Donegal won the battle for survival and will play in Division 2B of the Allianz National Hurling League again next year.

Donegal 2-16 Tyrone 2-12

This follows Saturday's hard fought but thoroughly deserved four point replay victory over Tyrone in Derry's Celtic Park. In an almost mirror image of the previous week's drawn encounter that went to extra-time in Owenbeg, Donegal were the more cohesive unit for most of the game and were the deserving victors at the end of the 70 plus minutes.

They led 2-6 to 0-6 at halftime. Ciaran Mathewson and Jack O'Loughlin scored the goals and Lee Henderson and Sean McVeigh poached the points.

Mathewson netted after four minutes when he stole into the defence after being picked out from way out the field by Christopher Mc-Dermott and hit the Tyrone rigging 16 minutes later for a super strike from a tight angle.

But as they had done seven days earlier, Tyrone stormed back into the game with goals from Conor Grogan and Damien Casey-a penalty- to draw level. Casey's penalty six minutes into the new half after Grogan was fouled levelled the game at 2-9 each.

There the similarities with the drawngame, Tyrone never hit the front, down in no small way to man of the match Sean McVeigh and his midfield partner Danny Cullen who also stepped up to the challenge.

And with McVeigh(2), Lee Henderson (2), Bernard Lafferty and Ronan McDermottlanding points Donegal outscored Tyrone by seven points to three in the closing 25 minutes to comfortably hold onto their league standing

"It was another epic battle. It was a match we were looking forward to all week and thank God we came out on the right side of the result and retained our Division 2 B status for next year," was Donegal manager Ray Durack's immediate reaction.

"Tyrone came out in the second half and they really piled on the pressure just like the did last week. But the big difference we stood up to them today when they drew level and we replied with a couple of good scores after they scored the second goal to draw level.

"It was a matter of matching them score for score from then to the finish and we did that and more, and finished the stronger team and there is no question about it we deserved to win the game."

Donegal had a number of big performances with Sean McVeigh and Danny Cullen prominent from very early - McVeigh scored five points all from play in one of his finest ever 70 minutes in a Donegal jersey.

Lee Henderson was top scorer once again with six points, two of them 65s while Enda McDermott, Ciaran Mathewsom, Joe Boyle and Jamsie Donnelly of the old guard also rose above the ordinary.

Of the younger brigade Jack O'Loughlin ended the game with 1-1 to his name while Pauric Doherty and Christopher McDermott were not found wanting when Tyrone threatened after half-time.

McDermott was especially effective when detailed to mark Tyrone's Gerard Gilmore who had his four point tally scored before the Burt man took up duty beside him for the closing ten minutes.

"Every one of the lads that wore the Donegal jersey there today gave 100% effort and commitment and while we had a number of outstanding individual performances, it took a team with every man that took to the field giving it everything they had," Durack said.

"They did not want to be demoted down to Division 3 for next year and they proved that out there today. Donegal hurling is slowly creeping up and to have dropped back down would have been a backward step, especially for the older lads who worked so hard to get up to 2B."

Tyrone and Donegal will meet again next weekend after finishing level in a drama-packed NHL Div 2B/3A relegation/promotion play-off at Owenbeg.

Thrills, twists and turns punctuated a memorable contest that saw the Red Hands battle back from eight points behind to earn a replay.

The dream of back-to-back promotions remains very much alive for Mattie Lennon's men, who provided further evidence of the progress they continue to make.

Skipper Damien Casey once again led by example with a 2-8 contribution, including an equalising free in the dying moments.

The Red Hands suffered an early blow when Donegal scrambled a goal inside the opening minute.

They failed to clear from Bernard Lafferty's long delivery, and full forward Ronan McDermott finished to the net from close range.

Goalkeeper John Devlin denied Mc-Dermott with a brave save at close quarters, and Donegal went ten minutes without a score, before Lee Henderson land a long range point, followed by a '65.

And in the 25th minute Donegal grabbed a second goal. Kevin Camp bell crossed from the left for McDer mott to flick home from close range.

A remarkable contest had many more twists to take, and Tyrone went in front three minutes from the end with a third goal, Sean Og Grogan finishing to the net after a Casey effort had been kept out by Dylan Laverty. Enda McDermott levelled

again, but the excellent Justin Kelly regained the lead, and it looked as if they were going to hold on for victory, but a controversial free gave Henderson the opportunity to tie it up in stoppage time at 3-10 each and send the tie to extra-time.

Tyrone's high levels of fitness gave them the edge in the opening period, and
