KILCAR roll into the quarter-finals of the Donegal SFC after another pulsating win yesterday.

John McNulty's team were under siege in the closing stages but, as they had done seven days previously against Glenswilly, they held their mettle under stern cross examination.

Colm McFadden netted a penalty to set up a grandstand finale, but it was disappointment for St Michael's, who just couldn't summons a riposte to Patrick McBrearty's inspired Kilcar.

McBrearty is a man on fire these days - and he shot eight magnificent points here as Kilcar laid down yet more evidence of their credentials,

While McBrearty was the masterpiece and some of his points were exquisite, there was much more about Kilcar to admire.

Ryan McHugh netted the 18th minute goal that was the big score of a first half that Kilcar held sway after by 1-10 to 0-07.

McHugh's, too, was a superb performance, one from which he scored 1-3 and Michael Hegarty rolled back the years with another majestic display at centrefield.

Hegarty landed two beauties in first-half stoppage time to hand his side a six-point interval lead.

Having been held to a surprise draw at Bundoran in match day one, this was seen as an encounter of the 'must win' variety by the locals - and they started as if offended by the question marks sewn last weekend.

Martin McElhinney drilled over the opener inside 90 seconds and Andrew Kelly polished off a neat move to double the advantage.

It didn't take long for Kilcar, and McBrearty in particular, to click into the high gears. Three times in a fourminute spell, McBrearty split the sticks to put Kilcar 0-4 to 0-2 in front. McBrearty arrowed over one firsttime effort over the shoulder after Ciaran McGinley thumped the ball down the right channel and his eighthminute score saw him fetch high, feint

and shoot after being picked out by a route one ball from Mark McHugh.

Daniel McLaughlin and Brian McLaughlin scored to draw the hosts level, but in the space of sixty seconds McBrearty defied the logic of mathematics before Hegarty thundered over from long range.

Kilcar had been involved in a rugged battle with Glenswilly last weekend, but this was a more open contest and certainly one that was more aesthetically pleasing for the purists in attendance.

The Kilcar goal was a superblyworked effort. McBrearty's prints were all over it, his deft ball across the danger zone finding Ryan McHugh and he dropped the shoulder before firing across Ciaran Gallagher to the back of the net.

Colm McFadden came with two responses for St Michael's, but it was a devastating Kilcar that finished the half in style, Hegarty brilliantly finding range and accuracy with two from distance.

Already staring at a cliff face, St Michael's were dealt yet further heartache when two of their more noted battlers, Stephen Black and Peter Witherow, were forced to withdraw injured at the break.

With Stephen Coyle, a sub, scoring three points as St Michael's marched back, especially when they came to within four after Coyle (2), McFadden and Daniel McLaughlin landed points in a busy, productive three-minute spell.

Two apiece, however, from McBrearty and Ryan McHugh had kept Kilcar at arm's length, while Coyle had gone close to a goal in the early moments of part two.

There were just 16 seconds of the half gone when he shot narrowly wide after a lung-bursting surge from McElhinney opened the possibility.

McBrearty pushed the stack of chips to Kilcar's side of the table with two fine points that ensured the southwest men had enough to spare when they came under the cosh - but only just.

All the while, Kilcar are safe in the knowledge that they have a quarter-final berth secured - and should do so as group winners, provided they beat Bundoran in their final game.

There is much to be admired about their resolve these days. In beating Glenswilly and St Michael's in this manner, they're showing commendable strength in mentality - and with Eoin McHugh to return and with yesterday marking the SFC debut of Stephen McBrearty, who came on for the final ten minutes, the future's bright in Towney.

St Michael's perhaps showed a little naivety in not doubling up regularly on McBrearty, but as his haul of 16 points in two weekends shows, this is a player really in the sort of form that sends shudders down the spine of prospective opponents.

St Michael's now in a nervy wait to the final group day, but Kilcar joyous at advancement: it's this emotional contrast that engrains these days in the minds.



KILCAR won on their last competitive trip to O'Donnell Park but left Letterkenny scratching their heads on Good Friday having been annihilated by St Eunan's on the first day of the season.

