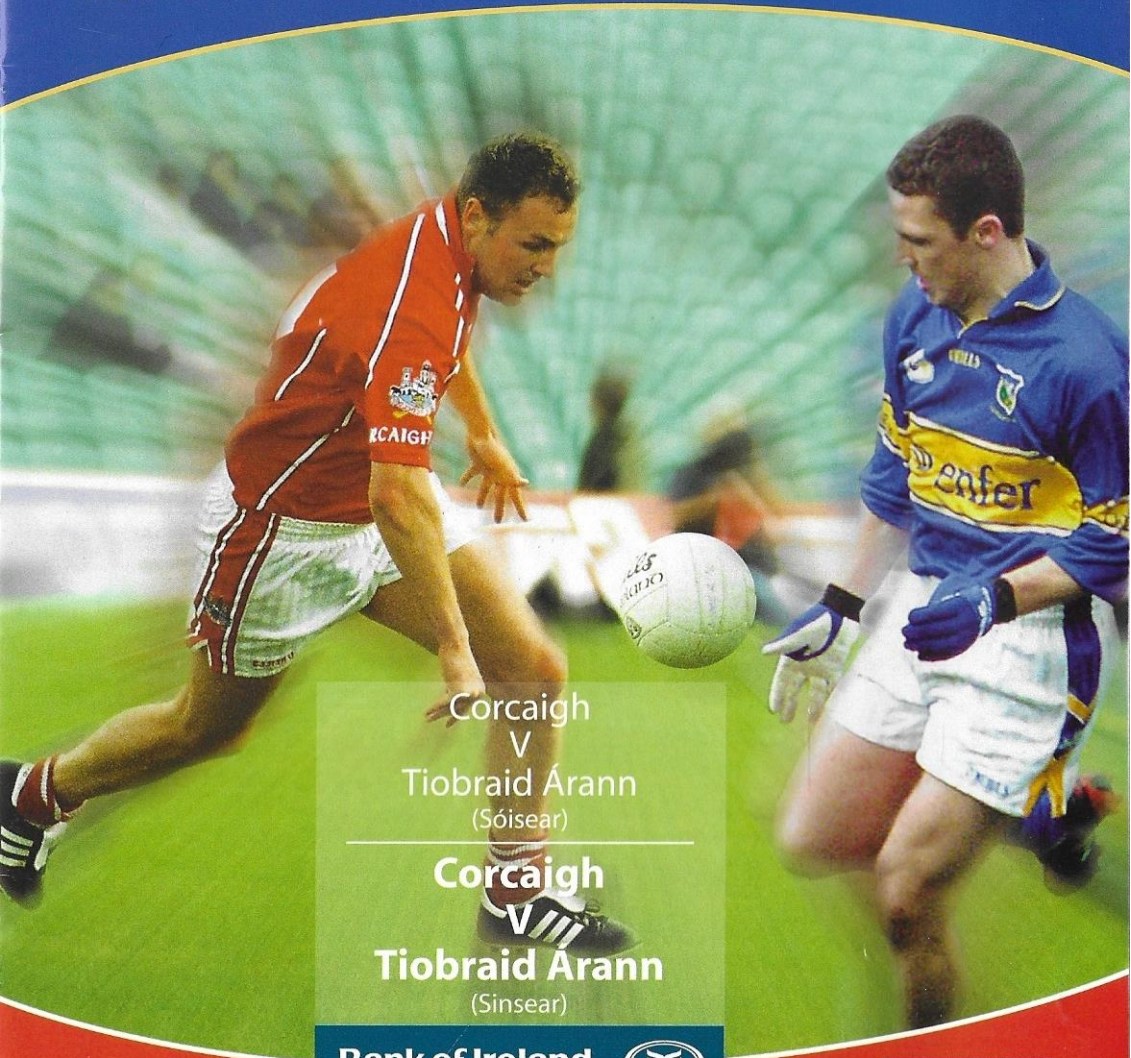

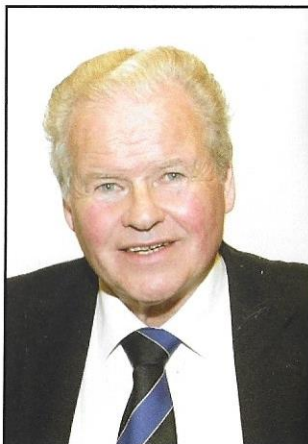
FÁILTIÚ AN CHATHAOIRLIGH

This week the spotlight in Munster turns to the Football semi-finals. Unfortunately for the Football followers in the Province, the code does not arouse the same depth of passion and interest as Hurling.

