The Cork man averaged 5.75 points a game for a return of 3-14 (23 points) in four outings.

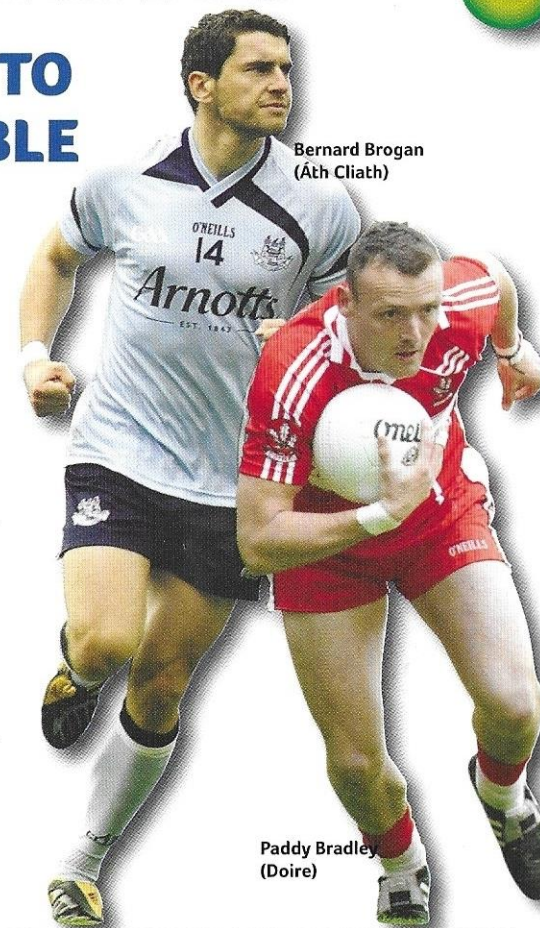

DONEGAL BID TO END FIVE YEAR WAIT

Donegal are bidding to qualify for the fourth round in the All-Ireland senior football championship Qualifiers for the first time since 2004 when they lost to Fermanagh.

Donegal have come back well from their Ulster senior championship first round defeat by Antrim at Ballybofey last month. They made a winning start to the Qualifiers at the expense of Carlow, and bounced back last week-end after losing a first half lead at Ballybofey to end Clare's interest.

The home county opened in good style to go 0-5 to 0-2 clear after fifteen minutes, but lost their way for a spell after that. Clare drew level with a goal from a penalty, but Donegal got back into gear again.

TOOK OVER

Prompted by Christy Toye in midfield and the finishing of full forward Michael Murphy, they took over again and finished 0-9 to 1-3 ahead at the break.

Donegal did not exactly set the scene alight in the second half, although their cause was not helped by the loss through injury of Toye after forty-seven minutes. However, they still had the edge and won through by 0-13 to 1-7.

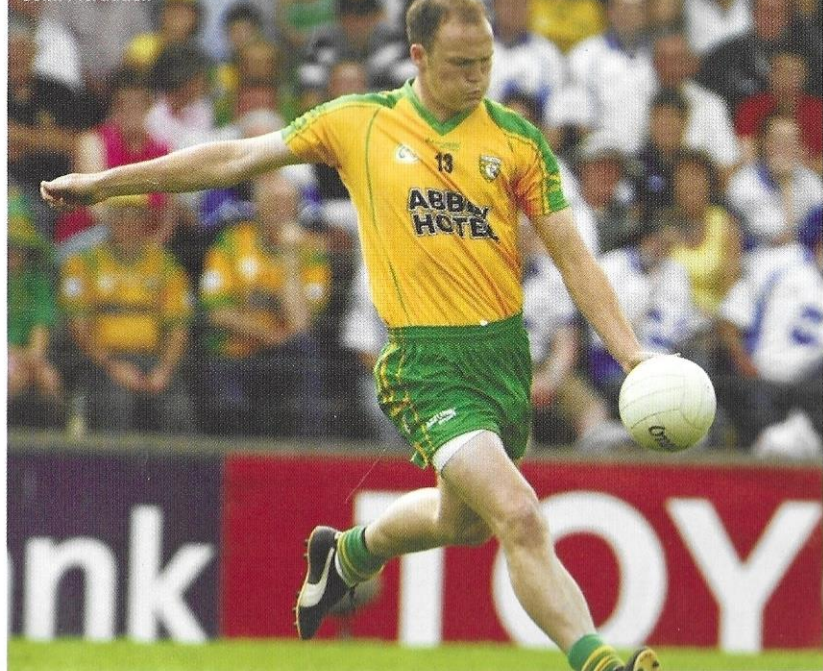
Toye got through much valuable work during his limited appearance. Rory Kavanagh played a captain's role at right half forward, while top scorer Michael Murphy and midfielder Kevin Cassidy were other influential figures.