Last September the side then managed by James McHugh outfoxed St Eunan's in the first round, first leg, of the SFC only to go down to a late goal from Ross Wherity in the winner-takes-all play-off one chilly October night in Convoy.

## McBrearty's first half goal sends Kilcar to the top

KILCAR shot to the top of the pile in Division 1 after inflicting a first defeat of the season on St Michael's in a real game of two halves at wintry, windy Dunfanaghy yesterday afternoon

Kilcar failed to score in the second half, but they'd done enough in an economical first period that ensured they could stave off a strong St Michael's comeback when it inevitably arrived.

The problem for St Michael's was that their sthring fightback came just a little too late, though there were moments when it seemed as if Ciaran Gallagher's 53rd minute goal was going to be the catalyst for a turnaround.

The conditions were horrendous for the players and certainly took the tone of a game between two of the county's more refined sides down a few notches.

There were still enough flashes in the game to make it enjoyable, with Patrick McBrearty in particular providing some of the game's more stellar moments.

#### First defeat of 2013 for St Michael's

There was a blistering goal in the 22nd minute and a peerless kick from the right touchline in the closing minutes of the first half from a player who seems unburdened by the headlines he's made in recent weeks.

His team should have been on home soil yesterday, but the unseasonable weather meant an eleventhhour reversal to The Bridge.

Kilcar were down the services of Mark McHugh, though there were considerable voids across the St Michael's lines, with none of Antoin McFadden, Michael Gallagher, Brian McLaughlin, Daniel McLaughlin or Michael McGinley available for selection.

The absences, in particular, of those surging bursts from the half-back line of the powerful McFadden and Gallagher, following impressive displays in Monday's Comortas Peile na Gaeltachta final win, curtailed the attacking strengths of the home side.

It was Kilcar, wind firmly in their sails, who opened the brighter.

Just seventy had passed when Michael Hegarty shot Kilcar ahead and his midfield compatriot David McShane doubled the lead with a superb long-range score in the third minute.

McBrearty won, and subsequently pointed a free off Stephen Black before Hegarty brilliantly tucked over the black spot after McBrearty had cleverly worked a sideline ball into a more central position.

A majestic 45-metre free from McBrearty, deliciously curled over to near-perfection with the breeze carrying where he intended.

It was the 13th minute before St Michael's managed a shot in anger, but Colm McFadden duly obliged with the conversion of a free awarded after Martin McElhinney was fouled by Conor McShane.

By the interval, just two more points were posted by the hosts -


James Alcorn and Andrew Kelly managing to get through gale to score – while there was a very debatable 'score' by McFadden ruled wide.

McBrearty is a player whose confidence is sky high right now – and a truly magnificent sideline free from the right-hand side of the 13-metre line that salled through the posts was a kick that perfectly demonstrated, in such conditions, where the mercury on his self-belief thermometer is resting.

A pop over the shoulder put his own tally out to 1-4 and Hegarty's third of the afternoon, another fine hit from distance, put the visitors ten clear as they parted for the solace of the dressing rooms.

80 seconds into the second half, St Michael's 'keeper Ciaran Gallagher got down late but decisively on time to beat away Ciaran McGinley's snap shot. From there, though, the traffic continued to have a one-way dimension to it.

McFadden swung over the opening four points of the second half. McElhinney barged into a position where he might well have rattled the net, but in this instance he prodded just wide.

Seven minutes from the end the lifeline arrived. Christy Toye, starting for the first time this season, forced a turnover and made ground before releasing to Gallagher, who slammed high into the roof of the Kilcar net.

Toye and the substitute Lee Carr nailed points to tee up a frenetic finale with their side now just a point down. The afternoon ended on something of a sour note with the referee, Michael Mulhern, surrounded by irate St Michael's folk, who were incensed at the timing of the final whistle, which came just as their side were beginning to ponder one last assault on the Kilcar goal through Mc-Fadden.

With a considerable list of absentees, St Michael's won't be overly concerned by this loss, particularly given the conditions in which they played, but Kilcar sit top of the pile and in a position of strength now with Championship looming.