In today's semi-finals we have Tiobraid Árann challenging the might of reigning Munster Champions, Corcaigh. Earlier this afternoon at Fraher Field, Dungarvan my own native county have hosted the All-Ireland Champions, Ciarraí in the other semi-final.

Since their victory over Clare two weeks ago the Waterford team has the opportunity of hosting a return game at home against Kerry in a home and away arrangement that should surely bring out great local support for the team even though the semi-final is live on television. Memories of an historic victory over Kerry exactly a half century ago on June 2nd 1957 at Walsh Park have been revived in the Déise in the past fortnight.



It is not that long ago since Tipperary and Cork met in the 2002 Munster Senior Football Final at Semple Stadium. Cork travelled as hot favourites while only the most ardent of Tipperary supporters thought an upset was possible. This was a cracking match, one which Tipperary could and should have won and yet it was Tipp who needed the late late equaliser in one of the most exciting games of the year when it seemed as if Tipperary were set for their first title since 1935.

In last year's championship Tiobraid Árann and Port Láirge put up a good challenge against Ciarraí and even though they ultimately went on to capture the Sam Maguire Cup it was acknowledged that their winning margins against the so called underdogs of Munster Football was less than their winning margin in the All-Ireland Final.

I welcome the teams, their officials and supporters and our referees, Eugene Murtagh in the senior game, Maurice Condon in the Junior game and their officials. There is no reason why today's Munster Football Championship semi-final between Cork and Tipp cannot invoke the same level of interest as its sister code.

Update on recent events in Cork Coaching and Games

VHI CÚL CAMPS

GAA Cul Camps are back once again in 2007. Following on from last years highly successful camps in Cork where over 6000 children attended the 71 camps throughout the county. Each child attending will receive a jersey shorts and socks as well as a bag and water bottle. Also parents will be safe in the knowledge that their children will be developing the skills of football and hurling under the supervision of qualified and experienced coaches. Most clubs are already advertising their camps locally and as capacity is limited it is advisable to book your place immediately. COISTE OILIUNA WORKSHOPS

Coiste Oiliuna Chorcaí held a number of workshops over the winter months which proved very successful. Lyster Ryan (ex Kilkenny hurler) opened proceedings with Hurling Wall Ball drills and games. The concept is very simple and would be useful to clubs who have a wall available to hurl on. He also demonstrated the rules to leagues that can be run by clubs internally for their players which if adopted could improve the skills greatly.

Next up was Jerry Wallace (Cork senior hurling trainer). He gave a talk on designing training programmes and on injury prevention and also diet and nutrition. He also gave a practical demonstration of how to conduct a dynamic warm up and how to develop speed, agility and quickness in players. Over 80 coaches attended this session and it was well received by all involved. Bosco Creed from Fermoy gave club officials an insight into how to attract volunteers into club coaching in March and again, for those who attended, it proved a very informative event.

Over the next number of weeks Coiste Oiliuna intend to run a coaching practical in both codes for coaches of under 12 and under 10 players in each division. The precise details will be made available through the divisional juvenile board meetings so ensure your delegate keeps you informed of upcoming courses.

FOUNDATION AND LEVEL 1 COACHING COURSES

At a recent meeting of Coiste Oiliuna it was decided that Foundation and Level 1 Courses have to be officially sanctioned by Coiste Oiliuna before commencement. A written application outlining provisional dates and numbers attending must be made to Coiste Oiliuna, Pairc Ui Rinn, Boreenmanna Road, Cork. Any courses set up by clubs directly with tutors will not be sanctioned and therefore no certificates will be issued in such cases.

Clubs or divisions should make their written submission as early as possible to facilitate the organisation of a tutor.

