MacCumhaill Park

Ground Development

MacCumhaill Park from Humble Beginnings In 1944, Ben Griffin and Sean MacCumhaill made an offer to Mark Byrne to purchase a field, which was within the town boundary of Ballybofey.

Unfortunately, at the time, the owner was unwilling to sell. In 1946, as part of the 'Civic Week' celebrations in the Twin Towns a friendly match, between Sligo and Donegal, was held in Mark Byrne's field. As this proved to be a great success, a Park Committee was formed and the field was finally secured for the GAA. On Sunday 1st May 1949, Sean MacCumhaill died suddenly. Soon after that it was decided that the new Park would be known as Sean MacCumhaill Park.

On Sunday, 22nd April 1956, the well equipped MacCumhaill Park was officially opened by the President of the G.A.A., Seamus MacFearain. A plaque was unveiled at the main gate in memory of the late Sean MacCumhaill.

Today, as we stand and look around, we see one of the most modern and progressive stadiums in the country. The stadium we see bears no resemblance to the field bought over 60 years ago. As part of the Ulster Council GAA's modernisation

programme a state of the art floodlighting system to television standards was installed and completed, financed by the Ulster Council and Central Council at a cost of over €1,000,000. We look forward to the official "switching on" of the lights in the very near future and in 2008 Dr McKenna Cup Matches and National League Home Games will light up Stranorlar for the Donegal team.

It is fitting that at the time of completion of the floodlighting project that we have Tom Daly, a Donegal native as Uachtaran of Comhairle Uladh CLG, who commented:

"The gaels of Donegal should be very proud of what has been achieved at MacCumhaill Park in recent years.

Under the direction of our Operations Manager Stephen McGeehan and key personnel in the County and Club the Floodlighting Project in particular has transformed the venue and ensured that the our County teams in all codes can enjoy playing in a modern floodlit stadium for years to come. Our Council will be working with the officers of the Donegal County Board later in the year to agree of a suitably appropriate fixture to officially switch on the lights for the first time"

Plans have been put in place to further upgrade the entire stadium, over the next five years.

None of this developmental work would have been possible without the financial support given to the Board by Ulster Council, Croke Park, and Sports Capital Grants.
C.L.G Dhún na nGall would like to express it's gratitude to all who helped the Board and Clubs, within the County, achieve total funding of 1,128,000 in the recent Sports Capital Programme Grants announced by the Minister for Sport, John O'Donoghue T.D.

These grants will help both the County Board and Clubs maintain and improve facilities for members of Cumann Lutchleas Gael in the County.









Development Squads

Development Squads have been up and running for a number of years in the 9 Counties in the Province. Most counties have squads from U-14 to U-17 in both Football and Hurling which lead into the County Minor Squads.

The reason for Development Squads is to improve players' knowledge in different areas. These include Strength & Conditioning, Nutrition, Hydration, Fitness, Speed & Flexibility and of course Specialised Coaching to improve the players' skill level and decision making on the field of play.


There has been discussion to the value of Development Squads, and my own feelings are, that a few counties have the structures perfected while the other few can learn from them and improve likewise.

Good structured coaching will most definitely improve players at whatever level they are capable of, so in doing so it improves the standard of Hurling and Football in our Schools, Clubs and Counties. Development Squads over the last few years have produced numerous players who have went on to represent their Counties at Minor and Senior level. Players to evolve

through the development Squad structure onto county senior level include Ray Cullivan, Charlie Vernon, Peter Donnelly, Nicholas Walsh, Sean Johnstone, Mark Mc Keever, Andy Mc Lean, Ronan Flanagan and Kevin Dyas (pictured below) in football and Kieran Courtney, Owen Mc Guinness, Brendan Mc Gourty, Sam Dodds, Darryl McDermott, Oisin McCloskey, Neil McManus, Neil McAuley, Paul Shields, Barry McFall and Aaron Graffin in hurling.

There are also a number of players who have represented Ulster and Irelar in the Junior International Rules Series and the Shinty Series (Hurling).

I believe that all Counties should have a Start and Finis Date planned each year, so they are not overlapping with school games. I would like to stress that in no County that I know of, are the doors ever closed at Development Squad level for a player who might be a late developer.

Minor Football Preview

The two most recent winners of the Ulster Minor Championship go head-tohead today for the right to meet Tyrone in the semifinal. Players from the St Patrick's, Armagh team which reached the semi-final of the MacRory Cup will provide the backbone to the county side which takes on Donegal in today's curtain-raiser.

Both counties will be hopeful rather than confident of their prospects in the competition. The recent Ulster Minor League gave them grounds for optimism while at the same time highlighting some of the improvements which were needed.

