

- 05 Unnecessary noise from the use of radio sets, gas-horns and benavior likely to cause confusion Of nuisance of any kind, including foul or abusive language, is not permitted in any part ot 1he ground.
- 06. Under no circumstances is it permitted to throw any object the pitch.

- 07. Unauthorised persons are not permitted to enter upon the field of play.
- 08. Any person who fails to comply with the instruction from a Garda or Steward may be ejected from the ground.
- 09. In general, the right of admission is reserved to the Ground Management.
- 10. The Ground Management reserves the right to refuse admission to or eject any person who refuses to be searched by a member of the Garda Siochana.
- 11 Any person who remains in or obstructs a gangway or circulation area may be ejected from the ground.
- 12. The Ground Management reserve the right for it's servants or agents to remove from the ground any person who does not comply with the Ground Regulations or whose presence In the ground could reasonably be construed as constituting a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to other spectators.
- 13. All persons in the grounds are reminded of their obligation under Section 18(3) of the Fire Services Act 1981 to ensure that their behaviour does not present a danger from fire to anyone using the grounds.

Firstly, we'd like to begin by welcoming everyone here on county final day to bPairc Sheain Mhic Cumhaill in Ballybofey. This is a proud day for the people of Glenswilly as they've travelled from far and near to be here to support the team in their second county final in 3 years.

Glenswilly Club is located in the centre of County Donegal on the outskirts of Letterkenny. This area is contained within the Letterkenny and Stranorlor electoral areas and covers part of the Donegal Gaeltacht area. C.L.G. Gleann t-Súilí is in a rural area with Glendowan and Glenswilly national schools being the local schools and Churchill being the only village.

There has been a long history of Gaelic games been played in Glenswilly down through the years and 2012 marked the 30th anniversary of the establishment of C.L.G. Gleann t-Súilí.

The club, founded in 1982 has had proud successes both on and off the pitch. The club moved down to its current location at Pairc Naomh Columba in Foxhall around 1995. We now have a large clubhouse, dressing rooms, a flood lit Prunty pitch, gym and a large multipurpose community hall which caters for all kinds of social events such as indoor sports, plays, concerts and dancing.

C.L.G Gleann t-Súilí has teams representing the club at all age levels and their successes are a great reflection of all the work that is put in at underage level in the club. Our Ladies teams have had success down the years and we are currently developing the Ladies football once again in the Glen. Our third team is going from strength to strength and in 2013 made it to the Semi-Final of the Junior B championship. This team continues to attract players back

to the club, getting people involved again in the life of the club and local community as well as develop younger players before moving on to the Reserve and Senior squads.

The cultural side of the club is also thriving with our Scor teams having had County, Ulster and All Ireland successes. Glenswilly had its first cultural summer camp in 2011 which is being improved every year. This also is attracting many new faces to the club. Traditional Irish music classes are now a regular part of weekly activities in the club.

Today we meet Killybegs in only our 3rd senior championship final. The club have tasted victory in 2011 when we met St Michaels and won our first ever Senior championship title. This was the highlight of the short history of our club and marked the great work that has been done down the years from the humble beginnings in Mc Ginley's field in Breenagh.

This followed the great successes down the years winning its first Junior B Championship in 1984, Shield in 1991, Division 4 in 1993, U21 B in 1994, Division 4 in 2000, Intermediate Championship in 2005, Division 1 B in 2007, County Senior finalists 2007 and the county Gaeltacht Championship in 2011. This season our senior and reserve teams have been successful in winning their Division 2 leagues. Our seniors are now back in top flight football.

Finally, we wish to thank you all for coming to support the team today. We wish the team and management every success today in the final and hope it can be another proud and memorable day for Glenswilly.

Wishing Killybegs success in todays County final

Na Cealla Beaga - A Brief History

Na Cealla Beaga began playing competitively in the 1920s. After a lapse of several years, they came back to play in the early 30s.

The club won their first senior Championship in 1952.

Fintra Park was opened on June the 11th 1967 with an Ulster Hurling Championship match between Donegal and Armagh and a football challenge between Donegal and Mayo. The field was dedicated in memory of the late Paddy Mc Devitt on May 29th 1988 with Donegal playing Leitrim in a challenge match.

The club moved to the Eamonn Byrne Memorial Park on the 15th of May 2010 with Killybegs playing Tir Chonaill Gaels in the Andy Duffy Memorial match and Donegal playing Leitrim in a challenge game with Paul Mc Ginley and Shane 'Baker' Boyle (captain) in the Donegal line up.