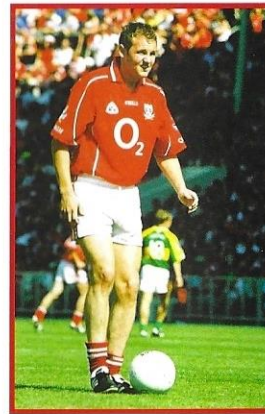

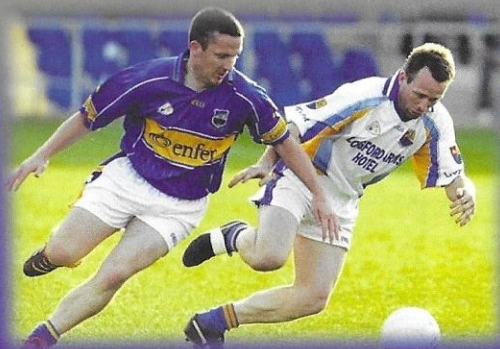
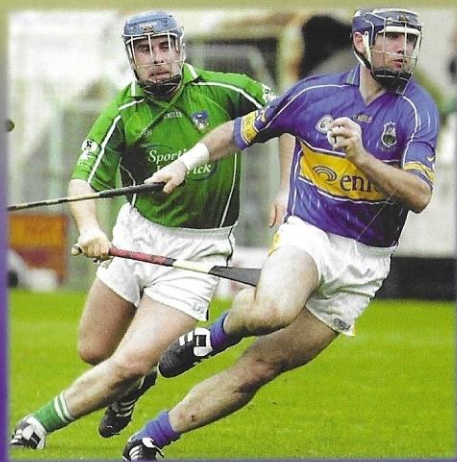

THE PRIMARY GO GAMES

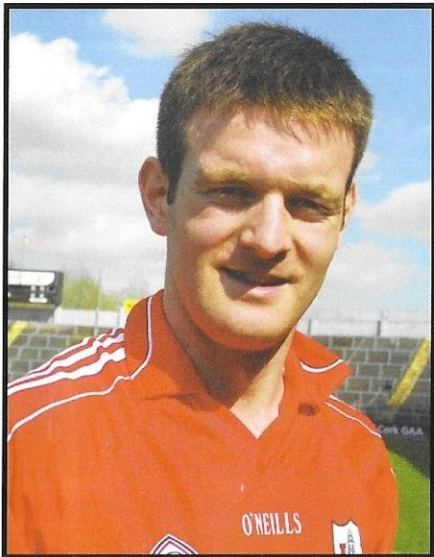
Today at half time in the senior game, with the help of the children from National School in Cumann na mBunscoil in Tipperary and Cork, we will give an exhibition of a new initiative devised by The National Coaching & Games Development Committee under the guidance of Pat Daly, Head of Games in Croke Park, called The Primary Go Games. "The Primary Game" remains as part of the Munster Council's Senior Championship Match Day programme but it has been altered to the Go Games format to reflect National Policy. The games we will be playing today will be two 10 a-side games (one boys and one girls) with normal rules.

Each county will have 22 children. This includes two linesmen. Blitzes using the Go Game format have been organised in the national schools and also in the clubs. The term Go Games has its origins in children's sport. Keen observers will recognise that when children play games amongst themselves, everyone will get a 'Go' and will do so for the entire "Game". Hence the term Go Games is used in Gaelic Games to identify small-sided hurling and football games called Go Hurling and Go Gaelic respectively. Go Hurling and Go Gaelic games can be defined as small-sided skill development games - individually known as First Touch (U8), Quick Touch (U10) and Smart Touch (U12) - where the playing rules and equipment are modified to ensure that participants develop the basic skills of the game and derive maximum fun and enjoyment while doing so.

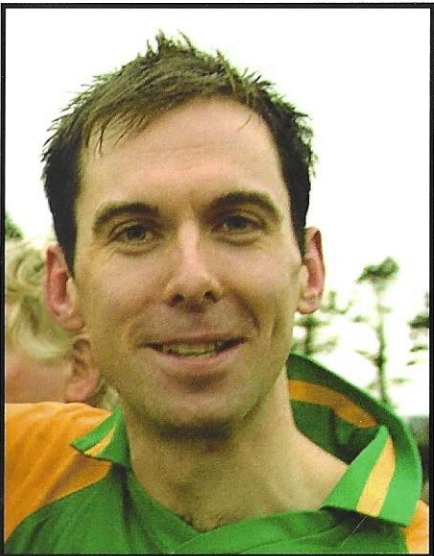
The games are the first - and most important stepping-stone in the Pathway to Elite Performance. 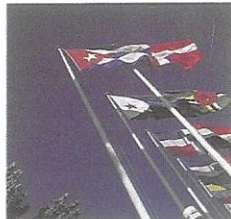

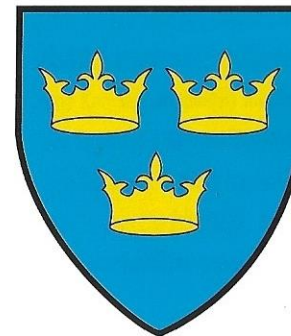