Neilly doing it quietly

Colaiste Na Carraige are back on top of the pile in Donegal schools football. On Tuesday last, the Carrick nursery claimed a fourth Donegal senior schools championship in five years with a comfortable 12 point final victory over Carndonagh C.S.

C.S.

It is a remarkable story, and a great record for any school, but even more remarkable in that Colaiste Na Carraige is the smallest of all the schools competing in Donegal schools' competitions.

schools' competitions.

The school currently has just a little over 200 pupils (boys and girls) on its roll book. Carrick Vocational School, as it was formerly known, has always had a proud Gaelic tradition and has produced many great players down the years.

It holds the distinction of being the only Donegal school to win an Ulster Senior Schools Championship (Markey Cup). That was back in 1985, and 1992

That was back in 1985, and 1992 Donegal All-Ireland winners John Joe Doherty and Noel Hegarty were influential members of that all conquering team.

But that 1985 team apart, the school's raid on Donegal silverware was random and of the occasional variety rather than that experienced in the last five years. The school is blessed with a pool

The school is blessed with a pool of talented players drawn from two of the county's proudest clubs Kilcar and Naomh Columba.

But it is no coincidence either, that the current golden spell has coincided with the arrival of one Neilly Byrne as school coach.

Neilly, a native of Glenties, and a former Glenties and Kilcar player - with whom he won three senior championships - is a coach of some renown in underage club and schools' football.

"I was asked back in 2008 by Padraig O'Leime, to come and do some coaching and lend a hand. Padraig was the vice-principal at the time, and has since taken over from Tony Bonner as principal, and I have been there ever since and I have to admit things have gone well for us," said Neilly, who is also coach to the schools U-14s and U-16s as well as seniors.

"There is a huge interest in sport and especially football in the school and there is a great tradition of football at the school going back to Barry Campbell's time and the team that won the Markey

"The teachers are brilliant and really very committed. Noel Ward manages the seniors, Gareth Doherty is the manager of the U-14s and Paddy Boyle is manager of the U-16s. They are all very interested and give a huge commitment and are just as enthusiant as the seniors."

players.

"They stay back after school, and never miss a training sessions. They even give up some of their holiday time and that kind of commitment rubs off on the players and plays a big part in our success."

Of all the last five school years, the 2009/10 season has been the most successful when it comes to achievements for one year's football. In 2009/10, alongside Noel Ward, Neilly masterminded and Colaiste Na Carraige completed the

clean sweep of Donegal schools' championships.

"2009/10 was an unbelievable year alright. We won the county U-14, U-16 and senior and reached the U-16 Ulster final and senior semi-final, losing the senior to Castewellan who went on to win the All-Ireland and the U-16 to Holy Trinity, Cookstown.

"It was disappointing at the time to lose the senior semi-final to Castlewellan and the U-16 final to Cookstown. But when you consider that and the Markey Cup, in their sights once again, and will be aiming to take their first tentative steps on the road to another Markey final when they face Southern College.

# COLÁISTE NA CARRAIGE

I was sitting at a table with a number of principals of second level schools in the county recently. As is often the case at such occasions, the topic of conversation came around to football. The focus moved to schools football and eventually to the question about Coláiste na Carraige. What is it about Coláiste na Carraige and football?

One very knowledgeable person, with many years involvement in football, ventured an explanation. He recalled that our school had been featured in a daily newspaper a couple of years ago. The article referred to the school as having an extraordinary tradition and presence in second level football in Donegal and indeed in Ulster. He ventured that Carrick was 'a nursery' for football and that the students had it in the genes!!! This is a fair comment and certainly part of the story but it is not quite the full picture.

As we approach the Christmas break of 2013, I would like to take a look back over the past year, which in itself gives an insight into the school. It has been another remarkable one.

Our U14 team, managed by Mr. Gareth Doherty, did not have a very successful year at the end of 2012/early 2013. That being said, they only lost narrowly to eventual Ulster finalists, Abbey Vocational School. However, in their first three games in this academic year, they have been very impressive, defeating Abbey Vocational School, Rosses CS and Glenties Comprehensive School. They have qualified for the County Semi-Final under their joint captains Brian O'Donnell and Aaron Doherty.

