Ground Regulations

01. All persons entering this ground are admitted only subject to the following Ground Regulations and to the Rules and regulations of Cumann Luthchleas Gael. Entry to the ground shall be deemed to constitute unqualified acceptance of all these Rules and Regulations.
02. Fireworks, smoke canisters, gas- horns, bottles, glasses, cans, flags, banners, poles and other similar articles or containers, including anything which could or might be used as a weapon, are not permitted within the ground and any person in found to be in possession of such an article or container may be refused entry or ejected from the ground
03. The consumption of alcohol is not permitted within the ground and spectators are not permitted to bring alcohol into the ground.
04. The unauthorized climbing of any structure, walls or buildings in this ground strictly forbidden.
05. Unnecessary noise from the use of radio sets, gas-horns and behavior likely to cause confusion Of nuisance of any kind, including foul or abusive language, is not permitted in any part of the ground.
06. Under no circumstances is it permitted to throw any object the pitch.
07. Unauthorised persons are not permitted to enter upon the field of play.
08. Any person who fails to comply with the instruction from a Garda or Steward may be ejected from the ground.
09. In general, the right of admission is reserved to the Ground Management.
10. The Ground Management reserves the right to refuse admission to or eject any person who refuses to be searched by a member of the Garda Síochana.
- 11 Any person who remains in or obstructs a gangway or circulation area may be ejected from the ground.
12. The Ground Management reserve the right for it's servants or agents to remove from the ground any person who does not comply with the Ground Regulations or whose presence in the ground could reasonably be construed as constituting a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to other spectators.
13. All persons in the grounds are reminded of their obligation under Section 18(3) of the Fire Services Act 1981 to ensure that their behaviour does not present a danger from fire to anyone using the grounds.

Within the County he has taken charge at different Regional and County finals at underage and adult level and taken charge of games in the County Senior Championship.

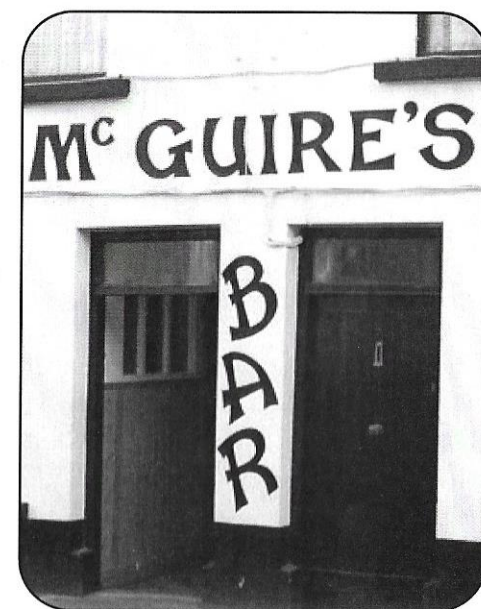

OVERVIEW - NAOMH ULTAN

In 1974 a meeting was held in St. Mary's hall, Dunkineely with a view to revive the Dunkineely GAA Club, which had been defunct for well over a decade. Gaelic football had been sorely neglected in the area of Bruckless, St. John's Pt. and the Croagh areas which beforehand had been hot beds of Gaelic activity.

The Club boundaries were drafted in 1975. These were from the Drimmakillew Bridge on the Eastern boundary to the Hollybush River on the West. The boundary in North is the Crooked Bridge, while the broad Atlantic bounds the club to the South. Since then these boundaries have been seriously encroached upon.

At a meeting in January 1975 there was a proposal from Fr. Patrick Cunningham P.P. that the Club be named after Saint Ultan. This proposal was seconded by Gerry Floyd who stated that there was a townland in the Parish named after him (namely Killultan). The adult football team played its first competitive match in 1975 against Glenfin. This first game was played in Fintragh, as the club's own pitch was not prepared at the time. Much thanks to the Killybegs Club for making the facility available whenever the need arose. Incidentally the much loved Pairc Mc Devitt closed its gates the same year as Naomh Ultan celebrated 40 years in existence.

Since 1974 the Club has been blessed with good hard working committees who have overseen the ideals of providing proper facilities for the playing of our Gaelic games. Pairc Naomh Ultan is a grand testament to their work. The Club at the moment cater for Under Age football from U8 up to Minors. Some years it can be a struggle with numbers.

