


AN RÉITEOIR JAMES CLARKE (CAVAN)

Both Leitrim and Tyrone have featured regularly on James' roster over the last few seasons and indeed the Cavan referee was in charge of Leitrim's Allianz League Round 3 meeting with Warwickshire at Kingspan Breffni Park just a couple of weeks ago. That was one of four fixtures assigned to Clarke in this year's competition with his other outings taking place at Inniskeen, Athleague and Enniskillen. Tyrone's Nicky Rackard Cup clash with Louth at Carrickmore last May was James' most recent assignment with the Red Hand side while he was also in charge of their league encounters against Fermanagh and Monaghan (relegation play-off).

- In general, The Ground Management reserves the right of admission.
- The Ground Management reserves the right to refuse admission or to eject any person who refuses to be searched by a member of An Garda Siochána.
- Any person who remains in a gangway may be ejected.
- The GAA event promoters reserves the right for its servants or agents to remove from the ground
 any person who does not comply with the ground regulations or whose presence on the ground could
 reasonably be construed as constituting a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to other spectators.

Strong Donegal win final

DONEGAL4-12 ROSCOMMON2-14

A second quarter scoring blitz gave Donegal the cushion they needed to withstand a second-half comeback from Roscommon and claim the Division 3A silverware at Markievicz Park in Sligo yesterday. Ray Durack's side outscored their Connacht opponents by 3-3 to 0-2 during the second quarter to take a 13-point lead into the interval.

The three goals came in an eighthminute spell between the 19th and 27th minutes. A fourth goal was added ten minutes after the break as Donegal stretched their lead to 15 points.

Roscommon, who had been reduced to 14 men in first-half injury-time, looked down and out at that stage. But, incredibly, the Primrose and Blue staged an unlikely comeback which left Donegal hanging on for dear life in the closing minutes.

The wind was a major factor and it favoured Donegal in the opening half. However, it was Roscommon who looked the sharper side during the opening exchanges.

The Connacht side recorded a couple of early wides before Robbie Fallon opened the scoring from a 55-metre free in the fourth minute. Lee Henderson replied for Donegal and Enda McDermott edged them ahead with an 11th minute point.

Robbie Fallon equalised from a 35metre free, but Sean McVeigh hit straight back for Donegal. Ciaran Mathewson added another on 14 minutes and Henderson stretched the lead to three points from a '65.

The first goal arrived just as the game was ticking into the second quarter. A long ball was claimed by

Kevin Campbell inside the 20-metre line, and the corner-forward of-floaded to the onrushing Paddy Hannigan who made no mistake from the edge of the square.

Robbie Fallon pulled a point back for the Rossies, but the momentum was firmly with the Donegal men at this stage. A close range free was converted by Henderson, and that was followed by a second Hannigan goal on 25 minutes.

Less than a minute later, another green flag was raised as the Roscommon defence parted like the Red Sea and Henderson found the bottom corner. Donegal's direct approach was causing all sorts of problems for the Roscommon full-back line, and another high ball to Hannigan almost yielded a fourth goal in the 28th minute.

However, Roscommon goalkeeper Padraig Dolan spread himself well to make a decent stop. Henderson added a couple of frees, before Robbie Fallon stopped the rot for Roscommon with a well-struck 60metre free on 35 minutes

It left Justin Campbell's men trailing by 3-8 to 0-4, and things went from bad to worse for them when midfielder John Moran was dismissed for a wild pull that left Ronan

McDermott requiring treatment for a head injury. Robbie and Gary Fallon pulled a couple of scores back for Roscommon in the opening minutes of the second period. But Henderson replied for Donegal, before Enda McDermott's 46th minute goal stretched the lead to 15 points.

However, that would prove to be Donegal's last score for 19 minutes as Roscommon dragged themselves off the canvas to produce a spirited comeback.

Robbie Fallon (four frees), David Dolan and Tomas Seale hit six points in 11 minutes to cut the gap to nine points by the 58th minute. Less that a minute later Cillian Egan added a goal to throw the game back into the melting pot.

Ian Delaney and Cathal Dolan tacked on another couple of points, but Mathewson stopped the rot for Donegal on 65 minutes. But the Rossies were on the march again 60 seconds later, and a foul on Robbie Fallon gave Micheal Kelly the opportunity to go for goal from a 20-metre free.

The centre-back duly converted to leave just two points between the sides. Roscommon threw the kitchen sink at Donegal in the closing minutes but the defence held firm. A breakaway score from Henderson, in the 69th minute, gave Ray Durack's men some breathing space. A late free from the same player sealed the deal deep into stoppage time.