Mr. Paddy Boyle had contrasting form with the U16 team. In the early part of 2013, we had the joy of witnessing Pádraig Byrne, Teelin, raising the cup to win the county title. The final was played in Ballybofey against Gaoth Dobhair, with Coláiste na Carraige winning on a scoreline of 1-10 to 3-03. They went on to the Ulster final, but unfortunately came up short on the day. This year the U16 team has won only one of its first three games, making qualification for the final stages a difficult task.

The Senior team, managed by Mr. Noel Ward, has built on the successes of both the Senior and U16 teams of last year. So far they have won both of their matches. They have defeated Falcarragh and await the winners of St. Columba's College, Stranorlar and the Rosses Community School to play in a County Semi-Final.

During the year we had other noteworthy achievements:

- In February 2013, Leaving Certificate student Eoin McHugh made his debut with the county Senior
- Martin Byrne, Stephen Jones, Aodhán McGinley and Stephen McBrearty all were members of the County Minor Panel in 2013.
- Stephen Jones, Leaving Certificate student 2013, has the remarkable achievement of having won a county title in each of the six years that he attended Coláiste na Carraige.



- Conor Doherty, Pádraig Byrne, Jamie McGinley and Ryan Gillespie were all members of the Donegal Vocational Schools team that won the Ulster title on Wednesday 27th November 2013. Donegal defeated Cavan on a scoreline of 3-13 to 1-13. Conor, who contributed 1 point, and Pádraig were both playing on the team.
- The aforementioned Conor Doherty was Sports Player of the Month in February 2013.

Down through the years, hundreds of students have worn the school colours with pride and passion. They have given joy and at times some heart-stopping moments to those of us who have watched from the sideline. So what is it about one of the smallest schools in the county that it defies the odds in the football arena? There are a number of factors contributing to it:

- There is indeed high-class natural talent in the area.
- The commitment, dedication and hard work that both the students and the coaches/managers are putting into it.
- The self-belief and never-say-die attitude that is brought to every game.
- The support that the school has received from both clubs, CLG Chill Chartha and CLG Naomh Columba. This support has been hugely crucial. Not having our own pitch or resources means that we are completely dependent on the clubs. They have always been completely supportive and for that I am extremely grateful.

- In addition we are blessed with terrific parental and community support. The school has also been able to draw on the expertise of people like Paddy Hegarty and Rory Gallagher in the past. However, there are two individuals in particular that I want to mention. Neily Byrne and Damien Carr have been unfailing in their support and have been key factors in our successes.
- Finally, there is a huge sense of pride in the school and a wish to emulate the feats of past years.

When one thinks about the past, there are many feats and glorious days in the sun; I will mention but a few. In 2009/10 the school achieved one of the truly remarkable feats in Donegal schools' football, by winning all three county titles in the one season. It is still the only school in the county that has won the Markey Cup, the Ulster Senior Vocational Schools Championship. That was achieved in 1985, with Roger McShane as captain. Many past pupils have won All-Ireland medals, either at Vocational, U21 or Senior level. Martin, James and Mark McHugh, John Joe Doherty, Noel Hegarty and Patrick McBrearty are now household names and rightly so. But there is one more name that I think needs to be added, it is that of Barry Campbell. Barry is held in the highest regard by past pupils of the school, as can be seen when one reads the history of the school Sceal Scoile 1950 – 2013. He was a superb coach and a man well ahead of his time.

When you put all of these factors together, one then gets a sense of how and why our school does so well in football. I am privileged to be principal of a great school, small in size, but when it comes to football it punches way above its weight. I would like to thank all of the students and teachers, parents and community members who have supported us and given us many memorable moments down through the years.

## CARRICK'S SUCCESS JUST KEEPS FLOWING

On 15th January 2013 Eoin McHugh, captain of Coláiste Na Carraige, accepted the County Vocational Schools Cup from Donegal Senior All-Ireland winner Patrick McBrearty. Included in the presentation group was Gareth Doherty, Vocational Schools Administrator.