With numerous underage titles from 1979 and 5 senior championships from 1988 to 1996, this was the golden era of the club. From 1996 on, a new team emerged and reached county semi finals in 2000 and 2001 with players like Conal Molloy, Pauric Gallagher, Kevin Martin, Charles Tully, Pauric Mc Gettigan and Kevin Fallon progressing as senior stars.

The future was also built with under 12 and 16 championships in 2000 with big performances from Ciaran Tully, Pauric Breslin, Ryan Mc Nelis, Paul Mc Ginley, Shane Molloy, Anthony O Hara, Daniel Breslin and David Conwell.

The senior team failed to reach the semi final stage again until 2010, but in between contested a reserve final in 2002 against Aodh Ruadh with Martin 'Slua' Boyle as manager at the time and also captured their first Reserve League title in 2005.

The Minor team captured back to back County titles in 2005 and 2006 and also contested an Ulster Minor Club Final in 2005 against Errigal Ciaran of Tyrone. This team made up the backbone of today's Senior team, including Daniel O'Donnell, Jason Noctor,

Brendan Mc Guire, Christopher Murrin and Brendan Faherty.

The senior team won the Ulster Intermediate League in 2010, seeing off Derry's Craigbane in the final under the guidance of Peter Mc Ginley. The team also reached the County Final after a great campaign with victories over Ardara, Dungloe and Four Masters, but it came to an end after a defeat to Naomh Conaill who went on to contest the Ulster Final against Crossmaglen.

In 2013, the senior team reached the final of the Ulster Senior League losing out to Derry's Ballinderry in extra time.

Already this season, the club have captured their first Under 14 County title since 1988, with the team trained by Christopher 'Mooner' Murrin and managed by Dermot 'Slua' Boyle, younger brother of today's Senior Manager, Martin 'Slua', who will be hoping to emulate him today.

The Club have had success at refereeing level also with Jimmy White, Andrew Mullen and Shane Murrin officiating at every grade with Jimmy taking control of several high profile games, including the 2008 Ulster and All Ireland Semi Final and the 2010 Connaught Final.

Other activities within the club included a number of successful fundraising events, some of which were 2 Strictly Come Dancings in 2011 and 2012 with Ed Byrne (secretary) participating and this year's Fight Night versus Aodh Ruadh, attracting large crowds. The main organisers being John (chairman) and Fionnuala Cunningham, Sarah Tully (treasurer) assisted by other hard working members of the committee. Weekly Bingo and Killotto provide major funds for the club. After a break of many years, Scór has been revived in the club since 2010 with club members participating in Scór na nÓg and Scór Sinnsear.

Finally, the club wishes the Saint Catherine's Marching Band, the jubilee team of 1988 and today's team and management all the best of luck!

I hope together we can deliver a performance that will make sure that this evening we can return as county champions to The Hills of Glenswilly.


I will have mixed feelings today however with neither of the two brothers playing. However, it will still be a very proud day for the Boyle family, especially my Dad and daughter Rhiannon.



Hurt burning the desire in the hills of Glenswilly

"Some stalwart men around me stood my comrades kind and true," - The Hills of Glenswilly, Mick McGinley

GLENSWILLY is enjoying a golden age of Gaelic football right now.

One of the newest clubs in Donegal, having only been founded in 1981, Glenswilly is only in its eighth year as a senior club, but today will be the club's third SFC final.

That record is remarkable in itself, but it is a success and a story that doesn't have an overnight tale.

Glenswilly have had to show a real resolve in this year's Championship. In four of their five Championship matches to date, there has only been a point or two between the teams at the conclusion.

Their quarter-final win over Kilcar and semi-final triumph against Ardara were wins of some fortuity, but their steely resistance has been moulded by their knowledge of what the pang of late, narrow defeats feels like.

"When you lose big games, eventually we learned how to grind out games and how to get over the line," says manager Gary McDaid.

"If it's one point or six, we'll take it. It's been very tight this season but we've managed to get over the line."

In 2003, Glenswilly won a Donegal Under 21 'B' tille and reached the 'A' final the following year, losing to a late blitz against St Michael's.

In 2005, Glenswilly won an Intermediate Championship and went on to reach the Ulster final. In the decider against Monaghan side Inniskeen, Glenswilly stomach's churned as the concession of Inde, late goal led to defeat by side that went on to Chim an All-Ireland title that year.

