Strong Donegal team

MONAGHAN 0-19 DONEGAL 4-17

DONEGAL cantered through to the semi-finals of the Dr McKenna Cup after they hammered Monaghan in Clones on Sunday.

Declan Bonner lined out a strong team, and while they struggled defensively in the first half, they still led by 2-9 to 0-10 at half-time with Odhran MacNiallais and Ryan McHugh scoring the goals.

Man of the Match Patrick McBrearty and Jamie Brennan added three-pointers in the second period, while Monaghan missed two penalties.

The result was good enough to see Donegal finish as the best runners-up from the three sections, and they advance to the semi-finals of the pre-season competition for the first time in eight years.

Donegal came into the game off a disappointing defeat to Fermanagh, but they knew that a win in Clones would secure them a spot in Wednesday night's semi-final.

The Kilcar contingent of Mark McHugh, Patrick McBrearty, and Ryan McHugh all made their first appearance of the season from the start, while Leo McLoone was also in from the off at centre half-back.

McBrearty kicked the first score of the afternoon from a free, but Jack McCarron quickly cancelled that out.

Donegal swooped for a well-worked goal in the seventh minute. Nathan Mullins carried possession forward before finding Caolan McGonagle, who slipped inside to MacNiallais. The Gaoth Dobhair man steadied himself with a dummy and then fired to the net.

Bonner's side could have had another goal two minutes later when MacNiallais intercepted Shane Garland's short kick-out but McBrearty's pick-up let him down at the crucial time.

James Wilson replied for Monaghan before McBrearty and Darach O'Connor slotted over for the visitors.

The Farney county hit back with three on the trot from Conor McCarthy, James Mealiff, and Micheal Bannigan (free) as Donegal

struggled to win their own kick-outs. There was a fast pace to the game,

There was a last pace to the game, and Mark McHugh and Jack McCarron (free) exchanged scores, and then McCarthy levelled proceedings.

McBrearty nudged Bonner's team back in front after Darren Hughes had made a good block from MacNiallais, but two more efforts from the lively McCarron saw the lead change hands.

However, Donegal finished the half strongly and they scored a second goal in the 28th minute.

Paul Brennan failed to hold Mac-Niallais' pass, but the ball broke to

Jamie Brennan who slipped inside to Ryan McHugh, and the 2016 All-Star palmed to the net.

Jamie Brennan and Bannigan (free) traded points, but Donegal hit the last three scores of the half, with McBrearty notching two frees, and Ryan McHugh lofting over from distance, and the away side led by five at the break.

Monaghan were granted a wonderful opportunity to pull back their deficit when they were awarded a penalty just 15 seconds after the restart.

McCarron was pulled down by Donegal goalkeeper Shaun Patton, but the Monaghan full-forward fired his spot-kick well wide.

O'Connor punished Monaghan down at the other end, but Mealiff had another goal opportunity which he drilled over.

McCarron scored another free for Malachy O'Rourke's team., but Donegal soon got on top with McBrearty converting two placed balls.

The Kilcar ace then added a goal to his collection when he got on the end of MacNiallais' excellent pass, and Garland couldn't keep out his powerful effort.

McBrearty slotted over a sixth free, before Patton made a good stop with his feet from Darren Hughes.

Donegal were the fitter side, and when they broke at pace Monaghan couldn't keep up. They blitzed through their opponents again in the 51st minute with McBrearty and Martin O'Reilly combining, before Jamie Brennan crashed to the net.

O'Connor added another score to Donegal's tally, before Monaghan hit three in succession with McCarron (free), Bannigan, and Neil McAdam all on target.

Jamie Brennan curled over for Bonner's side as the jizz went out of the contest, and Bannigan and MacNiallais swapped placed balls.

McCarron (2) and Jamie Brennan both added to their tallies, before Monaghan won another penalty deep into injury-time when Patton fouled McCarthy.

Bannigan saw his effort expertly saved by Patton, and while they recycled the ball to Owen Duffy, who pointed, it was nothing more than a consolation, as Donegal march on to the last four.

MAN OF THE MATCH
