


Noel Mooney (An Cabhán)







EIRGRID GAN FOOTBALL -U21ALI-IRELAND CHAMPIONSHIP

EIRGRID'S ULSTER UNDER 21 FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

Donegal and Tyrone meet in the Ulster Under 21 Football Final for the first time since 2000. Cavan have collected the last four Ulster Under 21 Football titles. Donegal defeated Cavan in the 2010 decider while Tyrone have to go away back to 2006 for their last provincial success at this level. Tonight, these teams will be aiming to add their name to The Irish News Cup.

In the First Round, Derry overcame Down by four points at Celtic Park to secure a quarter final berth.

In the quarter finals, Donegal snatched a last gasp winning goal against the reigning champions to emerge 1-07 to 0-09 winners at Pairc MacCumhaill. Tyrone had a relatively comfortable win over Fermanagh at Healy Park as they won out on a 0-17 to 0-07 winners. In the other quarter final ties, there were wins for Monaghan over Derry at Inniskeen and Armagh over Antrim at the Athletic Grounds, albeit after the original fixture was postponed due to a floodlight failure.

In the semi finals, there were surprisingly comfortable victories for both tonights challengers. Donegal had the goal touch over Monaghan in torrential rain at Healy Park while Tyrone had four points to spare over Armagh at Kingspan Breffni Park.

Donegal have been extremely miserly in defence. The defence is marshalled by team captain Ryan McHugh while Conor Parke and Conor Morrison have been impressive so far. Hugh McFadden has been excellent in the middle, while Eoin McHugh and Lorcan Connor are in great form in a hard working attack.

Tyrone are a well organised

outfit who have an abundance of speed in their ranks. Team captain is Kieran McGeary while his club mate Frank Burns, Cathal McShane and Rory Brennan have been in fine form thus far.

Feargal Logan and Maxi Curran have their teams well prepared and it is poised for another great encounter. A fortnight ago, Donegal destroyed Tyrone at both minor and senior level. Tonights encounter will be much closer. Tyrone by two!!