"That was the game we probably took the most from," says Ciaran Bonner, who captained the side in 2005.

"We always thought back here that we needed to be a bit ruthless then.

"You didn't get punished in the games and the levels we were playing at. when you step into Division 1 and make a mistake in an All-County League game, you are punished for it.

"The top-quality teams will all punish you if you slip at all."

In 2010, Glenswilly were almost ready to start hanging bunting in the parish when Naomh Conaill struck two decisive daggers to their hearts in a semi-final at O'Donnell Park.

Anthony and Leon Thompson hit a brace of goals to deny Glenswilly a berth in the final.

"That was just heartache," Bonner says.

"We threw it away with three minutes to go. We lost our focus. You learn from hurt.

"That was a bitter, hard pill to swallow.

"We've become battle-hardened from those defeats.

"We had to engrave that toughness into the team. There were a lot days when we were on the wrong end of that. We've managed to know how to get on the right side of it."

Bonner was a part of that Under 21 crop that provides the backbone of today's squad.

There appears a one-for-all-and-all-for-one attitude in the camp right now.

Bonner says: "This group of player grew up together. It's like a group of your own brothers. Every man puts his body on the line.

"It doesn't matter who you are; everybody gets the same respect here. If you're one of the smaller players or Michael Murphy, it's all the same when we take to the field.

"There is no 'i' in this team. Every player is for the team and if Gary asks you to play right cornerback or left corner-forward you do it."

Last year, Glenswilly's grip on Dr Maguire's ears was loosened in a horrid quarter-final loss to Dungloe.

In their third final, Glenswilly want the scales to tip by the winning column.

"The determination is there," Bonner says.

"We want to show people that we weren't nearly men, that we weren't one-hit wonders."

Naomh Conaill and Gaoth Dobhair lock horns once again

Gaoth Dobhair's Herculean second-half efforts in O'Donnell Park, Letterkenny at the beginning of the month means that they get another shot at Naomh Conaill this afternoon in the senior reserve decider.

Leo McLoone Snr's young guns produced a scintillating first-half performance that afternoon that looked like it was going to be enough to account for Gaoth Dobhair there and then going in at the break.

But trailing 0-12 to 0-3 at the beginning of the second period, a quite amazing effort from the Magheragallon men culminated in Michael McKelvey hammering home a late penalty and pressure free to snatch a draw in the most dramatic of fashions.

Having had time to reflect on that capitulation, Stephen Molloy says his Naomh Conaill side has realised the error of its second-half ways and are determined to make amends for them this afternoon in Bullybofey.

"At that moment, we were devastated," he admitted. "We took the foot off the gas and we let a great opportunity slip. When they got that first goal maybe a few nerves crept in. We sat back, maybe looking to protect what we had but that only invited them on us.

"I think if we had to keep playing the game the way we did in that first-half we would have been grand. We had been playing so well before that. At one stage in that first-half it looked like some Gaoth Dobhair players had half given up.

"Even after the restart, we looked to have the early upper hand. But credit to them, they turned it around in some style. It was a lesson for us all that if you don't keep your concentration and focus for the entire hour you can be caught out.

"But with the dust settling of course we're delighted to have another chance to put all that right. Hut that (disappointment) lifted as soon as we got back training the following week."

That exciting stalemate now means that the reserve showpiece has been thrown under an even wider spotlight as the curtain raiser to the biggest game in Donegal club football. Molloy agrees that brings an added pressure for both sides – particularly two teams that include quite a number of talented youngsters in their ranks.

"Definitely," he added. "A lot of the young players on our side won't have experienced that kind of crowd in almosphere and they'll be excited and looking forward to it.

"Hopefully they can bring the experience from Letterkenny into the next day. Going into the last 15 or 10 minutes MacCumhaill Park will be getting well packed and it will be a brilliant experience for what ever aidle is lucky enough to climb those steps and get the fulp."

"A reserve title would give the club a big lift after the seniors going out of the running so early. This is also a great chance for lads to put themselves in the window ahead of next season for the senior panel."

In the Gaoth Dobhair camp, the mood couldn't have been more different during the immediate



aftermath of that stunning turnaround in Letterkenny last time out. However, captain James Sweeney says that his side also has had plenty to ponder themselves since after that initial euphoria had subsided.

