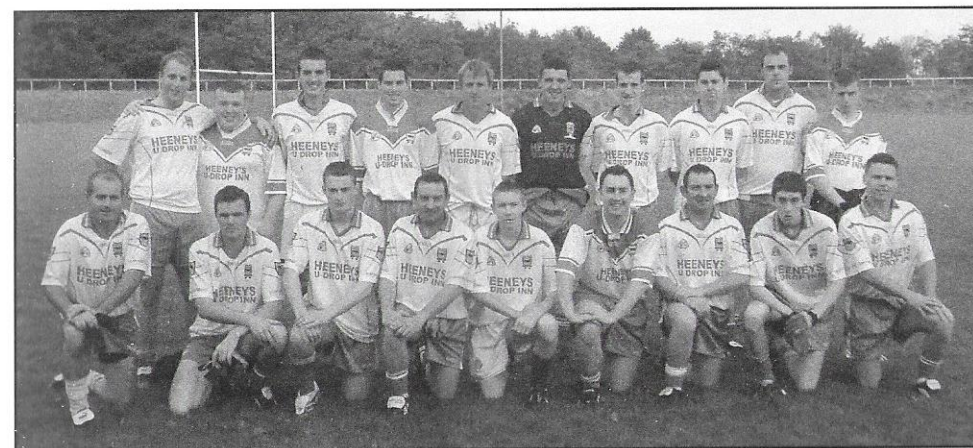

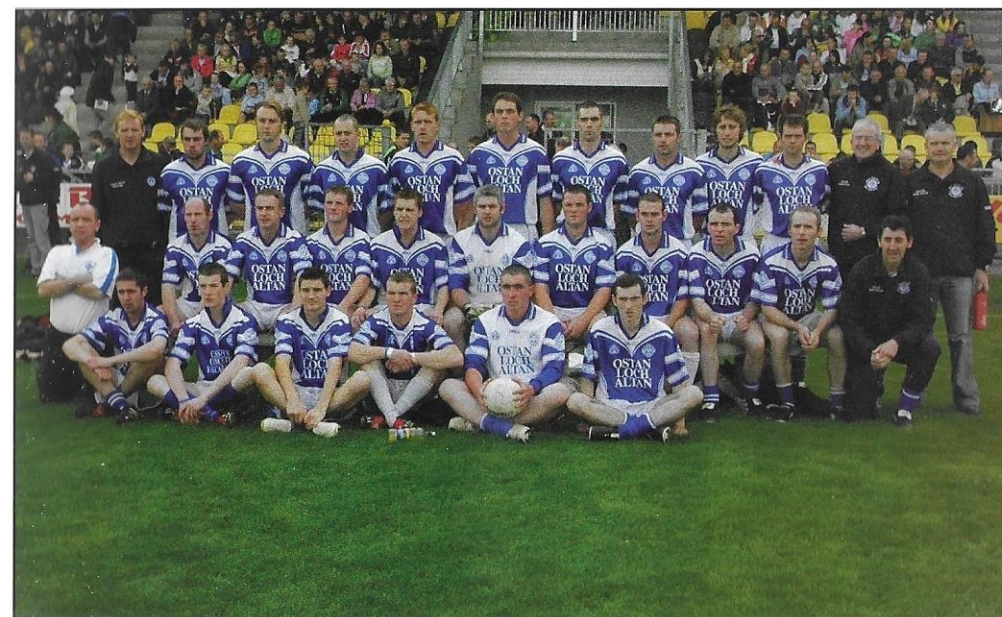
