

History

The Masters Football competition has been running for over twenty years now and was the brainchild of the Mick Loftus. Up until 2009 the competition was organised and supported by the GAA. Following the 2009 competition, the GAA sought to disband the competition citing insurance, discipline and a variety of other issues. Over the following two years attempts were made to resume competitive Masters Footbal Unfortunately, despite the best efforts of many on both sides to resume games under the auspices of the GAA the only option was for Masters footballers to go it alone and the Gaelic Masters Association was formed

Over the last five years, having organised and obtained our own insurance, the Masters competition ha thrived and grown from five counties in 2012, to nine counties have competed in 2011 (Antrim, Cavar Dublin, Galway, Leitrim, Longford, Mayo, Monaghan and Tyrone) to 12 in 2016, with Offaly, Donegal and Sligo competing. Two of these sides, Offaly and Donegal, contest our Shield final. There are a number of othe counties in the process of organising themselves to compete in 2017, including Roscommon and Kildare.

Many competitive and enjoyable games have been played and the standard of football has beer consistently high. This year's final sees Mayo attempting to win their first title since 2009, and their eightlin total. Cavan are hoping to add to the titles they won in 1993 and 1996.

The increased profile of the Masters game, largely as a result of Irish TVs coverage in the last two years, was added to this year by the resumption of the International Rules with two tests against the touring AFL Masters side.










Brian Gavin: From All-Ireland Final Ref to Masters Selector





Having refereed four All-Ireland hurling finals, Brian Gavin is a household name in any house that has even a passing interest in the GAA. He's associated with letting the game flow and being able to discern between robust physicality and skulduggery. He's known for that, and the whack he took from Tommy Walsh's hurl in the nose in the 2011 All-Ireland final! So how did the man with the whistle in Tipp's 2016 final win over Kilkenny get drawn into becoming an Offaly selector in Masters football?

Thinking of Brian as a hurling man is only half the story. He has Leinster Vocational medals in football with Ardscoil Chiaran of Clara and has refereed Offaly Senior Football Championship games in 2001 and 2003. He recounts that he 'always liked football, playing it and reffing it' and he always had a 'good feel for the game'.

Interestingly, hurling had a part in Brian's introduction to Masters football. After refereeing the Galway-Dublin Leinster Hurling quarter-final replay last June in Tullamore, the Offaly county board secretary, Tommy Byrne, introduced Brian to Pat Cullinane, the Gaelic Masters Development Officer. Pat had been in contact with Tommy about the possibility of an Offaly Masters side signing up. Following the game, Pat was beckoned out of the crowd by the county secretary to follow him across O'Connor Park and to wait outside the referee's changing room. When Brian emerged, Tommy simply said to Pat: 'This is your man!' Brian and Pat got talking about the Masters set-up and it got Brian's wheels turning about the possibility of an Offaly involvement. Pat Cullinane says that he knew straight away

after that brief meeting with the outgoing Brian that they'd a good man on the job, and that Offaly would feature in the Masters' 2016 scheduling.

Later that year, Brian refereed the Masters' semi-final between Galway and Mayo, and he liked what he saw. After that game, he met with Ken Keelaghan of Rhode and Ciaran'sod' Daly of Cloghan, and when they put their heads together they quickly drew up a list of likely lads to form a panel. As Brian says, 'From that meeting, it just took wings. We knew from the responses we got from the first few phone calls that we'd get a good side together. Then the Whatsapp got set up and with the banter over and back, it took of altogether!'

Brian continued: 'Ken is the manager, and he's a great man to head it up. Sod (Ciaran Daly) knows all the footballers of that vintage well, and I'm delighted to be involved with such a talented bunch. The craic is mighty too. While it's not too serious, there's still that competitive edge to matches and I'd expect the game with Donegal to be a great battle with good football.

Donegal are another side making a return to Masters football after a prolonged absence. 2016 too saw them fall just short of the senior semi-finals; the two sides could, with a little more luck and Masters experience, be in the Senior final.

The backbone of this Offaly team is made up of guys who brought Offaly to Leinster glory in 1997, beating Meath, and won the National League title a year later beating Derry in the final. While many counties find that their former inter-county stars simply have too much mileage done on heavy roads, the Offaly contingent was in good order. Cathal Daly, John Kenny, Jimmy Grennan, Colm Quinn and Roy Malone were good to go. Throw in to the mix men like Conor Connelly who played inter-county for Roscommon and they've the basis of a strong outfit.

On Offaly's year thus far, Brian says they're delighted to have gotten involved and are looking forward to today's contest. However, there's no sense of Brian or Offaly being happy to stand still. He says that as a management and squad they've 'learnt a lot from coming up against the seasoned teams like Galway and Mayo'. Using the rolling substitutions astutely is one aspect the management team are now more attuned to. He also likes that there's no secrets between teams in that the established teams are more than willing to give advice on their structures and training arrangements. Next year he believes they'll be well-equipped to challenge for major honours.

Brian himself turns 40 in July of 2017 but he skilfully deflects the question as to whether he'll tog himself in 2017, 'Even if I'm selector, I'd be doing well to get picked!'