"It was a relief to still be there, we were blessed in a way," he said. "But at the same time we would have been concerned that we didn't play for the first forty minutes. It wasn't until the last quarter of an hour that we finally turned up.

"But we showed that we do have it in the tank and that we are good enough. We can't afford to stand off them as much again the next day. We let them dictate the play in the first-half and we let them boss the game.

"To be honest, with the pedigree of players they have we need to be ready from the very off this time out. That said, in fairness to our lads, we dug deep. We never gave up and we fought to the last seconds. We got the reward in a sense. But of course, we have to look to hit top gear much earlier in Ballybofey."

Like Stephen Molloy in the opposition camp, Sweeney says that whichever side reacts better to their surroundings this afternoon under the glare of the cameras and larger crowd, could well be the team celebrating at the final whistle.


"That will add to it, certainly," he continued. "We'll probably talk a little about it closer to the time. It won't do them young boys any harm at all. It's a nice touch to be honest. We're all looking forward to it and I'm sure Glenties are the exact same.

"We need to settle it down and make sure nerves don't get the better of us. Both sides have had a good look at each other. There are quite a few senior medals in that side and lads like Conal 'Ban' McNelis will no doubt be knocking on that door again next year.

"Martin Regan is also an experienced head in the middle. Those boys and the young lads they have breaking from defence make them very dangerous. They're there on merit and they'll be favourites again but we'll give it our best shot, I'm sure."

Verdict: Naomh Conaill.

The 1988 team was made up of the backbone of the u12 team of the previous 9 years and the majority of this team were part of a 9 year successful era for the Killybegs club.

Killybegs won 17 underage titles, 2 County Shield titles, 2 Ulster Club Minor titles, and 1 Intermediate County title. In 1979 many of these players contested the u12 title and went on to contest 16 underage finals and were successful in every one.

U12 1979, 1983, 1986 U13 1984, 1986, 1987, U14 1981, 1985, 1987 U15 (Óg Sport) 1982, 1986 Juvenile 1983 Minor Leagues 83, 84, 85, Minor county championship 1984, 1985. Ulster Club Minor Championship 1984, 1985 U/21 1986 With this great run of success, many felt that senior football championship would soon come. However, to achieve success at the highest level you need commitment, discipline, coupled with football skills: these are the ingredients that a manager looks for in order to get success.

In 1985, in the game of the championship against Four Masters in a quarter final, in 1986 a semi- final fail against Red Hugh's left supporters wondering if a title would ever come and in 1987 St Eunan's killed off the dream again - this time in the first round. Many people wrote off Killybegs in 1988: they were seen as a Club with good underage teams unable to make the transition to senior football. However, the transformation started early in 1988 when Wicklow native, Eamonn Byrne (RIP), was selected as Captain of the team. Eamonn insisted he would only take the job if he had a vice-captain - something new for a Killybegs team to have.

So, one by one changes began to fall into

place - John Joe O Shea, local secondary school teacher, a Kerry native, was asked to manage the team and a recent Ulster Bank manager appointment brought Meath man, Brendan Dempsey on board as a selector. Team trainer was Michael Sparks Gallagher assisted by Colm Cunningham and Bernard Conaghan. They set out on a quest to capture a senior title as the then powers that be in the club felt a combination of Kerry style and Meath toughness (All within the rules, we might add) was the correct formula. This formula, merged with this group of footballers was about to bear fruit. During the 1988 campaign in a game against Ballyshannon, the ultimate tragedy struck the family, friends and teammates of Captain Eamonn Byrne. As the half time whistle blew, Eamonn Byrne complained to Brendan Dempsey about two missed chances and seconds later Eamonn Byrne, Killybegs Captain, was gone. Players, spectators and officials looked on in horror as Eamonn was removed from the field of play - the

Killybegs capt had passed away. Today as in 1988, Eamonn's son, Eddie, will represent his father. In 2010, Killybegs GAA club bestowed on Eamonn the highest honour a club can - the new development is aptly named Eamonn Byrne Memorial Park. This year will also see the club hold the bi annual Eamonn Byrne Tournament. In the fifteen years that Eamonn played with the club, he had earned the respect of all and it remains amongst his teammates and the members of the club of that time. To this day it upsets people that Eamonn was not there to lift the Dr Maguire Cup when the club won the Senior Championship a few short months after his death. Today Eamonn's grandchildren play for CLG Na Cealla Beaga.