Armagh lost fairly heavily to Down in the semi-final of the Ulster League. In that game the likes of Jamie Clarke and Cathal McVerry scored well, while Patrick McCullough and Seamus McCreesh could also be important players for them. "So far we have had ups and downs in our preparations. We have been hampered by the fact that some of the teams we were supposed to play in the league did not travel to play us," according to Armagh manager Paul Kelly. The past few years have seen Armagh really make their mark on the youth scene. Provincial and All-Ireland titles in both the Minor and U-21

grades have complimented the success of their seniors. But it seems that this year's side is not being rated just as highly. Of course, only time will tell if this is the case and one thing for certain is that Donegal won't be taking anything for granted.

They are the reigning provincial champions, but lost out to Kerry in the All-Ireland semi-final. Like Armagh, they had a fairly mixed Ulster league campaign, although a win over Louth and draw with Down provides some indication.

Managed by Maxi Curran, there is still some talent in their side. Michael Murphy is the free taker and can tap scores over from anywhere between 14 to 55 metres out.


Murphy has featured for the county senior side so he has plenty of experience. The Glenswilly player was also part of this year's St Eunan's college side that won the MacLarnon Cup and reached the Colleges B final. In fact most of the strength of this year's team is expected to come from the Letterkenny school.

Others who could feature include Declan McGarvev and David Crawford, who is a good defender. This year's Ulster Minor Championship promises to once again be very exciting. Considering Down's exit at the hands of Monaghan, Tyrone's form against Fermanagh, the fact that Derry are the reigning league champions and the likely competitiveness of today's teams makes it extremely difficult to forecast a winner.

Current form gives little idea of how this game will go, with another tightly contested tie anticipated.







have to play our best football of the season.





And this is what has helped to fashion his approach to today's game - that and the fact that Donegal have tended to surrender far too often to Joe Kernan's side in the recent past. The Orchard County have inflicted heartbreak on their north-west rivals at regular intervals but today Donegal go into battle fuelled by that memorable National League triumph and further fired by their current status as favourites to land the Ulster title.

Indeed, today's contestants lock horns against rather contrasting backgrounds - Donegal ebullient, upbeat and confident following their league odyssey while Armagh are apprehensive and rather uneasy having only managed to copper-fasten a place in Division Two next year courtesy of a last-gasp win over Westmeath.

Yet how often have we been told in the past that the Ulster

Championship is a great leveller. No-one is more conscious of this old adage than Brian McIver himself, a man with his feet firmly planted on the ground but fired by ambition nonetheless.


"There are certain teams who are capable of closing out the games that really matter and Armagh are certainly among them," asserts the Donegal boss.

His initial selection policy was regarded within the county as being unduly bold but McIver held firm - and his strategy has now proved a formula for success.

Not only was the National League title captured but the fact that three substitutes arrived into the fray to each pick off a late point against Mayo in the decider afforded McIver considerable satisfaction.

For today's game, he not only has a strong, experienced starting line-up but he has a battery of talent in reserve, ready to make an impact if called to arms.

In contrast, familiar faces are conspicuous from the Armagh outfit - no Francie Bellew, Brian Mallon nor Ronan Clarke through injury and no John and Tony McEntee because of



their recent decision to step down from the county arena.

Not, of course, that there's the slightest chance that Armagh's perceived deficiencies in personnel will engender the slightest element of complacency within McIver's troops. They are conscious of Armagh's recent track record in the Championship, their ability to close out games and their desire to atone for what was in essence a below-par League campaign.

All of which makes for a fascinating contest between two teams whose paths have crossed a regular intervals lately. But today will certainly provide further proof that familiarity does not breed contempt.





MacCumhaill Park





All persons entering
MacCumhaill Park are
admitted only subject
to the following Ground
Regulations and to the Rules
and Regulations of the Gaelic
Athletic Association. Entry to
the ground shall be deemed
to constitute unqualified
acceptance of all these Rules
and Regulations. Any person
who fails to comply with these
Ground Regulations may be
refused entry or removed
from the ground.

Fireworks, smoke canisters, gas-horns, bottles, cans, flags, banners, poles and other similar articles or containers, including anything, which may be used as a weapon, are not permitted within the stadium.

The consumption of alcohol is not permitted within the ground and spectators are not

permitted to bring alcohol into the stadium.

The unauthorised climbing of any structure, walls, building or seating in the ground is strictly forbidden.

Unnecessary noise such as that from the use of radio sets, gas-horns, and behaviour likely to cause confusion or nuisance of any kind, including foul or abusive language, is not permitted within the ground. Under no circumstances is it permitted to throw any object onto the pitch.

Unauthorised persons are not permitted to enter upon the field of play at any time before, during or after the games.

The Ground Management reserve the right to refuse admission or to eject any

person who refuses to be searched where such a search is deemed necessary.

A person may not obstruct a gangway, stairwell or circulation area at any time.

All persons entering or in the ground are reminded of their obligation to ensure that their behaviour does not present a danger from fire or other occurrence to anyone using the premises.

The Ground Management reserve the right for it's servants or agents to remove from the ground any person who does not comply with the ground regulations or whose presence in the ground could reasonably be construed as constituting a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to other spectators.
