Gallagher's Fermanagh edge Donegal

RORY Gallagher made a winning return to MacCumhaill Park on Wednesday night, as his Fermanagh side defeated Donegal to advance to the semi-finals.

Gallagher managed Donegal for three seasons before taking over the reins of his native Fermanagh, and his side started brightly.

However, 1-2 from substitute Jamie Brennan in a four-minute spell put Donegal in a commanding position and they led by three points at half-time.

Seamus Quigley rolled back the years for Fermanagh with 1-7 and his 47th minute goal was the pivotal moment in the match.

That gave Gallagher's team a cushion that they never looked like relinquishing and they will now play Tyrone in the last four on Sunday.

There was heavy fog in Ballybofey, but the game was given the go-ahead.

Fermanagh came into the game on the back of a good win over Monaghan, and a less impressive victory against Queen's University, Belfast on Sunday, but they knew a triumph against Donegal would see them top Section C.

Donegal suffered frustration at the weekend when their game against the Farney county was postponed seven minutes after it was meant to have thrown in.

Gallagher enjoyed good success in Ballybofey as Donegal manager, and

his team started with pace and hunger

Declan McCusker fired over after two minutes, and then Seamus Quigley converted a free after Ryan Lyons was fouled.

Donegal were slow and ponderous in possession in the first ten minutes, and they were dealt a blow when Odhran MacNiallais was black-carded for a foul on Eoin Donnelly.

Quigley slotted over the resulting placed ball from 50 metres to put the Erne county three points ahead.

Declan Bonner wouldn't have been happy with his side's opening spell, but Niall O'Donnell kicked a free in the 14th minute, and Ciaran McGinley curled over seconds later.

Donegal then broke through for a goal in the 20th minute, and it was the first time in the encounter that they were able to inject real pace into a move.

Paul Brennan fed possession inside to Darach O'Connor, who popped inside to Tony McClenaghan.

The Merville man could have gone for goal himself but instead elected to pass the ball to Jamie Brennan, and the Bundoran forward's palmed effort found the net despite the best efforts of Fermanagh goalkeeper Patrick Cadden.

Jamie Brennan was electric and he added two points in quick succession – the first a fist effort, and the second a rare score off his left foot.

Donegal started to dominate Fermanagh's kick-outs and closed their opponents in at their own goal.

O'Donnell pushed Donegal five points ahead in the 26th minute, and

they then created two goal chances in the space of a minute.

Ciaran McGinley broke through after a sweeping move, but the Kilcar man blazed his shot wide.

Seconds later, they were through again, with McClenaghan playing a clever pass inside to the impressive Nathan Mullins.

The St Vincent's man, who got through a lot of work in the first half, slipped as he collected the ball, but he still managed to get a shot away, and it would have hit the net if it wasn't for Che Cullen's brilliant clearance.

Fermanagh went 17 minutes without a score, before Danny Teague curled over a sumptuous score.

Quigley converted a late '45' to leave just three points between the sides at the interval.

Gallagher's men looked sharp on their return to the pitch with Quigley converting another long-range free, and Declan McCusker also dissected the posts.

O'Donnell replied with a free, but Fermanagh drew level after good scores from Barry Mulrone and Eoin Donnelly.

Stephen McBrearty and Quigley traded points, before Gallagher's side hit the net in the 47th minute.

Paul McCusker drove the ball in towards the edge of the square, and Quigley rose above Eamonn Doherty and Mark Anthony McGinley to fist

the ball into the empty net.

That put the Erne men three points ahead, and Quigley pushed that out to four with a free.

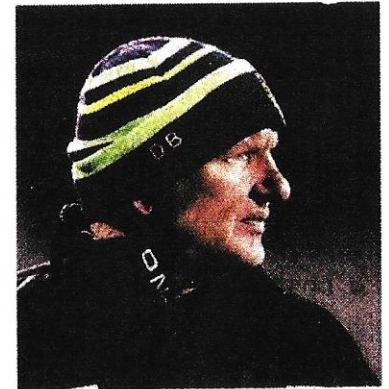
McBrearty kept Donegal in the mix, but Aidan Breen cancelled that out, and the home side were guilty of some poor misses.

Donnelly could have killed off proceedings, but somehow put his goal chance wide, and O'Donnell punished that miss by making it a three-point game down the other end.

Quigley tagged on another free, before Alan Lyons made an eventful start to his county career, as he was booked and spurned a goal chance just two minutes into his debut.

Hugh McFadden pointed late on, but it wasn't enough, and Fermanagh held on for victory and a semi-final fixture with Tyrone on Sunday.