1988 will be remembered as the saddest of times because of Eamonn's passing and the most joyous of times by winning a senior championship and beating the much fancied Kilcar team by 2 points while super sub, Charlie Tully, celebrated in his now infamous green shorts.

As manager of the Killybegs senior team, the first thing I would like to do is welcome all our fans to Mc Cool Park today, it has not always been easy following us this year. Among the fans are my three kids, Alicia, Shaun and Sarah (her first game).

My love for GAA comes from my Dad, listening to stories of how Down won 3 All Irelands in the 1960s and how a great Glen team won the County Title in 1978. During days in the bog, we often debated who was the tougher man, Noel Hegarty or John Razda Cunningham.

McHugh.

My playing days with Killybegs were years of a lot of effort but few trophies but I played with a lot of men who gave it their all, Baker Boyle, Itilly Broderick, James Pat Cunningham and many more. What was good about playing with Killybegs in the 1960s was seeing the great Killybegs team in action. It's only now when I look back, I realise the enjoyment they gave a GAA fan.

My management days were started back in 2002 with the reserve team, and really I have never been far away since then. I had a very enjoyable time with Peter Mc Ginley managing a very good underage team. We won 3 County titles and got to an Ulster Final. We had famous names like Shaun Kelly and Seamus Coleman present, senior Jason Noctor, being the club's most recent player to win a provincial championship medal and men I would like to see back, Ciaran Tully and Gerard

When you start playing or managing in Donegal, the County Final day is where you want to be. With the present panel of players, we have made it here! My only wish is that the boys play the way I know they can play.

Finally, I would like to thank my backroom team of Shay Murrin, Sean Connor and medical team of Alaling Murrin and Tony Hegarty.

The Boys from Killybegs - making waves once again

What can you say about The Boys from Killybegs and their manager, Martin 'Slua' Boyle. You could hardly categorise them as normal county finalists; neither the team nor the manager!

Martin Boyle could be no more laid back in his after-match interviews. If he was he would be completely horizontal. Maybe he is as shocked as the rest of us.

The script for this year's county final, as written in the middle of summer, has been shredded by Killybegs. They were not supposed to be at the table, dining out on county final day.

But there is something about the Killybegs club that is different. That little extra bit of something, which is missing from many fancied teams, is there in abundance. You couldn't call it arrogance, but it is close to that; a sort of in-built confidence. Let's say, they don't suffer from any inferiority complex.

How could a team lose 15 league games on the trot (I'm assuming last week's non appearance in Gaoth Dobhair will be recorded and loss), be confined to relegation to Division Iwo with half the league programme still to play and yet remain unbeaten in the Donegal famor Championship and now threatening to uppot the apple cart again on Co. final day.

They have done this with a very limited panel. Imagine what they could have done if they had the likes of Shane Boyle, Paul McGinley and Brendan Faherty available. Faherty has returned for the semi-final and will be back for the final from the US. But how they would like to have Shane 'Baker' Boyle available to look after Michael Murphy, and Paul McGinley to run straight lines from half-liank.

But they have made light of their problems. Martin Boyle and his backroom team have just got on with it. The arrival of Hugh McFadden as a target man on the edge of the square has been an important part of the jigsaw which has seen them make the final.

There are other factors, too. Christopher Murrin looked as good as many on the county senior panel with his performance in the semi-final win over Malin. His willingness to take on and beat an opponent set the bar for the rest of his teammates and they stepped up to the plate.

The team have had to listen to the exploits of past teams when the boys in red and white were dominant from the late 1980s to middle of the 1990s and further. The first of those teams - in 1988 - will be honoured today at half-time, and there are links to the team with Hugh McFadden, the Boyles and Gallaghers all following in their fathers' footsteps. Indeed, if he stays around a couple of more years, Mark 'Herbie' Boyle will be performing in the final and also at half-time! Mark was only 15 in 1988, but a year later he was making his way on to the senior team and he is still there!

Today they face up to another huge task. They go into the game very much as underdogs in the eyes of the neutrals, but try telling that to the Killybegs players or their manager.

Reputations mean little to Killybegs. They weren't supposed to be here. St. Eunan's, Kilcar, Naomh Conaill, St. Michael's, Four Masters, Ardara, Gaoth Dobhair (and maybe more) were supposed to be well ahead of them in the pecking order.

So much for the pecking order! Killybegs are just different!