For a school of its size, Coláiste na Carraige just keeps raising the bar. The school houses around 200 pupils, half of them boys, and yet is the yardstick when it comes to vocational schools football in Donegal. In recent years, the school has reached heady heights indeed. Tuesday's comfortable win over Carndonagh Community School saw a fourth Senior title in five years head back to Carrick. Last year was the odd one out when they were beaten by Rosses Community School in the Semi-Final.

2009/10 was the golden school year for Carrick as a clean sweep of U14, U16 and Senior titles headed for the south-west. That year, their U16s reached the Ulster U16 final, losing out to Holy Trinity, Cookstown. To be even competing with such names as Holy Trinity Cookstown is staggering for a school of its size.

And yet Coláiste na Carraige has a rich heritage on this stage. They remain the only Donegal school to win a Markey Cup title, a team including John Joe Doherty winning there in 1985. In many ways, they could be seen to be punching above their weight, but the longevity and the conveyor belt dismisses this notion. Next week, their U16s are in Semi-Final action, while this batch of Senior players are out in Ulster against Southern Regional College from Newry.

Just two clubs provide players to the school, but the fierce rivalry of Naomh Columba and Cill Chartha is laid at the gates of the school when they unite in the Carrick colours. "The minor teams of the two clubs are going well at the minute – both were in finals in 2012," said Coláiste na Carraige senior manager, Noel Ward.

Having lost two marquee names from the class of last term that reached only a Semi-Final, hopes weren't high, but again they enter the provincial route in hopeful mood. # Doherty shoots Coláiste na Carraige to another county title

COLÁSITE na Carraige toasted their second county school's triumph in the space of a week after Conor Doherty held his nerve to fire over two late frees to win the U16 A title at the expense of Pobail Scoil Ghaoth Dobhair on Friday afternoon.

Ten days after the school defeated Carndonagh Community School to claim the sensor title, a strong contingent from that team were working their magic to help land the U16 contivalent.

Centre-forward Doherty, scorer of 1-1 last week, was one of five players that started the senior decider who also lined up from the off in Friday's U16 final, while Dominic Gallagher and Paurie O'Neill, both replacements last week, also featured from the start.

The senior triumph was Colaiste na Carraige's fourth in five years and their U16 win was their third in four.

However, their latest success was not easy come by as the south-west school – responsible for producing players of the calibre of Martin McHagh, James McHagh, John Joe Doherty, Noel Hegarty, Mark McHagh and Patrick McBrearty – had to come from behind on several occasions. Pobail Scoil Ghaoth Dobbair, competing in their first county final at the U16 grade, slammed home two goals in the space of a minute in the latter stages of the first-half through Shane Ferry and Claran Gillespie to give them a firm grip on the contest heading in at the break (2-1 to 0-2).

However, an opportunistic goal from Paddy Byrne inside a minute of the restart preceded points from Doherty – who ended the game with seven – and Pauric O'Neill as Paddy Byrne's side edged in front with a quarter of an hour to go.

But again their opponents found the back of the net as Gavin McBride delicately flicked the ball beyond goalkeeper Michael Cunningham to put Poball Scoil Ghaoth Dobhair back on the front-foot.

It was the last time they held the lead, though, as Colaiste na Carraige rattled off five of the remaining seven scores to claim a narrow onepoint win to spark all-too familiar scenes of celebration for the southwest outfit.

Their insistence to work the ball from deep ultimately reaped dividends but it looked, at times, like Ghaoth Dobhair's more direct approach might well have proven more successful.

Conor Doherty scored the only two points in the opening 18 minutes of action as the lads from the northwest were made to pay for their profligacy in front of the posts, which accounted for six wides in the first quarter of an hour. Ghaoth Dobhair full-forward Gavin McBride saw a '45' fall just short but applied a little extra juice to his next effort as he sailed over a majestic attempt into the driving rain for his side's first point of the game after 22 minutes.

Scoirse Ó Dochartaigh's side then rattled in two goals in quick succession, the first through corner-back Shane Ferry, whose speculative effort of a point caught out Cunning-

ham when it fell in over his head, while Ciaran Gillespie pounced a minute later to bury a close-range shot past the Carrick netminder.