The Club field a Senior and Reserve Team, but with a new rule from Croke Park, restricting many minors from playing adult football the Reserve teams future is in the balance. Croke Park should realize that in rural Ireland two or three players is the difference in fielding a team or not fielding a team.

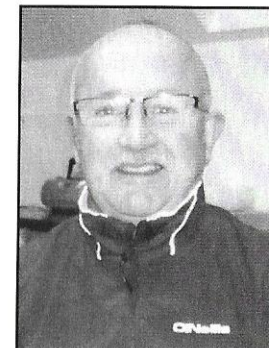

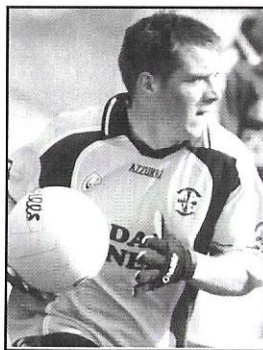

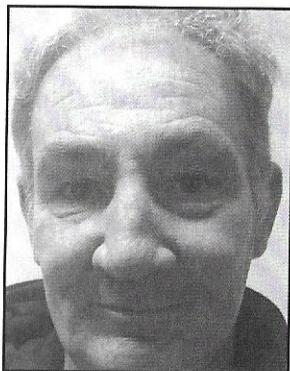

OVERVIEW - C.L.G. AODH RUA

The Red Hugh's G.A.A. club in Killygordon was one of the first clubs to register with the Donegal G.A.A. back in 1919. One of their first games played was against Letterkenny Rovers (a G.A.A. club in them days) in a friendly game. Paddy Hannigan, a Red Hugh's team member, was one of the most outstanding G.A.A. footballers of his time.

In 1980, a decision was made to form the club that is now well known as Red Hughs. The following year in 1981, the club won the Junior Championship along with the Division 3 title. The following year Red Hughs came second in the league and lost the Intermediate Championship final.

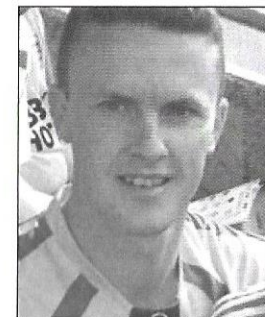
The 1980s and the early 1990s was the clubs most successful period in recent times. In those years they were among the top teams in the county contesting two county senior finals in 1986 and 1991 and winning Division One of the All County Football League in 1994. The also won the Division Two All County League in 1986 and 1992 the Division Two Shield in 1986. Other honours include the 1981 junior championship and 1981 Division Three All County league. The club's most recent success at senior level was in 2003, winning the Division Four League crown.

In March 2008 the club made the historic step and moved into their new state-of-the-art grounds at Monellan in the Cross, where teams from u10s to adult girls and boys ply their trade.

A chairde, As captain of the Red Hugh's team I am proud and privileged to lead the team out today in McCool park for this Junior A final.

As a club we have not had the success in championship football that we maybe deserved, with the last cup coming to the cross in the early 80's. Beaten senior finalists in 1986 and 1991 and more recently in the Junior A Final in 2003, a team I was also a part of.



Today we meet a familiar opponent in Naomh Ultan, passionate about their football like many parishes in Donegal. Naomh Ultan are a team on the up having gained promotion to Division 3 for 2016 with ourselves staring the drop at the other end. But today that will count for nothing as championship football is a totally different ball game and in the past month or so we have gained a bit of momentum with victories over Muff and Downings. Championship progression has been a lift that was needed within the team and confidence is high.

Good luck to both teams and I just hope we can edge it on the day and take the cup back to the Crossroads. A word of thanks to our mentors both past and present as well as the club board and our family and friends & supporters who continue to support us thru thick and thin.

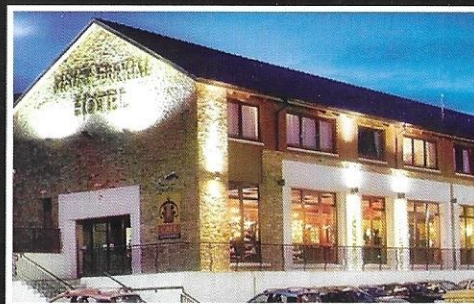