A solid rather than spectacular come-back, then, by Donegal from their Ulster championship exit.

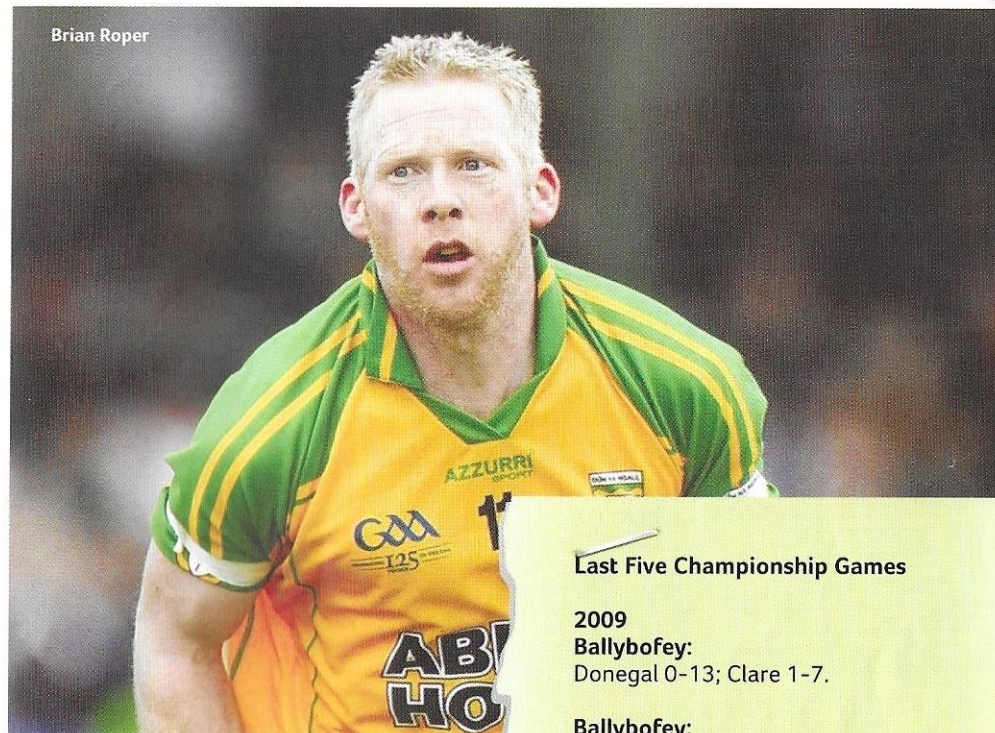

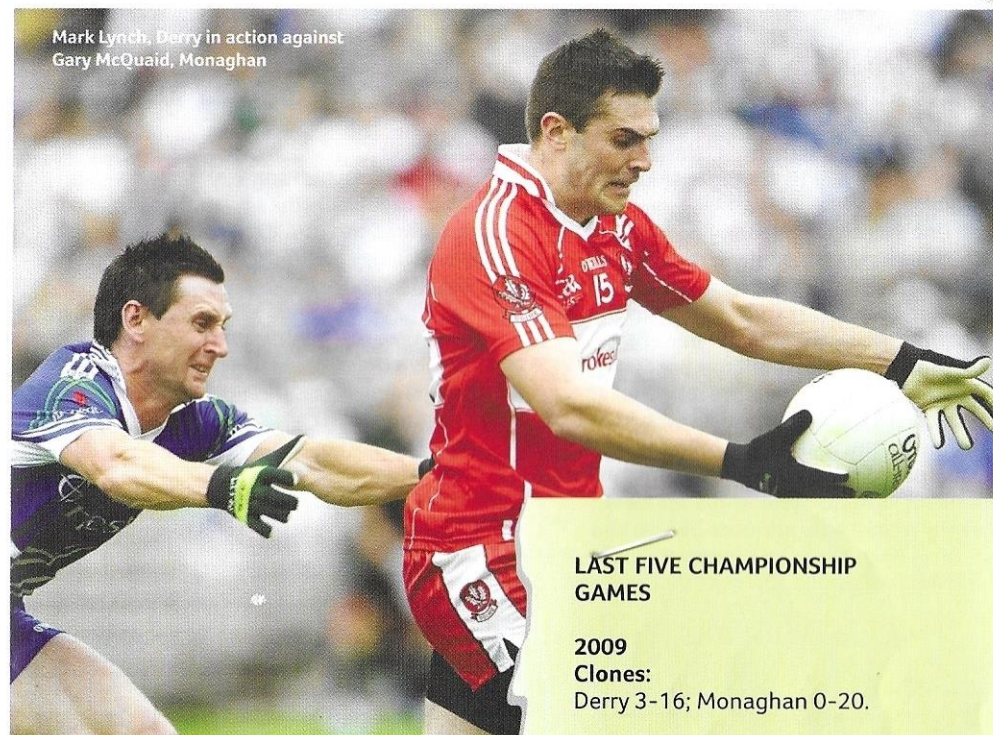

This was a spectacular come-back by Derry from their defeat by Tyrone in the Ulster semi-final in June, and also a real morale-booster for this outing.

