

GROUND REGULATIONS

- 01. All persons entering this ground are admitted only subject to the following Ground Regulations and to the Rules and regulations of Cumann Luthchcleas Gael. Entry to the ground shall be deemed to constitute unqualified acceptance of all these Rules and Regulations.
- 02. Fireworks, smoke canisters, gas- horns, bottles, glasses, cans, flags, banners, poles and other similar articles or containers, including anything which could or might be used as a weapon, are not permitted within the ground and any person in found to be in possession of such an article or container may be refused entry or ejected from the ground
- 03. The consumption of alcohol is not permitted within the ground and spectators are not permitted to bring alcohol into the ground.
- 04. The unauthorized climbing of any structure, walls or buildings in this ground strictly forbidden.
- 05 Unnecessary noise from the use of radio sets, gashorns and behavior likely to cause confusion Of nuisance of any kind, including foul or abusive language, is not permitted in any part of the ground.
- Under no circumstances is it permitted to throw any object the pitch.

- Unauthorised persons are not permitted to enter upon the field of play.
- Any person who fails to comply with the instruction from a Garda or Steward may be ejected from the ground.
- In general, the right of admission is reserved to the Ground Management.
- The Ground Management reserves the right to refuse admission to or eject any person who refuses to be searched by a member of the Garda Siochana.
- 11 Any person who remains in or obstructs a gangway or circulation area may be ejected from the ground.
- 12. The Ground Management reserve the right for it's servants or agents to remove from the ground any person who does not comply with the Ground Regulations or whose presence in the ground could reasonably be construed as constituting a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to other spectators.



Paddy Mc Nulty

Won four County Championship medals with Castlefin in 1945, 1951, 1954, and 1956, when the also won the league. Paddy was Cpt. of the 45, 51 and 56 teams.



Colm O Doherty

Colm and his brother Endas grandfather, Michael O Doherty was a founder member of the first G.A.A. Club formed in Castlefin in 1918, Club Physio, Mary Dunnion, forms another link with the formation of the G.A.A. as her Grandfather. John O Flaherty was also a founder member.

Carndonagh Review

A young schoolteacher's love of hurling resulted in the first ever GAA Club being established in Carndonagh in 1921. The club was called the Cuchulains, and while gaelic football was introduced into the club in 1938, hurling remained the main sporting activity. The club and its preferred game flourished so such an extent that Carndonagh supplied eleven players in 1947 and 1948 when the county won the Ulster Junior Championship. In latter years, due mainly to lack of hurling elsewhere in the county, apathy set in and the only activity was in underage competition.

In 1983, gaelic games in Carndonagh had a new beginning when, after two public meetings, a new committee was formed which transformed the image of the GAA in the parish. The club (now called simply Carndonagh GAA Club) was now involved in all hurling, football and camogie competitions.

On the 5th November 2000, the club membership made a decision to move from O'Doherty Park, Millbrae, to a new 12 acre green field site at Foden, about one mile outside the town. Ulster Council awarded the club "the ground of the year in 2005". The new facilities which include 4 no dressing rooms, committee room, equipment room, and general purpose room together with a floodlight pitch, a sand carpet pitch and training pitch is now viewed by clubs from all over the country who are in the process of developing their own grounds. Club members are very proud of the facility.

With the club competing in football, hurling, ladies football and camogie the club tries to cater for all those who want to play. As well as coaching and managing the various teams, the club has an active coaching programme where girls and boys from 6 to 12 years of age are tutored in hurling and football on Friday evenings and Saturday mornings for much of the year. The club, through its affiliation with the Inishowen Board, is pleased to be associated with the well received coaching programme in all the national schools in the parish. Our annual summer camps this year had 125 at the football and 92 at the hurling.

A number of players involved in the final today have won U/16, Minor and U/21 county titles and Michael McLaughlin (M) was a member of the 1997 Intermediate Championship winning team.

The club has reached the U/14 Football Div 2 County Final, the U/12B hurling league final all due to be played this weekend and have already won the county senior camogie championship, U/14 Northern Board League and Championship and the U/16A Inishowen Football Championship in 2008.







This campaign aims to encourage our players, supporters, parents, teachers and coaches to lead the way for our children in terms of thinking before we speak, especially when something happens on the field of play that makes us want to shout obscenities in rage of what has happened, or indeed when giving the post match report.

Parents, teachers, coaches, players, spectators and the referee all have a role to play when competition starts and the red mist descends.....

Parents...

We all want our kids to do well in life, but taking part in sport is the most important thing they will do in terms of their health. Support our children but don't put them under pressure, show good example and don't shout and swear. Stop and Think!

Teachers...

We look to you to nurture and guide our children. Pitch encroachments, arguments with referees, not dealing with unacceptable behaviour from young players need to be dealt with. Stop and Think!

Coaches...

The Code of Ethics and Best Practice goes out the door when we enter the field of play or when we scream at young children or referee in the heat of competition. Stop and Think!

Spectators...

When our team comes on the pitch our behaviour often becomes irrational. Referee abuse, bad language in the stands while standing beside young children is unacceptable. You may disagree with the referee or why a player is on the pitch but engage our brains before our mouths. Stop and Think!

Listen to ourselves...

Cursing and swearing at a referee, who has rushed in from work, given up his family time to help his club, our club and our children play games. Would you do this job? Engage our brains not our mouths next time. Stop and Think!

