




Fáilte an Chathaoirligh



Senior Final

Jimmy White (Killybegs)

A vastly experienced referee who takes charge of his fourth senior county final this year. His previous senior finals were in 1999, 2003 and the replay of 2005. Two of those matches incidentally involved one half of today's final, St Eunans. Jimmy's profile extends beyond Co Donegal. At provincial level, he has refereed Ulster minor league and championship finals in 2000, the Ulster u-21 final of 2001 and the Ulster club final in 2003.



He has been taking charge of National League appointments since 2002 and


his progress has been marked by taking charge of games in recent Connacht and Leinster championship campaigns.

The Killybegs' native has an enviable record at club level where he has been involved in seven county finals as a player and a player/manager between 1988 and 1996 when Killybegs were the force to be reckoned with in Donegal club football. Jimmy was on the winning side in five of those seven campaigns. Indeed he still lines out for his club on occasion, but only by his own admission, when they're stuck!

Senior Reserve Final

Paddy Mc Bride (Na Dúnaibh)

Today's senior reserve final referee is a familiar face, Paddy McBride from the Downings club. Paddy played for the club for 23 years and won 3 All-Ireland Gaeltacht medals, three intermediate championships and one junior championship medal during that time. Apart from being active in refereeing circles he is also the current club chairman having spent ten years as



secretary and four years as PRO. He began refereeing in 1999 when his

playing days came to an end and progressed up through the ranks. Paddy was added to the Ulster panel in 2002 and took charge of a Tyrone/Fermanagh minor championship game in Clones in 2004. Closer to home in Donegal, he has refereed finals at u-16, minor, u-21 and intermediate level as well as three senior Gaeltacht finals. "It is a great honour for my family, my club and myself to be selected to referees today's reserve final and I intend to enjoy the occasion," said Paddy.





A word from the St. Eunan's manager



When East met West in parish battle

A brief History of Gaoth Dobhair GAA club

The first records of Gaelic football being played in the parish of Gaoth Dobhair dateback to 1918. Towards the end of the 19th century and up until 1915 Gaoth Dobhair had a strong soccer team and this was the main pastime. This was mainly due to the strong Scottish connection due to seasonal migration and of course the birth of Glasgow Celtic in 1888.

With the outbreak of WW1 soccer ceased to be played to any great degree. IT was in the late twenties 1927/28 that Gaelic football re-emerged in Gaoth Dobhair. At that time there was no official club but there were two teams in the parish.

East and West

One team consisted of players from the east of Derrybeg church towards Cnoc Fola and the second team was from the area west of the church. Matches were played every Sunday alternating between Machaire Gathláin and An Rannaigh to the East. According to folklore these games were played with few rules, in reality only those who had gone to teacher training colleges had any knowledge of GAA rules.

The appointed referee blew when he thought there was an infringement, often without any real knowledge of the rules of the game!. Some players togged out, others simply rolled up their trousers, even football boots were scarce, may players playing with one boot only.

These games attracted huge crowds, at one such match in 1928 played at An Rannaigh an official gate of £12 was collected - and

that was gained by passing round a cap.

Cuman Lúthchleas Gael Ghaoth Dobhair was founded in 1931 but it was more by chance than by design.

In November of that year a drama group from Mullaghduff produced a play in the parish of Gaoth Dobhair. The following night a group of people got together in Owenie Eoin Ruaidh's (Gillespies) shop. Amongst them were Owenie Chonaill (Mc Bride) and Owenie Eoin Ruaidh (Gillespie).

Owenie Chonaill put it to the group that he could gather up a crowd in Gaoth Dobhair that would give a better drama performance than the Mullaghduff group had given. William Coyle who was in the company agreed and the plans were laid to establish a drama group. Another man present Charlie Owenie suggested that if they were starting a drama group that they might as well start a Gaelic football team too. Jim Size suggested that there was no time like the present and that was the night that CLG Ghaoth Dobhair was formed.

Officers Elected

Dan Maloney was named as Chairman, other members were Mickey the Cope Gallagher, Dominic Johnnie, Joe Friel, Charlie Friel and Antoin Delap. A deal was struck with Mairead Frank and it was agreed that her house be used for Committee meetings from then on.

A team was formed in the late 1931, early 1932, but according to the players of that era even though they were playing senior football they were really only a good junior team. The first


County title to come into the parish of Gaoth Dobhair was a Minor title in 1933. Incidentally, their opponents on that day were Ballyshannon, Gaoth Dobhair winning 1-04 to 0-02.

The following year they retained the title, this time against Letterkenny winning 3-10 to 1-04.

The following year Gaoth Dobhair made the big breakthrough winning their first senior title, defeating Bun Dobhráin 1-08 / 0-03.

Nearly half the minor team of '33 and '34 played senior in 1935. Amongst them were Danny Neddy (Gillespie), Hughie Dunlop, John Chit, Owenie Phádaí pheadair, Paddy Coll, Jimmy Phádaí Bhig. Three members of the first winning team are still with us (2003). Jimí Ó Baoill, Machaire Chlochair, Nial Mac Aoidh, Min Doire and Fanaid and Con McLaughlin (who was teaching in the parish at the time).

