



AN EXTRA DIMENSION OF INTRIGUE!!

TYRONE and Derry share one aim as they embark on today's decider - and it's not just to win the coveted Ulster Under 21 championship title.

Both teams feel they have underperformed in the competition to date and what better stage on which to produce your best possible form than ina decider.

That's why there is an extra dimension of intrigue surrounding the contest and of course there is the not inconsiderable incentive of acquiring bragging rights in advance of the forthcoming Ulster senior football championship meeting between the counties.

While Tyrone stuggled to see off the challenge of a vibrant Antrim side in their semifinal, Derry survived by the skin of their teeth in the other 'semi' against Armagh, a goal deep into extra-time by Barry McGoldrick proving their passport into today's decider.

No wonder then that the Tyrone management duo of Martin Coyle and Liam Donnelly join with Derry boss Paddy Crozier in striving to elicit the best from their players on this occasion.

Both teams are littered with talented players with Raymond Mulgrew, P J Quinn, Stephen McNulty and Brendan Boggs to the fore for the Red Hands while the Oak Leaf side contains a flavour of the senior panel represented by players like Mark Lynch, Joe O'Kane and Collie Devlin.

It is perhaps a measure of the increased intensity at Under 21 level overall that both sides have had to chart difficult courses into today's decider.

Tyrone of course have been a major force at this level for several years although their dominance was arrested when Armagh not only lifted the Ulster crown in 2004 but went on to win the All Ireland title for the first time.

Antrim's defiant display against Tyrone in their recent semi-final and the fact that Armagh had already accounted for Cavan and Down before they were ambushed by Derry underlines the fact that the gap has been closed.

Indeed, the Under 21 sector has helped to spawn a rich vein of talent over the years with players like Ger O'Kane (Derry), Aaron Kernan and Ciaran McKeever (Armagh) and Tyrone's Raymond Mulgrew having graduated to the top bracket.

And the winners of today's game will go into the All Ireland semi-final knowing that a new name will go on the national trophy this year. The defeat of reigning champions Galway by Mayo last week-end has opened the door for new champions to be crowned and will certainly offer an added incentive to those sides with aspirations of ruling the roost.

Despite their recent indifferent form, Derry and Tyrone will feel that they belong in this category.

And wouldn't it prove an interesting contest if Mickey Moran's Mayo side were to confront his native Derry along the way.

But then Tyrone will have somethingt o say about that - and will do their talking on the field today.