Referees...

Usually on the receiving end from coaches and spectators. However there is a need to get in shape, know the rules and communicate to players and coaches. Use acceptable language, even when you are under pressure. Stop and Think!



Did you Know

Hugh McLaughlin(October, 1918 – January 1, 2006) was an Irish publisher and inventor. He was married to Nuala Ryan.

McLaughlin was born at Killygordon, Co. Donegal, the youngest child of a stationmaster. At 16, be became a barman's apprentice in Gardiner Street, Dublin, Ireland. In 1935 he an established a tailoring business with his sister Anne Beggs. By 1950 he was involved with a printing company called Fleet and began publishing magazines for greyhound owners. Kavanagh's Weekly followed in 1952, which featured Patrick Kavanagh. Due the success, Hugh McLaughlin decided to continue to publish indigenous Irish magazines. These would compete with British magazines. Titles included Creation, Irish Farmers Journal, Woman's Way, Woman's Choice, Business & Finance, This Week (1969-1972) and Nikki. These magazines were published by his company the Creation group. Business & Finance is a business magazine that was established by McLaughlin in September 1964.[1] In 1973 McLaughlin founded the Sunday World with his business partner Gerry McGuinness, By 1977, Creation went into liquidation, which resulted in magazine titles being sold and in 1978 Independent Newspapers took control of 54 per-cent in the Sunday World, Hugh McLaughlin went on to established another Sunday newspaper, the Sunday Tribune, with business partner John Mulcahy. In 1982, he unsuccessfully launched a daily newspaper the Daily News. This was to be his last publishing venture.

In retirement McLaughlin invented a machine, the water hog that removed water from cricket pitches and putting.

History makers

The first G.A.A. Club in Castlefin was founded in 1918 under the name Con Culberts. Two of the Founder members were M O Doherty & J O Flaherty Carrick.

The clubs first success came in 1922 when the won their first and only Senior County Championship. The Club continued to play at senior level and in 1926 and 1930 they finished in the runners up spot in the County league Competitions.

They were junior championship runners up 1939 loosing to Cloughaneely in Falcarragh

They won the junior championship for the first time in 1945 when they defeated Corlea in Donegal Town.

The Captain of that history making team was Paddy McNulty who is still almost as active today as he was all those years.

The Club was out of action between 1947-1950, however they won the Junior Championship again in 1951 defeating St. Nauls (Inver) in Glenties.

They again reached the Junior Final in 1953, but because of some dispute over the referee which caused the Inver team to walk of the field, the final was not played until 1954, which they duly won.

The Club reached the County Minor Champ. Final in 1954 but suffered defeat at the hands of Ardara

1956 saw a league and championship double come to the Club, wearing maroon jerseys with white collars & cuffs they defeated Bundoran in Mc Cool Park in the championship final.

1961 again saw the Club achieve the junior championship and league double. The championship final was against Creeslough in O'Donnell Park.

In 1964 we lost to Glenties in the junior championship final.

Then followed a period of inactivity from 1964 until 1968.

The formation of the present club as we now know it, took place on the 23rd. February 1968 .

That year the club won the Fr. Bradley cup defeating Aghyaran 1-9 to 0-4.

In 1970 Robert Emmets won the U16 county championship.

Success again came in 1975 when we won the u 14 county championship.

The same year we were also crowned Division 2 League Champions and reached the county u 21 final in which we played Mc Cools in Mc Cool Park. Although defeated in this game it was little consolation to the club and team, that it was said that this was one of the best games of football ever played at the venue for many years.

In 1981, it was our u12 team turn to taste success when they became County champions defeating Aodh Ruadh B.A.S.

The club won two All-Irelands in the 1980s, but not on the field. It was in the Junior Scor instrumental music section when the talented Harper Family from Dungorman became all-Ireland Champions in 1980 and 1982.

In the midst of our jubilations in 1980 and 1982, the club experienced one of its darkest days when following a tragic road accident Sandy Harper, one of the Club and Counties most promising young footballers passed away. The Club hosted The Sandy Harper Memorial Tournament for the following 25 years and now Sandy's memory is honoured with the County Division 1 B League winners receiving the prestigious Sandy Harper Memorial Cup.

After a lapse of 22 years 1986 saw Robert Emmetts back in a County Junior championship final, but loosing out to Naomh Brid. However success again came to the Club in 1987 when we were crowned Junior champions by defeating Four Masters. The club again suffered defeat in the 1995 and 2001 Finals at the hands of Convoy and Urris respectively before tasting success in 2002 when we won the Junior championship defeating Naomh Brid in the final .

In 2004 tragedy once more struck the club, when Shaun T Carlin lost his life following an unfortunate incident in Letterkenny. Shaun T was a great clubman and a talented and dedicated footballer. The club have named their Stand after Shaun T. and run a very popular Shaun T Carlin Memorial Tournament each year.

The club have supplied the county with players at different levels through its existence. The following at senior level, M O Flaherty (1920) E Boyle (1921) J Quinn (1936/37/38) P Quinn (1939/40) S Donnelly (1949) with the most notable in recent times being Andy Curren (1968 to 1976) and of course Sandy Harper (1977 to 1980).

In 1954 the County contested the All-Ireland Junior Final in Croke Park against Kerry and Castlefin was represented by the talented Raymond Bryson who lined out at right corner back.