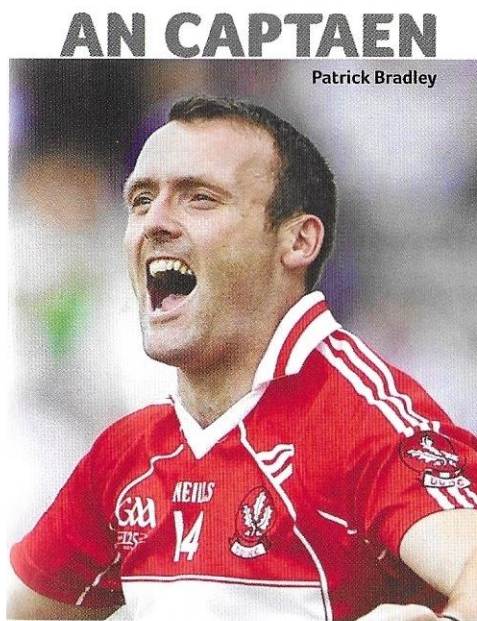

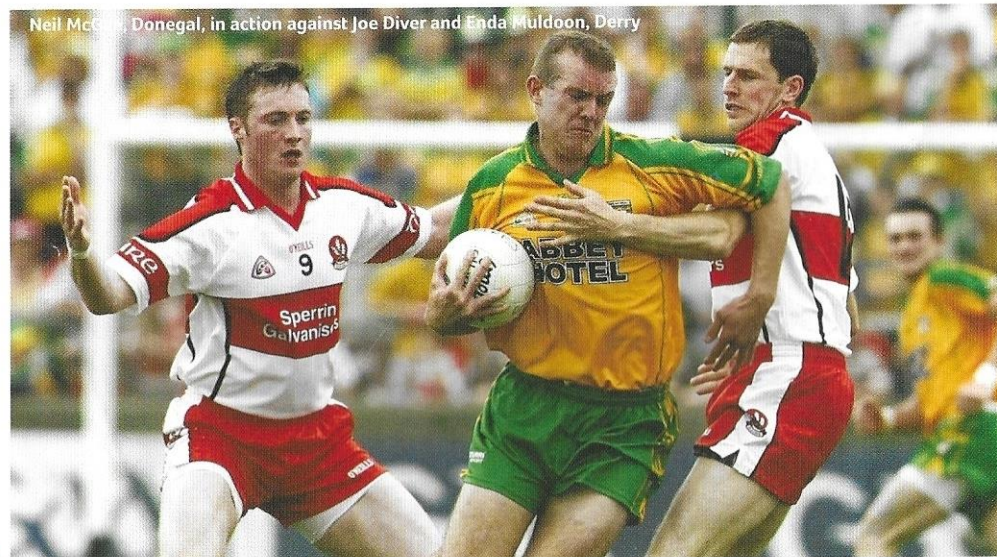

Another step on the long and winding road

Amere week after overcoming their last opponents, this Saturday's round three qualifiers have had to refocus and re-energise themselves for the next challenge.

