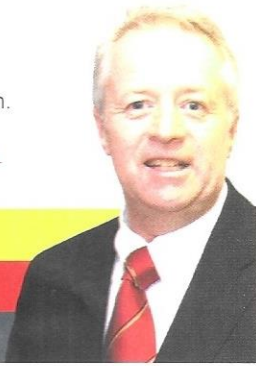

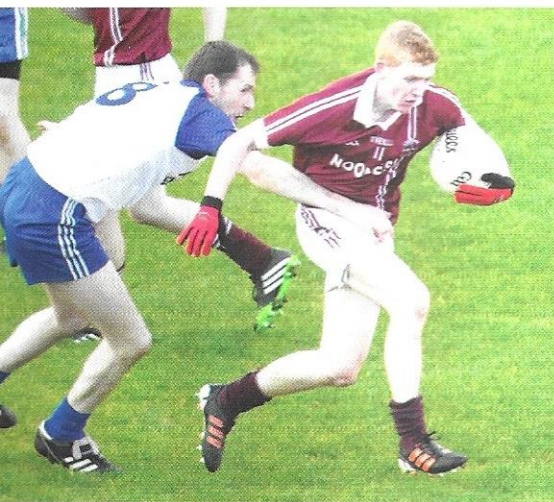
GAA clubs in Ulster for your commitment and passion to our Association and I wish you continued success. I wish all clubs well in today's Ulster Club fixtures.

Cynical Behaviour Fouls

4. Threaten or to use abusive or provocative language or gestures to an opponent or a teammate.
5. Remonstrate in an aggressive manner with a Match Official.

The penalty for the above fouls are:


- i. Free Kick from where the foul occurred.
- ii. Order Off offender by showing him a Black Card*.
- iii. Allow a replacement from within the substitutions permitted*.

*Substitutes


- Increased to SIX per team.
- Maximum of THREE permitted for Black Card Offenders.

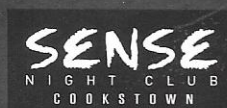

Cynical Behaviour Fouls

1. Deliberately pull down an opponent.

4. Threaten or to use abusive or provocative language or gestures to an opponent or a teammate.

The penalty for the above fouls are:

- i. Free Kick from where the foul occurred.
- ii. Order Off offender by showing him a Black Card*.
- iii. Allow a replacement from within the substitutions permitted*.

*Substitutes

- Increased to **SIX** per team.
- Maximum of **THREE** permitted for Black Card Offenders.

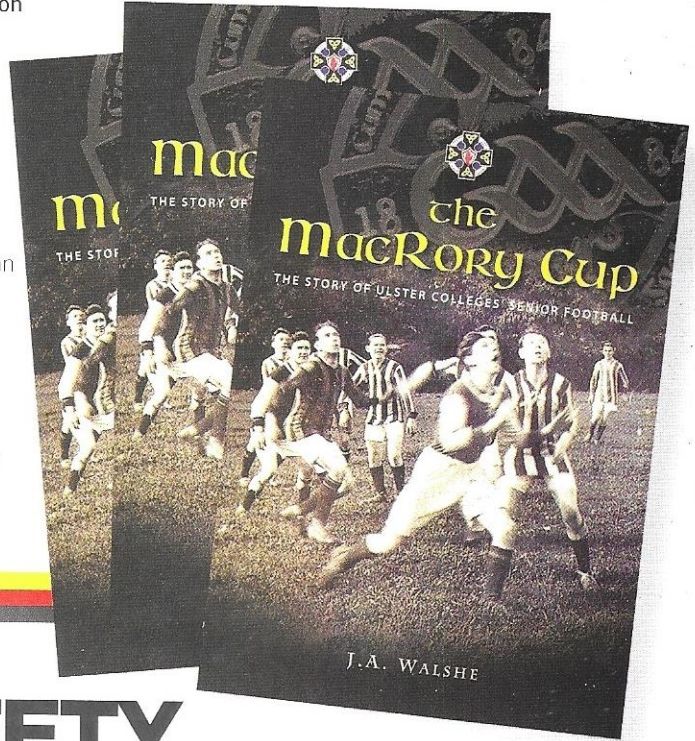

YOUR SAFETY

The Officers on duty reserve the right to remove you from the ground if you do not comply with these simple regulations. Our intention is simply to ensure that all our supporters can enjoy the match.

First Aid is provided at today's venues, by Order of Malta Personnel. Children who have become separated from their parents/guardians should be brought to the designated First Aid Points.