At that time many of the players had to work seasonally in Scotland but they were always eager for news of their team. Sometimes they got to hear the results on Radio Éireann late on Sunday nights. Mostly they had to wait for a full report on the progress of Gaoth Dobhair in the Derry people when it arrived midweek.



Ardara end 53 year wait in 1981

They had hoped to be in MacCumhaill Park today in bigger numbers from Ardara but Gaoth Dobhair interrupted those plans two weeks ago at both senior and reserve level.

There is, however, an Ardara involvement with the champions of twenty five years ago being present to receive their due recognition. Twenty five years ago Anthony Molloy was a sub. on final day - about to break through at intercounty level with some distinction. The green and gold had lost the 1980 final to a Michael Carr and Martin McHugh inspired Kilcar, but they were to avenge that defeat in a bruising semi-final tie (1-5 to 0-6) and they then went on to lift the Dr. Maguire Cup for the first time since 1928 when they defeated Four Masters in the final - 1-7 to 0-6. According to Fr. Sean O Gallchoir's book "it was no wonder they went berserk with joy on that wonderful day in 1981. No wonder men cried, women screamed, fires burned. A long, long wait since 1928. Da fhaideacht an oiche ... " As reported in the Democrat the following week under the heading "Non stop celebrations in Ardara" - there was a long night of celebrations with a cavalcade of several miles and back in Ardara club chairman, Bart Whelan was master of ceremonies. Tributes were paid to team captain, Seamus Gallagher; coach Anthony Molloy and manager, Charlie Mooney. They had won Divisional championships a plenty. Three times in the twenties; four times in thirties; five times in forties; four times in fifties. An Eamon McNelis goal was the difference between the sides on final day. They had good displays man of the match, Connie Molloy; Kieran Keeney and captain, Seamus Gallagher, who was beaten by his own neighbours a year earlier What was remarkable looking back over the pages of the Donegal Democrat to review the final was

that it took place on the first Sunday in September. Imagine that occurring in 2006. Donegal were obviously knocked out of the Ulster Championship in the first round. Ardara had overcome Gaoth Dobhair in the first round, winning both legs

(0-9 to 1-3 and 2-4 to 0-7); Naomh Columba in the quarter-final with two Seamus Gallagher goals (2-7 to 0-7) and then the revenge over Kilcar in the semi-final.

In the final Ardara could be regarded as being lucky as Four Masters totally dominated the first half but could not find the posts in MacCumhaill Park. At half-time Ardara actually led by 1-3 to 0-2 even though they only half a dozen of decent attacks. Scorers on county final day in 1981 were - Ardara: Connie Molloy 0-4; Eamon McNelis 1-0; Gerard McNelis 0-2 and Lanty Molloy 0-1. Four Masters: P. J. Dooley 0-3; Marty Kelly 0-2 and Joyce McMullan 0-1.

The four minor stars: Mark McGowan, Paul Thornton, Dualtach Molloy and Ross Wherrity all had a major part to play in Eunan's super comeback.


"The four of them got a lot of experience playing with the Donegal minors this year and they are four fine footballers,"

Gweedore who are bidding to get the day off to a winning start, are currently sitting mid-table in the Division 1A reserve table, and out of the reckoning for league honours. And, it is even worse for opponents Naomh Conall, who are one league below and anchored firmly to the foot of the Division 1B reserve league. But they are the last two standing and after their giant killing acts, in the semi final, Gweedore brushing aside a fancied Ardara, and Naomh Conall, if not quiet as convincing, ended the hopes of an equally fancied Glenfin. And there can be no great argument about it, while they both may have lived dangerously in their respective campaigns; they have earned the right to lock horns for the honour of being senior reserve champions. While Boyle, and Duffy along with Sean 'Nancy' Gallagher, are the experienced men in the Gweedore line -up, manager McGee has by and large gone for youth this season. And while it may not have worked in the league it most definitely has in the championship, and there are quiet a few of this team expected to make the step up to the first team in the not too distant future.

Already, Fionann and Ronan Diver, Garry Whoriskey, have Cornelius Gallagher, Brian McGee and Padraig McGarvey looking over their shoulders and along with Christopher Sweeney and Sean Nancy

Gallagher are members of Declan Bonner's senior squad. And regardless of the outcome, it will be a quick rush to the dressing and change for the senior decider. A year ago Naomh Conall's seniors were centre stage, but St. Michael's dashed the hope of a return for Paddy Campbell and company. But while the reserve final is of little consolation, it does provide crumbs of comfort for a season that does not have the prospect of an over laden trophy cabinet.

Like Gweedore, not all have the played all their best football in the championship Naomh Conall have improved with every outing and their tough road stood to them against Glenfin last time out. It took four games to separate Sean Connaughton side and Killybegs in the opening round. Their tie going to a second playoff after the first ended all square. And they had just a point to spare in their quarter final clash with Glenswilly, in Glenswilly. They may have made home advantage pay in their semi final victory, and while they were clinging on at the finish they played some scintillating football in the first half. And it is to these men along with Michael O'Malley, and J.D. 