With the drawn round two fixture between Roscommon and Wexford yet to be played, the three games taking place each have a fascinating sub-plot.

- Can Sligo test the mental resolve of a struggling Kerry?
- Could Micko's Wicklow put another Ulster side to the sword in Aughrim?
- Will injuries and disciplinary problems put paid to Donegal's chances of beating neighbours Derry?

We asked former Meath great Colm O'Rourke for his opinion on this weekend's clashes. "I think it's Derry's to lose against Donegal. John Joe Doherty's team posted very low scores against both Carlow and Clare, games which offered an ideal chance to rejuvenate confidence. The loss of Christy Toye is a big one and when you add the issues with discipline that management have had to deal with then it makes preparations all the more difficult. In saying all that, Derry is a local derby game and Donegal will take some heart from the fact that they conceded twenty scores to Monaghan, further evidence that the Oak Leaf county's defence is not the strongest.

"In Aughrim I'd have to favour Wicklow to beat Down. They're on a roll at the moment and playing a very inconsistent Down side. The win over Laois will have helped Ross Carr's men but I fancy Tony Hannon, Leighton Glynn and Co. to have the last say.

"The contest in Tralee between Jack O'Connor's off-form Kerry and Sligo will be one to watch. I expect Kerry to advance, with Galvin and Kennelly returning, but question how they will re-jig the full-forward line with Kieran Donaghy now gone for the summer. Likewise, will they persist with Dara Ó Sé in centre-field? He's finding the going tough and unless Kerry can find a settled spine to their team, they may well come unstuck in the near future."

While O'Rourke expects 'The Kingdom' to easily overcome the 'Yeats County', legendary Mayo high flied Willie Joe Padden suspects that matters may be tighter in Tralee. "It's a huge ask for Sligo to travel to Tralee and expect a win. However, they must believe that they're capable of causing a huge shock. If Glen Ryan's Longford hadn't taken so long to settle last weekend, we could have been looking at a very different fixture! Kerry are the kings of football but are

really off-form at the moment and making an uncharacteristic amount of personnel changes from game to game. They should still have way too much for Kevin Walsh's men but if Sligo can replicate the intense, physical game that won out in Connacht two years ago, it could make for a very interesting match.

"It has to be Derry in the other fixture. With Paddy and Eoin Bradley in top form and Fergal Doherty available, they should be much too strong for a weakened Donegal. "What a story in would be if Wicklow could beat Down? They've done great to get this far but may find Down a different proposition on Saturday. Home advantage in the tight field at Aughrim is a major advantage, but I'll give the vote to the Mournemen."

Can the men from Tír Conaill make home advantage count in Ballybofey?

Manus Boyle, a member of the historic, All-Ireland winning Donegal side of '92, thinks John Joe Doherty's team will have their work cut out. "The reality is that the Donegal public don't

expect much from Saturday's game and maybe this will help the cause. The loss of Michael Maguire and Christy Toye, to long term injury, is heightened by the further loss of Ciarán Bonner and Neil Gallagher due to disciplinary problems. I think John Joe deserves great credit for taking this stance. Discipline has been a big problem with the county panel over recent years and someone had to take a stand against it.

"Damien Cassidy will have his side prepared against a possible Donegal backlash, but will expect to advance. Hopefully, we can salvage something from a difficult year and put up a performance. I think that Kerry will overcome Sligo but maybe this team is coming to its natural end. Many of these players have been involved in five All-Ireland finals in a row, with endless training sessions and long hard seasons. They could still build momentum, but Donaghy's injury is a huge blow. His influence on the team cannot be under-estimated and it's a loss that will be sorely felt against stronger opposition."
