



McBrearty magnificent as Donegal win easy

Thanks to a magnificent display from Patrick McBrearty, Donegal U-21s eased past Fermanagh in the quarter-final in MacCumhail Park.

McBrearty ended with a personal tally of 1-7 and was involved in almost all of Donegal scores. It was the Kilcar man that got them going when they struggled for a while at the start.

With the wind whipping up to gale force, it was never going to be pretty in Ballybofeigh last night.

Fermanagh had the strong wind in the opening half and should have had a goal after five minutes when Donegal corner-back Andrew McCloskey failed to collect and Thomas McCaffrey was straight through on goal. He opted to lob the 'keeper but his effort went well over the crossbar.

Eddie Courtney from a free and Louis Leonard found the range to put Fermanagh three clear but Donegal senior Patrick McBrearty then took a hand. He pointed a free after Marty O'Reilly was fouled and even though Courtney added another free, McBrearty was beginning to get into the game. He pointed another free after

Ryan McHugh was tackled late.

Courtney added his third free on 21 minutes but Donegal took over in the final ten minutes added 2-2 to take a very healthy 2-4 to 0-5 lead to the dressing room at half-time

McBrearty started the purple patch with his first point from play and then he was involved in the first goal on 28 minutes, his effort for a point dropping short and Willie Gillespie got the touch to send the ball to the net.

Ciaran Thompson hit a wonder point against the breeze before Ciaran Brennan added a second, albeit from a mishit shot which deceived the Fermanagh 'keeper.

It was a very good position for the Donegal side, who only came to life in the final minutes of the half.

The strength of the wind could not be exaggerated, but the two points by McB rearty and Thompson from play were magnificent efforts

McBrearty took off where he left off within minutes of the restart lobbing two more magnificent efforts.

The Kilcar man continued to keep the scoreboard ticking over and when Hugh McFadden was pulled down for a penalty in the final minute, McBrearty coolly slotted home from the spot.

Apart from McBrearty, Ryan McHugh had an influential role with Ciaran Thompson, Willie Gillespie, Martin O'Reilly and Conor Parke also putting in solid shifts.

Donegal started without senior player Darach O'Connor, who picked up a hamstring injury in the McLarnon final against St. Eunan's.

The game saw minor Lorcán Connor make his U-21 debut after hitting 1-5 for the mionors against Fermanagh the previous night.
