# Donegal's strength

DECLAN Bonner's second stint in charge of Donegal got off to an excellent start on Wednesday night, as his team cantered to victory against Queen's University Belfast in Mac-Cumhaill Park.

Bonner's side were superior to their opponents in all facets of the game, and the result was never in question.

Michael Langan produced a manof-the-match display as he kicked 1-6 from full-forward.

Debutant Nathan Mullins also bagged a goal on what was a night of positives for Bonner, as he looks to prepare his side for the National Football League which begins on the last weekend in January.

Storm Eleanor made underfoot conditions very difficult, but Mac-Cumhaill Park passed a pitch inspection early in the day and the game went ahead.

Declan Bonner, who was beginning his second tenure in charge of the Donegal senior team, started with eight of the players that won the Ulster Under 21 title last year, and there was also a midfield slot for Nathan Mullins, who impressed for St Vincent's in the Dublin Senior Championship last year.

Under 21 side, Lorcan Connor, lined out at corner-forward for Queen's University.

The Belfast side were managed by former Armagh star Aidan O'Rourke, and he set his team out defensively.

However, Donegal started well with Langan registering an early free, and team captain Hugh McFadden lofted over from distance.

St Michael's clubman Langan was catching the eye at full-forward, and he tagged on three points for the home side.

A super interception from Aidan Rushe prevented Donegal from scoring a goal early in the match, but Bonner's team did break through for a goal in the 17th minute.

McFadden started the move with a good turnover, and Michael Carroll

released Niall O'Donnell, who saw his shot saved by Callum Mullan-Young. Unfortunately for the Watty Graham's goalkeeper, Langan was in the right position to tap home.

Donegal looked in good shape for the opening game of their campaign, and it was clear that they were placing more emphasis on kick-passing, although that ploy wasn't always successful.

Queen's offered little in attack, but they did score a free in the 31st minute from Tiarnan Rushe, and Conor Martin tagged on another two minutes later after Jack Dowling was fouled.

Mullan-Young pulled off another good save to deny Jamie Brennan a goal, but Donegal did hit the net for a second time on the stroke of halftime.

McFadden miscued his shot, but it was allowed to bounce by the Queen's defence, and Mullins powered through to slap the ball to the net.

Donegal led by 2-5 to 0-2 at the interval, and they continued to dictate the play in the second half.

Jamie Brennan pointed 19 seconds after the resumption, and he then played a great pass into Langan, who fielded superbly, but his left-footed effort went over the bar.

Queen's could have had a goal at the other end but Peter Boyle superbly saved Emmet Bradley's effort and the ball dropped over the crossbar.

The lively Brennan pointed for Donegal, while substitute Cian Mulligan made a telling impact off the bench with two excellent scores.

Ciaran McGinley could have had a goal but fired over before Langan (free) and Caolan McGonagle registered scores for Donegal.

Bradley and Tiarnan Rushe landed two late frees for O'Rourke's side, but the game was long over at that point.

Darach O'Connor got on the scoreboard, while Mulligan crashed a shot against the post.

Shea Heffron received his marching orders late on, before Bradley and Caolan Ward swapped scores at the death.

It was a solid opener for Bonner's team but they are sure to get a stiffer test on Sunday when they take on Monaghan.

#### MAN OF THE MATCH

Michael Langan scored 1-6 in an excellent display for Donegal, while Shea Heffron was giving his marching orders for a foul on the St Michael's clubman. With Michael Murphy set to sit out the early stages of the league, Langan put his hand up as a potential full-forward, and was particularly impressive in the air. The midfield partnership of Hugh McFadden and Nathan Mullins also impressed, as did Tony McClenaghan, while Cian Mulligan looked really sharp when introduced.
